



Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness
 of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote
 motorcycle safety and awareness.
- We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees; this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.

LOOK TWICE - SAVE A LIFE

BIKERS ARE DYING TO BE SEEN

Common causes of motor vehicle vs. motorcycle accidents:

MAKING LEFT TURNS- Before turning LEFT; LOOK TWICE to ensure no motorcycle is coming. You're conditioned to look for cars and trucks. And it is easy to 'overfook' an oncoming motorcycle if you're not looking for one.

PULLING OUT- Before pulling out from a parked position, LOOK TWICE by turning your head and looking for oncoming motorcycles. Motorcycles need more morn and space to xtop suddenly than a car or truck.

CHANGING LANES - Motorcycles can easily fit in the blind spots of your mirrors. Put your blinker on and LOOK TWICE, turn your head and look to ensure there is no motorcycle in your blind spot!

SHARING A LANE - bon't share a traffic lane with a motorcycle. Even though a motorcycle is smaller than a car or truck, they are lawfully entitled to their entire lane.


DON'T FOLLOW TOO CLOSE- behind a motorcycle – a motorcycle needs more room than a car or truck to stop. Keep a good distance behind a motorcycle, leaving enough room for you to stop.

A ROAD CAPTAIN REPORT

A Road Captain plays a critical role in any organization whether it be organizing and leading group rides or simply just promoting the cause of motorcycle rights and safety awareness. Their responsibilities are tied to both the logistics of group riding and overreaching the goals of the organization.

ROLE OF M.R.O ROAD CAPTAIN:

- 1. Ride Planning an Organization Organize routes and timelines. Scout rides in advance to identify logistical challenges.
- 2. Safety Management Enforce safety protocols communicate with riders about the rules of the road.
- 3. Leadership during rides Act as a liaison between the lead and tail riders to maintain group formation and safety. Handle any emergencies of the road such as breakdowns in accidents.

PURPOSE OF M.R.O ROAD CAPTAIN:

- 1. Safety Advocacy Prioritize safety and responsible riding practices.
- 2. Rider Education Modeling and enforcing safe riding practices.
- 3. Community Building Organizing and leading rides.
- 4. Public Awareness

Group rides often draws attention helping to raise awareness of the organization's mission and the visibility of motorcyclists on the road.

In essence the Road Captain ensures smooth safe and impactful rides while aligning the group's activities with the organization's broader goals of promoting motorcycle rights and safety.



ACERCA DE LOS MOTOMOTOCICIISTAS CRISTIANOS

Hasta la fecha de esta edición del boletín, me han preguntado docenas de veces por ¿qué hay tantos grupos de motomotociclistas cristianos? ¿Por qué no pueden todos ser parte de un solo grupo? ¿Y por qué aparecen tantos nuevos por todas partes?

Con suerte, este artículo puede explicar el motivo de este fenómeno.

Imagínese si todas las personas políticamente activas decidieran iniciar un grupo de motomotociclistas, y la membresía estuviera abierta a todos los que quisieran promover una ideología política, ya fuera demócrata, republicano, comunista o lo que sea. Todos son bienvenidos. Y cada semana llevarán a cabo una reunión para discutir actividades políticas y establecer a quién votarán, "como grupo", para presidente de esta gran nación. Un encuentro así es garantía segura de ver puños volando, costillas rotas y labios reventados. ¿Usted sabe lo que quiero decir? Un grupo de motomotociclistas tan inclusivo no será, de ninguna manera, una realidad.

Lo mismo ocurre con los motomotociclistas de la fe cristiana. No es posible que ellos circulen bajo el mismo color, y aquí hay algunas razones:

DIFERENTES CREENCIAS — no todos creen que existe un cielo, e incluso entre los que lo creen, difieren en cómo una persona puede terminar en él. Algunos creen que la entrada al Cielo será recompensada al realizar buenas obras, mientras que otros creen que no hay manera de que una persona pueda ser lo suficientemente buena como para que se le permita entrar allí y, por lo tanto, Cristo tuvo que morir en la cruz, por nosotros, como expiación por todos nuestros pecados; porque si una persona puede ganarse el camino al Cielo por sí mismo, entonces la muerte de Cristo en la cruz no tiene ningún propósito.

DIFERENTE PRÁCTICAS: algunos motociclistas cristianos, generalmente de la denominación adventista, por ejemplo, creen firmemente que el servicio de la iglesia debe realizarse los sábados, pero la mayoría de las denominaciones creen que el servicio de adoración de la iglesia siempre se ha llevado a cabo tradicionalmente los domingos y, por lo tanto, así debe ser.

