

ABATE of FLORIDA ACCOMPLISHMENTS

ABATE was the driving force behind the changes in Florida's Helmet Law. Florida Motorcyclists, over the age of 21 and who carry at least \$10,000 medical insurance coverage now enjoy the Freedom to Choose whether to wear a helmet or not. ABATE has developed & copyrighted "The Motorcycle Safety & Awareness Program" (MSAP). The program is presented to non-motorcyclists to educate them on how to safely share the road with motorcycles. It is taught in local schools & to civic organizations at no charge in the hope of reducing motorcycle accidents and deaths through education, not legislation. ABATE has passed the Vulnerable Road User Bill in 2024, signed by the Governor, for vulnerable road user to pay specified civil penalty; requires person's driver license to be suspended for specified period; requires person to attend specified driver improvement course.

ABATE has gained a positive and respected position in Tallahassee. Because of our Lobbyist and Legislative efforts, State Representatives are aware of ABATE members and our vigilant quest. ABATE reminds travelers every day to "Look Twice Save a Life, Motorcycles are everywhere"



SAFETY DIRECTOR'S REPORT - BRUCE "POET":

Filtering is going between stopped cars or slow-moving cars, to get to the front, like at a red light, or traffic jams, which keeps up from getting hit from behind. Dreamer spoke about some pros and cons of this. State is asking each Chapter to do one benefit event specifically to raise money for our lobbyist. There was more discussion about a State party,

Motion to adjourn at 11:09am, seconded, approved. Next meeting will be held at American Legion Post 321 at 10:00am on September 21, 2025.



A ROAD CAPTAIN REPORT

A TOW YOU WON'T FORGET

When you have been riding out there for a while, accidents happen regardless of whether we are on two or three-wheels. A buddy of mine got run off the road and got into an accident that required a visit to the hospital. Police asked my buddy if he had someone to get his bike that was not rideable, and he said no. No one asked where he wanted the bike towed and frankly he was not thinking about the bike at the time. He was concerned with his injuries. He was seen by medical staff and by the way is expected to make a full recovery.

Now the situation regarding the bike is another story. The accident happened in the city of Hollywood, Florida on a Saturday around 3pm in June of this year. My buddy contacted a few friends to help him get his bike at the impound lot that the police used in his case to store the bike. The accident happened on a weekend and the impound lot closed for vehicle pickups at 1:00pm on Saturday for the balance of the weekend so he had to wait until Monday even though we were ready to get the bike the next day. The lot was not open for pickup so the impound got one additional day storage. It's interesting that they are able to accept the bike being towed to the impound at any hour of the day but they limited hours for pickup. You have to wait... And pay the storage fees while you are waiting...

Here is the detail of what he was charged by the Tow service called by Hollywood Police

In case you are wondering I was one of the buddies that helped get the bike. When we got to the impound, we inspected the bike for damage and we saw minor damage to the mirrors foot pegs and the front tire was flat. There were NO liquids leaking from the bike so I'm not sure what the environmental fee was for but hey there it was on the bill. I'm not going to comment any further on the bill. The numbers speak for themselves.

Ok a couple of take-a-ways from this. We carry wrenches because sometimes things happen and we need to do repairs on the fly while we are on the road. I would suggest that you keep a phone number of motorcycle tow company in your phone contacts under BIKE TOW. You don't have to look far for one because one of our sponsors is a bike tow guy. You should also keep the phone numbers in your phone of some biker buddies that can wait with your bike until the tow guy arrives. Let your buddies know in advance who does the work on your bike so that they can have it towed to that shop. This bit of advance thinking could have cut my buddy's tow costs by at least 2/3. That's some serious coin during these tough economic times.

We are a brotherhood of bikers. I have stepped up when I got the call from a bruda and I have called when I needed help and got it in spades. There's no way I could say no to one of my buds in this situation and I suspect many of you are of the same thought on the topic. Friends for life are forged of strangers by helping in these kinds of ways.

You want to be a prepared biker. The same reason you carry tools to be prepared on the road, a few of the right phone numbers can be just as important and can save you a bunch. JUST A THOUGHT.



My Perspective:
Meaning Behind the Music Series
featuring

The Doobie Brothers

It was the early 70's. I was in my teens and, truthfully, not sure about anything. In my search for something more, I experimented with just about everything. I hitch-hiked to get around, not ever considering the consequences. Other than the normal greenery, I tried smoking Oregano for a buzz and inhaled nitrous oxide for a head rush.

My generation (as well as yours) was looking for fun, yet at the same time, we were looking for truth that would help our society make sense. And then one day, a Jesus freak found me hanging out in the park with my friends. He seemed harmless, so I considered his form of truth. My conscience told me he was right, yet my mind wasn't ready to own it. I can still remember my exact thoughts... as much truth as he spoke, this hippie wasn't ready. In fact, I bargained with God and said, "One day, I'll give You my heart."

