

### Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness
  of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote
  motorcycle safety and awareness.
- We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees; this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C.
   The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.

• The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.

Well, it's nice to see that our annual Freedom Ride to the Capitol is starting to pay off. We were able to get House Bill 889 and Senate Bill 994 passed, so all we need now is for Governor DeSantis to sign the Bills into law, which would then be effective July 1, 2025.

### HB 889: Driver License Education Requirements, GENERAL BILL by Representative Michelle Salzman

Specifies age (over 18) at which applicant for driver license must complete traffic law & substance abuse education course; requires applicant for learner's driver license to complete certain driver education course approved by DHSMV.

# SB 994: Driver License Education Requirements, General Bill by Senator Jay Collins

Specifying the age (over 18) at which an applicant for a driver license must complete a traffic law and substance abuse education course; requiring an applicant for a learner's driver license to complete a certain driver education course approved by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, etc.

These bills will help to make it safer out there for those of us who like to ride motorcycles. I feel that the more educated a driver is, the better for us. This month so far has been a rough month for us bikers. We have had three motorcycle deaths on

I-595 alone. Both accidents were hit and runs. So, please keep your eyes on everything that's going on around you, beside you, even behind you, because you'll never know when somebody in cage will take you out.

There were two other bills that we went to Tallahassee, to try and help get passed, that are basically done, not going anywhere, for this session, but hopefully the next one, but I want you to know about them, help us when they come up for consideration again, hopefully next year.


# HB 501 - Hands-free Driving (which had a similar companion bill SB 1318 Traffic Offenses)

Hands-free Driving: Prohibits person from operating motor vehicle while using wireless communications device in handheld manner....

Why I Filed This Bill(by Representative Tant): I am filing this bill on behalf of a constituent whose son tragically lost his life after being hit and run over by a driver who was using a cell phone and distracted by its use..... Auto insurance is increasingly expensive with a leading cause of increases due to distracted driving. This bill is both a public safety as well as economic measure.

With that being said, we have been busy. On Saturday, May 3rd, we set up a Safety Booth for the International Female Ride Day at Alligator Alley Harley Davidson. That was an amazing thing to see, so many female riders in one big sisterhood of love of riding. Then, we had a really good time at the Heavy Breathers MC's new club house Friday night, May 9th. Then, on Saturday, May 10th, we went to the Outcast MC Anniversary Party in Miami. Those guys really know how to rock out. Please remember it's important to support all of our motorcycle clubs, riding groups, organizations, and independent riders in our community. It is important to have a close-knit community, looking out for each other.

### RIDING SMART IN SOUTH FLORIDA'S RAINY SEASON

The Summer in South Florida means one thing for ABATE of FI. SE Chapter riders: rain, and plenty of it. Wet roads and afternoon storms are part of the deal, but that doesn't mean we hang up the helmets. It means we ride smarter, stay prepared and remain alert. Here are some tips to keep you safe and dry(ish) during the wet months:

### PLAN AHEAD

Check the radar before you roll. Florida's rain patterns are predictable—build flexibility into your route and be ready to pivot if needed.

### GEAR UP

Keep quality rain gear on the bike—jacket, gloves, boot covers, and something reflective. Fog-resistant visors help you see when the world turns gray.

#### RIDE SMOOTH

Wet roads are slick. Avoid painted lines, metal grates, and sudden moves. Brake gently, throttle smoothly, and keep more distance from other bikes and vehicles.

### **GROUP RIDE ADJUSTMENTS**

In the rain, space out. Visibility drops, stopping takes longer, and traction disappears fast. Don't hesitate to pause or reroute the group if conditions get bad.

### STAY VISIBLE

Bright gear and working lights make a difference. Don't count on drivers seeing you in heavy rain—make yourself impossible to miss.

#### RESPECT LIGHTNING = STOP

If you see lightning, get off the road. Underpasses 18

and trees aren't safe. Wait it out in a proper shelter.

### **FINAL THOUGHTS:**

Riding in South Florida's rainy season isn't about avoiding the rain—it's about preparation and smart decision. knowing how to handle it. Stay sharp, ride smart, and always put safety first. As always, if you have tips or stories about wet rides, share them at the next chapter meeting. Never let the weather steal your joy of the ride and Watch out for motorcycles!

Muchos clubes buscan fomentar el desarrollo espiritual entre sus miembros. Este viaje a menudo se complementa con las experiencias compartidas de un viaje en grupo, que pueden ser a la vez estimulantes y reflexivas. El camino abierto puede ser una metáfora de la vida misma, brindando oportunidades para que los seguidores reflexionen sobre sus caminos, los desafios que enfrentan y las lecciones que aprenden.

Los clubes religiosos suelen participar en obras de caridad, lo que los convierte en contribuyentes vitales para sus comunidades.

Ya sea organizando proyectos de servicio comunitario, apoyando a organizaciones benéficas locales o ayudando a los necesitados, estos clubes ejemplifican los principios de compasión y generosidad. Los motociclistas pueden combinar su pasión por las motos con la vocación de servir a los demás, demostrando cómo las motocicletas pueden ser un vehículo para un cambio positivo. Esta participación no solo ayuda a los menos afortunados, sino que también fortalece el vínculo entre los miembros del club mientras trabajan por una causa común.



Conducir una motocicleta conlleva riesgos, y los clubes religiosos suelen priorizar la seguridad en sus operaciones. Muchos clubes ofrecen capacitación y recursos para nuevos motociclistas, creando una cultura de seguridad y responsabilidad. Este enfoque en prácticas de conducción seguras puede crear un entorno más consciente, donde los miembros se cuidan entre sí, garantizando que cada viaje sea una experiencia compartida de seguridad y disfrute. Además, la responsabilidad que surge de formar parte de una comunidad religiosa fortalece el carácter de sus miembros, recordándoles que deben actuar con responsabilidad tanto dentro como fuera de la motocicleta.

Por último, los clubes de motociclistas religiosos desempeñan un papel esencial en la difusión de mensajes de esperanza y fe dentro y fuera de la comunidad motociclista. Al vestir sus colores y participar en eventos públicos, los miembros del club se convierten en embajadores de su fe. Abren puertas a conversaciones y conexiones que de otro modo no surgirían, compartiendo su trayectoria y creencias con un público más amplio.

Para los motociclistas que buscan algo más que la emoción de conducir, unirse o visitar un club de motociclistas religioso local podría ser una de las decisiones más gratificantes que tomen. Gracias por leer.


