

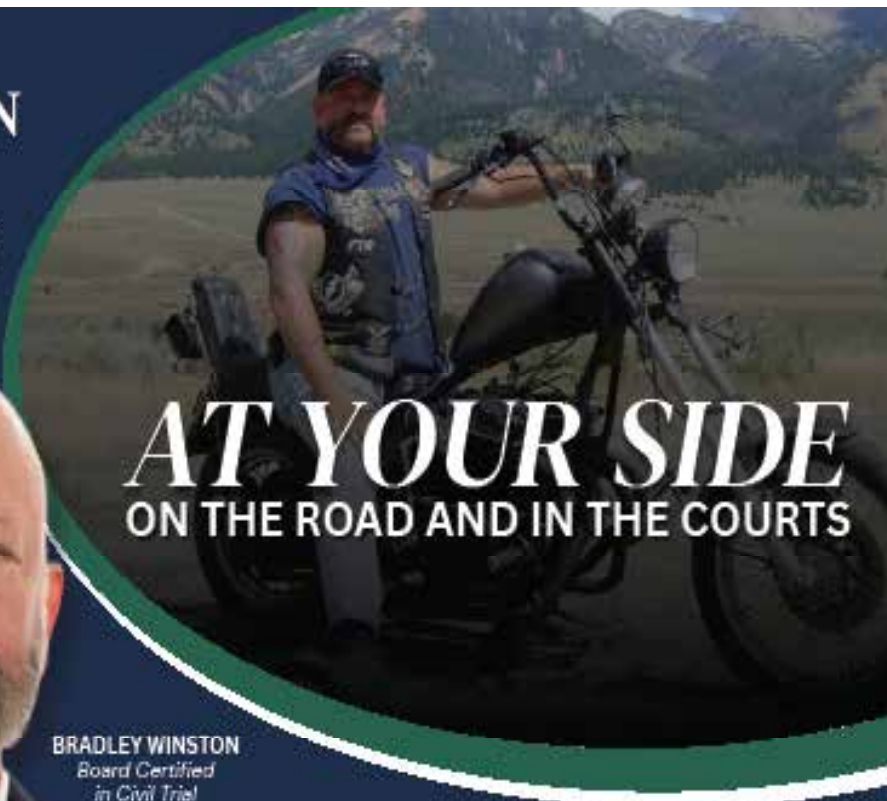

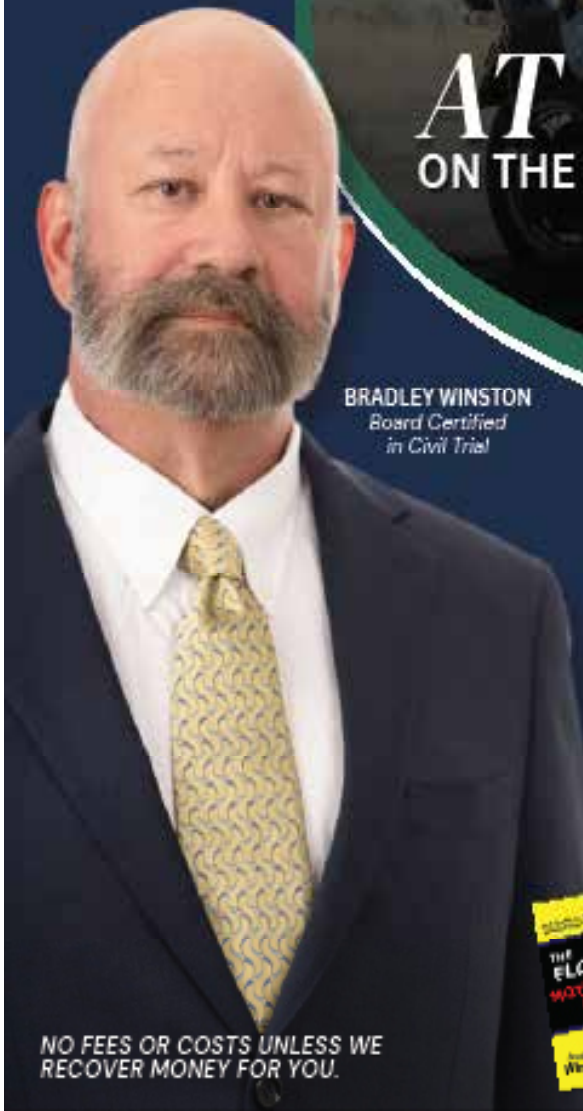

ABATE of FLORIDA ACCOMPLISHMENTS

ABATE was the driving force behind the changes in Florida's Helmet Law. Florida Motorcyclists, over the age of 21 and who carry at least \$10,000 medical insurance coverage now enjoy the Freedom to Choose whether to wear a helmet or not. ABATE has developed & copyrighted "The Motorcycle Safety & Awareness Program" (MSAP). The program is presented to non-motorcyclists to educate them on how to safely share the road with motorcycles. It is taught in local schools & to civic organizations at no charge in the hope of reducing motorcycle accidents and deaths through education, not legislation. ABATE has passed the Vulnerable Road User Bill in 2024, signed by the Governor, for vulnerable road user to pay specified civil penalty; requires person's driver license to be suspended for specified period; requires person to attend specified driver improvement course.

ABATE has gained a positive and respected position in Tallahassee. Because of our Lobbyist and Legislative efforts, State Representatives are aware of ABATE members and our vigilant quest. ABATE reminds travelers every day to "Look Twice Save a Life, Motorcycles are everywhere"

Vice PRESIDENT

Over the years I have read many articles about how motorcycle clubs came to be. The U.S. Military had asked Harley Davidson and Indian to make more than 10,000 motorcycles for the war effort. After the War, there was a lot of surplus. When our GIs came home from World War II, it was hard for them to settle back into a quiet life. Motorcycles offered them freedom and motorcycle clubs offered them the same brotherhood and adrenaline rush they had become used to in the war.

There already was a community of mainstream motorcycle enthusiasts, and groups like the AMA, but they were largely subdued. They were in for a shock when returning veterans took their army surplus Harleys to the streets of postwar America. The average age of WWII's returning combat veterans was 27. The war had aged them, but most were still young enough to challenge social norms. Motorcycles afforded veterans a freewheeling mode of group transportation at a time when fitting back into society posed certain challenges.