Written by a gospel group in 1966 and then made popular by The Byrds and the Doobie Brothers in 1973, the song, "Jesus is Just Alright," I became a hit, reaching No. 35 on the "Billboard Hot 100". I was in high school and couldn't get enough of that driving beat. I agreed with the song, even though my lifestyle didn't. Still, I loved the message.

"Jesus is just alright with me Jesus is just alright, oh yeah Jesus is just alright with me Jesus is just alright."

One way to say something was cool was to say it was righteous, or alright. As the Hippie Movement was in full swing, the Jesus Movement was becoming a significant counterculture. Some have argued that the lyrics were a casual description or that the writer's expression was shallow. I think the chorus suggests that the author finds comfort and acceptance from the presence of Jesus in their life.

As the story goes, the hitch-hiking teenager in the park accepted Jesus six years later. It's been over 50 years since the day I gave Him my heart, and my life has never been the same. You would think I'd have smooth roads and easy rides exempt from ruts and challenging times. Quite the contrary. Yet I can't imagine this ride without Him. He's rescued me from trouble, healed my body, and saved me from death. He's even promised me a place in heaven! Yes, Jesus is just alright with me, and I'm alright with Him.

The real question might be, is Jesus alright with you? One way to find out is to ask Him. You don't need a church or a preacher; just an open heart to follow Him.





PHILEMON AND THE ROAD TO RECONCILIATION:

A CHRISTIAN BIKER'S DEVOTIONAL ON FORGIVENESS AND BROTHERHOOD

Perhaps the reason he was separated from you for a little while was that you might have him back forever no longer as a slave but better than a slave as a dear brother.

- Philemon 1:15-16

There's a moment every biker faces out on the open road. You hear the rumble of your own exhaust echo off the road and you feel free. But sometimes, a storm rolls in fast. Visibility drops. The roads get slick. Maybe you took a wrong turn. Maybe you and another rider had a disagreement before the ride. Suddenly that ride ain't so free anymore. The weight of unresolved things gets heavier than your pack.



That's what Paul was dealing with when he wrote to Philemon. He was holding the handlebars between two men with history. Onesimus was a runaway slave. Philemon was the master he left behind. But something happened between the running and the writing. Jesus grabbed hold of Onesimus. The man who ran off came back changed. No longer just a servant but now a brother in Christ.

See, reconciliation isn't just about shaking hands and moving on. It's about remembering who we are now in Christ. It's about letting the gospel reshape our view of each other. We were all once running from God. Just like Onesimus. But Christ intercepted our ride. He pulled us into His crew. Now we don't see each other through labels like enemy or betrayer. We see through the eyes of grace.

In the biker world, trust and respect mean everything. If a brother wrongs you, it can feel like he dropped his bike and left it on your front lawn. But the gospel reminds us that every one of us has laid our bike down at some point. Jesus didn't leave us in the ditch. He picked us up, patched us up, and put us back on the road.

Reconciliation isn't weakness. It's gospel grit. It's the guts to say, "I'm not who I was and neither are you because Christ is doing a new thing in both of us."

Reflection and Challenge:

Is there someone you've written off because of old wounds or broken trust? Someone who ran out and never looked back? Ask the Lord to show you how He sees them now. Not as a problem but as a potential brother or sister in Christ.

Remember, reconciliation doesn't mean pretending nothing happened. It means letting what Christ did on the cross speak louder than what they did in the past. If Paul could ask Philemon to welcome a runaway like a brother, then maybe God is asking you to do the same.

The ride toward reconciliation is uphill sometimes. But it's worth every mile. And Jesus rides it with you.








**Educate, don't legislate – stuff we thought you might like to know

We were sitting around talking about our latest Chapter meeting. It was so very well attended and so many different groups and individuals. And we remember, looking out at the crowd, and everyone was smiling, happy, just loving the community of like-minded brothers and sisters. And everyone there was passionate about ABATE's cause, educating drivers to help protect bikers and riders. Sometimes we don't think about it, it just is, this feeling of being there, in this community with everyone. We have heard is said that bikers never meet a stranger. When they are on the road, giving each other the two-finger wave or a quick nod, or when they stop for a bite or a beer, and meet another biker, people who don't know each other, but not strangers. It's also the ones who ride on the back too, same mentality, we think. I can't think of any other group that is like that. So now we are wondering and pondering, why motorcyclists are so passionate about their rides? Is it just about the speed and the thrill, or is there more to it? We are going to dive into the psychology of motorcycle riding to explore the deeper reasons behind why we ride.