DIFERENTE PROPÓSITO: algunos grupos de motociclistas cristianos se forman con el único propósito de tener un compañerismo interno en el que los miembros puedan acercarse unos a otros, permanecer en un camino positivo al ser responsables unos de otros y crecer en conocimiento espiritual a través de estudios bíblicos regulares. Sin embargo, otros grupos se forman con propósitos evangelísticos, lo que significa que existen únicamente para hacer un esfuerzo consciente para convertir a los motociclistas a sus creencias y prácticas. Otros más se forman simplemente por el placer de andar en

motocicleta y realizar viajes aventureros locales o lejanos. Unos pocos se forman para promover una teología denominacional específica.

DIFERENTE PARTICIPACIÓN: algunos grupos de motociclistas cristianos (MC) están muy involucrados en la cultura ciclista local y viven la "vida de ciclista" 24 horas al día, 7 días a la semana y les encanta. Mientras que otros grupos cristianos de motomotociclistas (MM), aunque también están involucrados en menor grado en la cultura motociclista local, lo hacen principalmente por razones evangelísticas y no porque practiquen el estilo de vida motociclista. Los MM, al igual que los MC, también sienten un amor genuino por los motociclistas, apoyan sus eventos y están disponibles para ayudar a los motociclistas en momentos de necesidad.

DIFERENTE EXPECTATIVAS: algunos grupos de motociclistas cristianos son muy estrictos en cuanto a la participación de los miembros. Pero la mayoría de ellos son menos exigentes con sus miembros y tratan su presencia más como una actividad social que como un compromiso estricto por parte de los miembros.

Hay muchas más diferencias entre los grupos de motomotociclistas cristianos; sin embargo, la lista anterior ya debería aclarar por qué no todas las personas de fe cristiana pueden volar del mismo color. Existe una gran diversidad en cómo las personas perciben la vida y su significado. Es por eso que hay tantos MC, 1%, RC, MM, etc. A medida que pasa el tiempo, la humanidad se vuelve mucho más liberal en creencias y formas de vida y, por lo tanto, "nuevos" MC, 1%, RC, Los MM, etc., se forman para reflejar los cambios en la sociedad; a menudo es la mismo razón por la que muchos grupos, bajo estas categorías, eventualmente se disuelven o cambian de liderazgo.

Entonces, cuando te encuentres con un grupo de motomotociclistas cristianos, es mejor no emitir ningún juicio hasta que observes cómo se mueven y los conozcas a nivel personal. No son todos iguales.

Pero sea cual sea el tipo que sean, descubrirás que todos te aman genuinamente, te aceptarán, te apoyarán, orarán por ti y serán buenos amigos para ti.







CAPTAIN'S CORNER

y life has been blessed with a fair amount of travel. It was time to finally see a bit of the good old United States of America. I had a Suzuki V- Strom 650 with full luggage, a tree hammock and a blanket, an exceptionally strong back and a love of travel. Let's go.

The overall trip was broken into three 2500 mile segments. Ft Lauderdale to Flagstaff Arizona. Flagstaff to Rapid City South Dakota. Rapid City to Fort Lauderdale.

Fort Lauderdale to Flagstaff. Five days, 2500 miles. Florida Alabama Mississippi Louisiana Arkansas Oklahoma Texas New Mexico Arizona.

Reflections:

Florida is one big state. I could not even get out of Florida on day one. Had to hang my hammock in the western part of the panhandle.

It is almost impossible to travel west without riding on interstates. I did manage some beautiful back roads between Mobile and Oklahoma City. Route 65 along the mighty Mississippi. Route 270 through the Ozarks. From there it was Interstate 40 to Flagstaff.

Huge windmills and oil wells throughout Oklahoma and Texas.

Famous route 66. All but nonexistent other than some short segments paralleling Interstate 40. By chance I stopped at the midpoint of the old route 66. Met an incredible Brazilian couple riding two up on a BMW. They were on their way from Brazil to Prudhoe Bay, Alaska and then on to Portugal.

Flagstaff to Rapid City, SD. 20 days, 2500 miles. Arizona Utah Wyoming South Dakota. Now the good stuff! Our National Parks!

Reflections:

No Interstates! None! Flagstaff to Jackson, Wyoming. Route 89 N. then Route 191 N.

The Grand Canyon. What can I say!

Zion National. The Three Patriarchs; Abraham Isaac and Jacob. Three huge sandstone formations.