This brotherhood of bikers only got stronger with the guys that came home from the Korean War and Vietnam War, and kept getting stronger with all the Middle East conflicts. Today there are thousands of clubs and associations worldwide, ranging from more informal riding clubs (RC's) and motorcycle associations (MA's), to strict Motorcycle Clubs (MC's), and of course, Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MRO's) which is what ABATE of Florida is. The traditional, or what is referred to as “old school” motorcycle clubs, traces its roots back to the origins of clubs after World War II, where there was a strong emphasis on honor, brotherhood, loyalty, and respect.

On May 30, 1868, the first Memorial Day was observed by the United States and soon after, became a national holiday. On Memorial Day, we mourn and honor all those U.S. soldiers who died while serving our country and didn't come home to get to ride. It is a day for visiting cemeteries and

memorials, and remembering the sacrifice made by so many, so that we can have all the rights we have today, in this great country, the United States of America.

God bless our fallen soldiers and those soldiers who served or are serving, protecting this great country we all live in. I am proud that Southeast Chapter of ABATE, once again, is celebrating Memorial Day Weekend with our Memorial Day Event on Sunday, May 24, 2026 at American Legion 36 on State Road 84. We have several things planned to honor our brave soldiers. I hope to see you all there.

Please support all your American Legions and VFWs. God Bless America, the military, and the veterans who have helped keep this Country free.

And to the younger people out there, you have the chance to inherit an organization that stands up and fights for biker rights and safety. Help us make a difference, now, and for the future!

