

Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness
 of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote
 motorcycle safety and awareness.
- We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees; this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C.
 The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National






Check your fluids, riding in the heat as we all did this summer can and will thin out all your fluids!

Check your battery, the heat does terrible things to them. Check the level of electrolyte levels and add if you must. Then charge with a trickle charger regularly.

Tired riding is a real thing! It is being looked at by safety agencies as a real cause of motorcycle accidents. Please don't get on the bike if you are exhausted or otherwise impaired! We want you all around and enjoying life for a long time!







Knowing the Holy Spirit is here to help, why not give him a try? The next time you need help, ask the RIGHT spirit.







CAPTAIN'S CORNER

Fall Colors – Western North Carolina. A mid-October ride through Western North Carolina is a MUST. The beauty of the browns, oranges, and reds are impossible to put into words. I have been blessed to make this ride for the past three years. The ride on my FJR begins in Waynesville, 30 miles west of Asheville. Plan on mid to late October for your trip. The colors are at a peak and the temperatures are still moderate. In all of my rides, I try to stay off the interstates. The back roads are incredible. My three favorite rides: 1) The Tail of the Dragon (75 miles west of Waynesville. Route 74 and 28). You have to do it ONCE so you can say that you did it! For my money, it is very commercial and gets all of the publicity. Buy your patch and get back on the road for equally and more challenging twisties. 2) Cherohala Skyway. (60 miles west of Waynesville). This is a 43 mile national scenic byway from Robbinsville to Tellico Plains, TN. Its long, sweeping curves wind up over 5400 foot mountains and crosses the Cherokee and the Nantahala forests. 3) The Blue Ridge Parkway. Any section of the 450 mile road from Cherokee NC into Virginia is awe-

some. 45 MPH with only a few entrances and exits. I found the section in the Mt Mitchell area to be especially dramatic. I am blessed to have a second motorcycle, a Yamaha FJR, at a friend's house in

Waynesville. I fly round-trip on Allegiant Air into Asheville for \$90. This saves a 1600 mile round-trip ride. More time for the twisties! I recommend you consider flying and renting a bike in North Carolina. DON'T miss this trip.



Hi folks,

I wanted to explain a little bit about why I have been sharing information about Amendment 2: The Right to Fish and Hunt. Being an Indigenous person, a member of the Miccosukee Tribe, I have time and time again seen and heard accounts from tribal elders that our rights to hunt and fish are being eroded. Our people use to have the right to hunt and fish all over Florida for subsistence living. Over time as Florida got more developed areas to freely do those activities dwindled for my people. Today there is a train of thought that indigenous people should only hunt and fish on our reservation lands. The problem, over time the quality of fish has decreased with too much mercury and the deer populations have drastically diminished. Which has led to our people to hunt and fish more so outside of reservation lands and territorial lands. The point of this long story? My people, the Miccosukee, understand very well the threats to the right to hunt and fish. My people have experienced it. That is why I feel not only is it important for my people, but for the people for all of Florida to have a constitutional right to hunt and fish. That doesn't mean an open free for all. It means those of us who rely on hunting and fishing to supplement our groceries (yes some of us still do this) keep that right.

Hunting and fishing also contributed to Floridas economy with \$16 billion. In addition to funding the

acquisition of 19% of the Florida Wildllife Corridor. Amendment 2 protects these activities so the youth of today and tomorrow to have those rights.

Too many people are disconnected from these activities and therefore may not understand the need to constitutionally protect these rights or they may just be anti-hunting and anti-fishing. Don't let their fear mongering form your opinion. That's why as we stare down the barrel of the last couple of months before the November general election...

Don't forget to VOTE YES on AMENDMENT 2 and help protect the future of hunting and fishing in Florida!!!

Keep reading if you need more info!

Q: Don't we already have this right?

A: No. We have a statute "recognizing the right", but this could be changed by the legislature at any time. This is the reason a constitutional amendment is so important.

Q: IS THIS REALLY ABOUT CONSERVATION?

A: 19% of the Florida Wildlife Corridor was acquired with hunter/angler dollars. That means that the largest contributor to the largest conservation project in state history is hunters and anglers.

Q: How does this protect clean water/air/land?

A: Courts have determined that this right cannot exist "in the abstract" – what that means is that the right must be able to be exercised. If waters are damaged, for instance, there is now a recourse for damage to the fishery. Similarly, you can't just overdevelop and wipe out game populations. This truly is a conservation protection, first and foremost.

Q: Is there more information on the Right to Fish and Hunt?

This does NOT undo the net ban.


This does NOT undo trespassing laws.

Constitutional authorities review this; to interpret any amendment, the constitution must be read "in whole" – meaning, if the intent wanted to undo the net ban or trespassing laws, it would have to be expressly spelled out in the amendment.