Bryce Canyon national. Sprawling formation of crimson colored "hoodoos", spire shaped rock formations.

Arches national. Over 2000 natural sand stone arches, the most popular being the Delicate Arch.

Grand Teton national. Beautiful snowcapped mountain range.

Even in July. You can do the translation on Tetons.

Those horrible, horrible "switch backs"! The only way to cross the mountain ranges was to "zig and zag" your way over and across the mountain. Hundreds of 180° hairpin turns at 20 mph! Elevations of 7000 to 9000 feet. NO guard rail! Treacherous! Exhausting!

Rapid City to Fort Lauderdale. Five days. 2500 miles. Covered enough of the country. Ready to get home and sleep in my own bed.

Final thoughts:

I rode 5000 miles out and back to enjoy 2500 miles of the "good stuff". Next trip I will seriously consider shipping my bike out west or possibly flying out and buying a used bike for the trip.

Hammock camping is great but only when the temperature is 55° or higher. I was forced to rent an Airbnb or a cheap hotel if the temperature dipped below 55°. Tent camping would have been a better option for the trip.

It was a life-changing trip. I plan to continue it from Yellowstone through western Canada and south through California in the very near future.

Go west young man, go west!















ABOUT CHRISTIAN BIKERS

As of the date of this newsletter issue, I have repeatedly been asked dozens of times why are there so many Christian biker groups? Why can't they all be part of just one group? And why are there so many new ones popping up all over the place?

Hopefully, this article can explain the reason for this phenomenon.

Just imagine if all the people who are politically active decide to start a motorcycle riding group, and membership was to be open to everyone who want to promote a political ideology, whether you were a democrat, a republican, a communist, or whatever. Everyone is welcome. And each week they will conduct a meeting to discuss political activities, and establish who they will, "as a group", vote for President of this great nation. Such a meeting is a for sure guarantee of seeing fists flying, ribs broken, and lips busted. You know what I mean? Such an inclusive biker group is not, in any way, shape, or form, ever be a reality.

The same thing goes for bikers of the Christian faith. It is not possible for all bikers of the Christian faith to roll under the same color, and here are some reasons why:

<u>DIFFERENT BELIEFS</u> – not all of them believe that there is a heaven, and even among the ones who do, they differ in how a person can end up in it. Some believe that you will be rewarded entrance to Heaven by engaging in ongoing good deeds, while others believe that there is no way a person can be good enough to be allowed in there and, therefore, Christ had to die on the cross, on our behalf, as atonement for all of our sins, else if a person can earn their way to Heaven on their own, then Christ death on the cross has no purpose.

<u>DIFFERENT PRACTICE</u> – some Christian bikers, usually of the Adventist denomination for example, strongly believe that Church Service should be on Saturdays, but most denominations believe that church worship service has always been conducted traditionally on Sundays and therefore that's the way it should be.

<u>DIFFERENT PURPOSE</u> – some Christian biker groups are formed for the sole purpose of internal fellowship in which member can draw closer to each other, remain in a positive path by being accountable to each other, and grow in spiritual knowledge through regular Bible studies. However, other groups are formed with evangelistic purposes, meaning they exist solely to make conscious effort to convert bikers to their beliefs and practices. Still others are formed simply for the pleasure of riding motorcycles and going on adventurous local or distant trips. A few are formed to promote a specific denominational theology.

<u>DIFFERENT INVOLVEMENT</u> – some Christian biker groups (MCs) are heavily involved in the local biker culture and live the "biker life" 24/7 and love it. Whereas other Christian biker groups (MMs), although also involved in the local biker culture to a lesser degree, they do it mainly for evangelistic reasons, and not because they practice the biker lifestyle. MMs, just like MCs, also have a genuine love for bikers, support their events, and make themselves available to help bikers in times of need.

<u>DIFFERENT EXPECTATIONS</u> – some Christian biker groups are very strict as far as members' participation. But most of them are less demanding of their members and treat its presence more like a social activity rather than a strict commitment by members.

There are many more differences among the Christian biker groups; however, the list above should clarify by now why not all people of the Christian faith can fly the same color. There is a great diversity in how people perceive life and its meaning. It is why there are so many MCs, 1%ers, RCs, MMs, etc. As time passes by, humanity become much more liberal in beliefs and ways of life and, therefore, "new" MCs, 1%ers, RCs, MMs, etc, are formed to reflect the changes in society – it is often the very same reason why many groups, under these categories, eventually either dissolve themselves or change leaderships.