Poet said April was another great month. He had a Safety Booth on the 4th, at Alligator Alley Harley Davidson Easter Egg Hunt. On the 11th, he rode in the American Legion Poker Run, and it was a lot of fun. He had a Safety Booth on the 14th, at Cycle Gear Bike Night. Coming up, he will have a Safety Booth on April 25th at American Legion Post 321 Family Fun Day and Special Olympics and Alligator Alley Harley Davidson's Harleys After Dark on the 30th.

STATE REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT -

JOHNNY ROSE:

Johnny spoke about the State meeting. He said that in the last 2 years, since we got our Safety money back, motorcycle deaths are down. He presented Sheila with the State certificates for Most New Members for January and February. He talked about some Bills that are on Governor DeSantis' desk to be signed. One is to separate E-Bikes from Motorcycles “CS/HB 243, Electric Bicycles: Provides requirements for operation of electric bicycles; provides penalties;”. Another is “CS/HB 35 Habitual Traffic Offender Designation, ...“amends Florida Statute § 322.264 to redefine a "habitual traffic offender" (HTO), including individuals with three or more convictions for driving without a valid license within five years. It increases penalties for repeat unlicensed drivers. Effective July 1, 2026, it mandates a five-year license revocation and potential third-degree felony charges for driving during that period....”. Another is CS/CS/SB 536: “Criteria for Determining Criminal Gang Membership... Revising the definition of the term “criminal gang member”; defining the term “gang-related language.”

He then presented us with the State Board and Trustee nominations.