The Freedom of the Open Road: Motorcycle riding is often synonymous with freedom. Straddling a bike, feeling the wind against your face, hearing the roar of the engine - it's an indescribable feeling that transcends the everyday mundanity. The open road offers an escape from the constraints of our daily lives, a sense of liberation that isn't easily found elsewhere.

Mindfulness and Focus: Believe it or not, motorcycle riding can be a mindful practice. When you're on a motorcycle, you're fully in the present moment. You're hyper-aware of your surroundings, the road ahead, the machine underneath you, and even your own body. This intense focus often leads to what psychologists refer to as a 'flow state,' a complete absorption in one's activity that leads to an altered sense of time and self.

The Thrill Factor: There's no denying the adrenaline rush that comes from a motorcycle ride. This thrill, this exhilaration, stimulates the release of dopamine, a neurotransmitter associated with feelings of pleasure and satisfaction. This biochemical reaction partially explains the sheer joy many riders experience.

The Sense of Community: Motorcycling often breeds a strong sense of community. Whether it's a wave to a fellow rider on the road, sharing stories at a bike rally, or the camaraderie of a motorcycle club - these shared experiences create bonds of friendship and belongingness that are deeply satisfying on a psychological level.

Challenge and Mastery: Riding a motorcycle is a skill, and like any skill, it presents a challenge. The process of learning, practicing, mastering the art of motorcycling, and even overcoming fears as-



sociated with riding, can contribute to a sense of achievement and self-confidence. This process of personal growth and mastery can be immensely rewarding.

Identity and Self-Expression: For many, motorcycles are an extension of their identity - a way to express themselves. The type of bike one rides, how one rides it, and even the gear one wears - all of these elements can be forms of self-expression, reflecting one's personality and values. Hah, and here, we have to quote an old slogan of Candy's Cycle "Cause Stock Sucks"!

The Connection with Nature: Lastly, motorcycling offers a unique connection with nature that's rarely found in a car ride. Exposed to the elements, riders can truly immerse themselves in the environment, experiencing the sun, the wind, the scents, and the scenery in a profoundly intimate way.

Motorcycle riding is not only a mode of transportation, but a complex psychological experience that intertwines freedom, mindfulness, thrill, community, personal growth, self-expression, and connection with nature. It's a blend of these elements that captivates the hearts of riders and fuels their passion for the open road. So why do we ride? Maybe the question should be, why wouldn't we?

¿A QUÉ GRUPO DE MOTOCICLISTAS UNIRSE?

Hay tres tipos principales de motociclistas:

- (1) quienes conducen solo por placer,
- (2) quienes conducen para formar parte de una hermandad privada de motociclistas,

GRUPO DE MOTOCICLISTAS -- también conocidos como RC, son los que menos tiempo y dinero requieren. Si trabajas muchas horas o tienes una familia que requiere mucha de tu presencia, formar parte de un RC puede ser la mejor opción.

CLUBES DE MOTOCICLISTAS -- también conocidos como MC, tienen mayores expectativas para sus miembros. 



The Annual Ride with Freddy Fort Lauderdale to Waynesville via the Natchez Trace Parkway

This year's Annual Ride with Freddy took us on a legendary motorcycle journey from Fort Lauderdale, Florida, to Waynesville, North Carolina, by way of Natchez, Mississippi" a ride designed around one of America's most scenic and historic byways: the Natchez Trace Parkway.

The ride from Fort Lauderdale to Natchez covers approximately 870 miles, crossing the Gulf states and offering a scenic lead-up to the main event: the Natchez Trace Parkway, a 444-mile stretch of federally protected road that runs from Natchez to Nashville. Originally a Native American trail, the Trace became a critical route in the late 1700s and early 1800s for traders, soldiers, and settlers. Today, it's a quiet, two-lane road with no commercial traffic, perfect for motorcycles.

Our night in Natchez fell on July 4th, and we were treated to a stunning fireworks display over the Mississippi River. It was a fittingly patriotic backdrop to a town rich in antebellum charm, capping off a long ride with an unforgettable view.

Along the Trace, five standout historic stops captured our attention:

- 1 Emerald Mound one of the largest Native American mounds in the U.S.
- 2 Mount Locust Inn an original 1780s inn used by travelers on foot.
- 3 The Sunken Trace a deeply eroded section of the original trail.
- 4 Meriwether Lewis Site the explorer's final resting place.
- 5 French Camp Historic Village a living museum of 19th-century life.

A stop in Nashville brought us to the Johnny Cash Museum, where exhibits showcase his guitars, costumes, recordings, and heartfelt personal letters. The final leg to Waynesville, North Carolina, brought the total trip mileage to about 1,150 miles, combining rich Southern history with unforgettable roads, good friends, and a shared love of the ride.