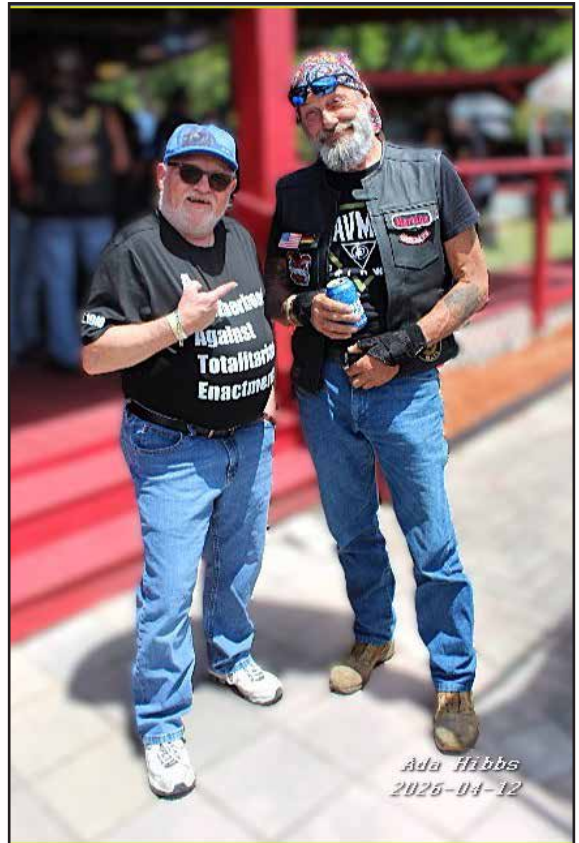

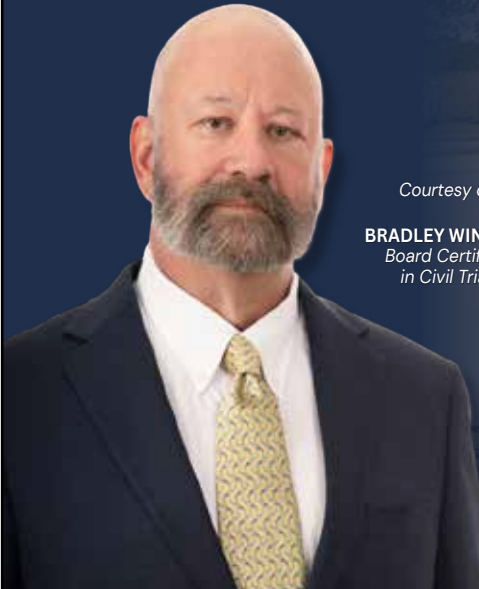

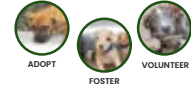

THE FINAL RIDE

As I write this, it was exactly ten years ago that I last saw Gary. He had a chronic, rare cancer—lymphoma—that we battled together. I say ‘we’ because when you’re married, one has the cancer and the other carries its weight. At his last exam, his oncologist was optimistic and said Gary should have already needed another round of chemo but had somehow managed to stave it off. At one appointment, the doctor told him, “Mr. Larson, I can tell by your personality, this cancer isn’t going to kill you; something else will.” We laughed, not knowing how true that would soon be.

As the story goes, I wanted to learn how to camp solo. I wanted to be able to go by myself if everyone else’s schedules were too full or the cancer took over, so I could set up our pop-up camper alone. One evening, after I set up, Gary came out to see how I was doing—either drawn by the star-studded sky, the clear weather, or curiosity. He was proud of my campsite. I fed him and tried to talk him into staying the night, but he insisted on going home because of a full work schedule the next day. That was the last time I saw him.

It was the last time he sat on his beloved bike. The last time he adjusted his mirror. The last time he snapped his leather vest, turned the key, kissed me goodbye, and said, ‘I love you.’ When we woke up that day, neither of us had a clue that it was going to be a day of ‘lasts.’ At the start of the morning, everything felt normal. As the day unfolded, I realized I wasn’t ready for my life, or my

kids’ lives, to come to a screeching halt. I wasn’t prepared for the kind of pain that now gripped my heart. I wasn’t ready.

But he was.

He had a solid walk with Jesus and dedicated his life to serving the Lord. Gary believed completely that Jesus died for him. He lived with zeal and intention, touching more lives than we’ll ever know. He was sure of his purpose on earth and even more certain of his salvation—that if he died, he would be in the presence of the Lord.

The next time you sit on your bike, adjust your mirror, snap your vest, and turn the key, you don’t know if it will be your last. Like Gary, you might be prepared to meet your Maker. But what if you’re not? My prayer is for you: Today, open your heart and say yes to Jesus, who loves beyond excuses and stands ready to welcome you. As I type with tears in my eyes, I see a field ready for harvest, a heart ripe for the picking, and a Savior whose hand is outstretched to all who will say YES.

Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me. Revelations 3:20

HOW TO INTRODUCE YOURSELF TO A CANDIDATE

Second of a series of nine
Friday, April 24, 2026

For a lot of people, the hardest part of talking to a candidate is not knowing how to begin. They worry about saying the wrong thing, sounding awkward, or getting put on the spot. The good news is this: introducing yourself does not have to be complicated.

In fact, simple is better.

When you meet a candidate, your goal is not to deliver a speech. Your goal is to make a connection, leave a good impression, and make sure they know that motorcycle riders are paying attention. A short, respectful introduction does exactly that.

Start with the basics. Tell them your name. Tell them you live in their district or community, if that applies. Tell them you are a member of ABATE. That alone matters more than people think. It lets the candidate know you are not just some random passerby with an opinion. You are a constituent, a voter, and part of an organized group that cares about real issues.

A simple introduction can sound like this:

“Hi, my name is Darrin Brooks. I live here in the district, and I’m a member of ABATE of Florida. I wanted to take a minute to introduce myself and let you know that motorcycle safety, rider rights, and personal freedom are important issues to me.”

That is not fancy, but it works.

It tells the candidate who you are, where you stand, and why you are talking to them. It also opens the door for a real conversation without sounding confrontational or rehearsed.

One of the biggest mistakes people make is trying to say too much too fast. They get nervous and start unloading every complaint, every frustration, and every political opinion all at once. That usually does more harm than good. A candidate meeting dozens of people at an event is not going to remember a rambling speech. But they will remember someone who was calm, clear, and respectful.

That is why your introduction should be short and easy to follow. Think of it as opening the door, not trying to walk through the whole house in one breath.

It also helps to be friendly and direct. Look them in the eye. Shake hands if the setting fits. Speak clearly. Be respectful, even if you are not sure you agree with them on everything. Your purpose at that moment is not to win an argument. It is to make sure riders are seen as informed, engaged, and worth listening to.

Another good thing to include is a quick personal connection to the issue. Not a long story, just one sentence that makes it real. Something like:

“I ride regularly, and I care about how laws and policies affect people like me on the road.”

That reminds the candidate that motorcycle issues are not abstract talking points. They affect real people in their community.

If the conversation continues, great. If it does not, that is okay too. You have still done something important. You made contact. You put ABATE on their radar. You showed that riders are involved.

And remember this: you do not need permission to be heard. Candidates expect to meet voters. That is part of the job they are asking for. So do not talk yourself out of speaking up because you think you are bothering them. If they want your vote, they can certainly handle your introduction.

The bottom line is simple. Keep it short. Keep it respectful. Keep it real. A good introduction is not about sounding important. It is about making sure riders have a seat at the table.

Scribe's Tip:

You do not have to impress a candidate. You just have to introduce yourself like a voter who expects to be heard.

Why Talking to Candidates Matters

Welcome to my series on reaching out to candidates, Friday, April 17, 2026

Every election season, candidates get an earful from people who know how to get in front of them. Business groups show up. Activists show up. Developers show up. Well-funded organizations show up. They all bring their concerns, their priorities, and their message.

If riders stay quiet, guess what happens? Candidates hear plenty of opinions — just not ours.

That is why talking to candidates matters.

Too often, people think there is no reason to speak with someone running for office until after the election. That is a mistake. The campaign season is actually one of the best times to reach them. Before Election Day, candidates are listening.



They are learning. They are trying to figure out what matters to the people they hope will vote for them. That gives us a chance to make sure motorcycle issues are part of that conversation.

The truth is, most candidates do not know much about the challenges riders face. They may not understand issues involving motorcycle safety, profiling, freedom of choice, insurance concerns, or the everyday risks that come with being on two wheels. That does not mean they are against us. It usually just means nobody has taken the time to explain it to them. And if we do not explain it, someone else will explain the world for us.

That is why respectful contact matters. A calm conversation, a thoughtful question, or a short introduction at the right time can help educate a future officeholder before they ever take a seat in office. That matters, because once they are elected, their opinions are already starting to shape the decisions they make.

ABATE members have something valuable to offer in those conversations. We are not paid lobbyists. We are not profes-

sional politicians. We are riders, voters, taxpayers, and citizens who understand the road from real-world experience. When we show up and speak in a respectful, informed way, we help candidates see motorcyclists for who we really are — responsible people who care deeply about freedom, safety, and fair treatment.

You do not need a polished speech. You do not need to sound like a lawyer. You do not need to memorize a stack of bill numbers. What matters is being honest, respectful, and willing to speak up. Sometimes one short conversation is enough to make a candidate remember that riders are paying attention.

It also helps build credibility for ABATE. When candidates meet members who are thoughtful, prepared, and professional, it leaves an impression. Win or lose, they remember who treated them with respect and who brought real issues to the table. That kind of relationship matters long after campaign season is over.

The bottom line is simple: if riders do not speak up, candidates will hear only from other groups. And when that happens, rider concerns get pushed aside, ignored, or misunderstood.

So this election season, do not assume somebody else will do it. Reach out. Introduce yourself. Ask a question. Start the conversation. Because the people who talk to candidates today help shape the decisions those officeholders make

tomorrow.

Scribe's Tip:

If we are not in the conversation, we should not be surprised when we are left out of the decisions.
