

#### ABATE of FLORIDA ACCOMPLISHMENTS

ABATE was the driving force behind the changes in Florida's Helmet Law. Florida Motorcyclists, over the age of 21 and who carry at least \$10,000 medical insurance coverage now enjoy the Freedom to Choose whether to wear a helmet or not. ABATE has developed & copyrighted "The Motorcycle Safety & Awareness Program" (MSAP). The program is presented to non-motorcyclists to educate them on how to safely share the road with motorcycles. It is taught in local schools & to civic organizations at no charge in the hope of reducing motorcycle accidents and deaths through education, not legislation. ABATE has passed the Vulnerable Road User Bill in 2024, signed by the Governor, for vulnerable road user to pay specified civil penalty; requires person's driver license to be suspended for specified period; requires person to attend specified driver improvement course.

ABATE has gained a positive and respected position in Tallahassee. Because of our Lobbyist and Legislative efforts, State Representatives are aware of ABATE members and our vigilant quest. ABATE reminds travelers every day to "Look Twice Save a Life, Motorcycles are everywhere"

Support ABATE of Florida Inc. and let those who ride decide!







He also spoke about wanting to add to the Vulnerable Road Users Law, to add that flashing white and amber lights should be allowed for VRU.


Anyways, I know that I meandered a bit. I just wanted to say "Thank you all for your friendship I hope you all have a wonderful season!

We are sometimes so focused on what is happening locally and in our own State, that we forget there are other organizations that are our there, fighting for our rights and freedom on a national level. The Motorcycle Riders Foundation is chiefly concerned with issues at the national and international levels that impact the freedom and safety of American street motorcyclists. We are also committed to educating rights advocates to improve effectiveness at the state and local levels. The MRF works together with State Motorcyclists' Rights Organizations (SMROs), assisting them with state and local agendas as well as working with them to influence Washington, DC - from the Congress to government departments and agencies to the Office of the President of the United States. We also work with allies in Europe and Asia to influence talks on vehicle globalization and harmonization that are proceeding under the United Nations and the World Health Organization (WHO).

MRF Watching User Fees, Ensuring Fairness For Motorcycles

As Congress prepares to take up a major highway and transportation reauthorization bill in 2026, proposals to impose new federal registration fees on electric and hybrid vehicles are expected to


resurface. House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee Chairman Sam Graves (R-MO) this week stated that user fees on EVs and hybrids will likely be included in the bipartisan legislation, emphasizing that "If you are using our roads and bridges, you should be paying into that process."

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) continues to monitor these discussions closely to ensure that motorcycles are treated fairly in any user fee system used to fund road and infrastructure construction. The MRF supports the principle that all roadway users contribute to the upkeep of the nation's highways, but we will strongly oppose any proposal that unfairly singles out or penalizes motorcyclists.

A key part of this debate centers on the federal gas tax, which has remained unchanged at 18.4 cents per gallon since 1993. With inflation and improved vehicle fuel efficiency reducing revenues, the Highway Trust Fund, which is funded through the federal fuel tax, faces a growing deficit, prompting lawmakers to explore new funding mechanisms.

With Congress under pressure to stabilize the Trust Fund, there will be increased focus on identifying new and fair sources of revenue. The MRF is committed to ensuring that motorcyclists' voices are part of this conversation and that policymakers understand the important role motorcycles play in reducing congestion, fuel consumption, and roadway wear. As work on the 2026 highway bill moves forward, the MRF will remain vigilant in protecting the rights and interests of America's riders. "



Proverbs 27 verse 17 says iron sharpens iron and one man sharpens another.

There is something about walking into a clubhouse. The smell of leather. The sound of boots on concrete. The low rumble of brotherhood in the air. You learn real quick that a clubhouse is not just a building. It is a place where respect is lived out, not just talked about. One wrong move and you can throw off the whole rhythm of the room. One right move and you strengthen the bond.

Life with Christ works the same way. The Lord gives us clear expectations. Not to restrict us, but to shape us. A clubhouse runs smooth when everyone knows the code and honors it. God's kingdom is no different. He lays out a way for us to walk so our lives run steady and our fellowship stays tight.

In the MC world, you do not just stroll into the club-house and act like the place owes you something. You come in with respect. You greet the room. You pay attention to who is who. You listen more than you talk. You stay aware of your surroundings. You do not create drama in a place built for unity. And you never forget you are part of something bigger than yourself.

Now imagine the Christian life as that same clubhouse. The Lord invites us in, but He also calls us to grow up in how we carry ourselves. We do not get to act careless with our words. We do not get to bring in attitudes that divide the room. We do not get to ignore the authority He places over us. We walk in as people who understand that the presence of God deserves reverence.

I have seen brothers get corrected in the clubhouse. It is not always comfortable, but it protects the integrity of the whole house. God does that with us. He sharpens us through Scripture, through trials, and through other believers who love us enough to tell us the truth. Iron sharpening iron sometimes throws sparks, but those sparks make us stronger.

When you honor the house, the house honors you. When you honor God, He grows you, strengthens you, and steadies your path. Not because you earned it, but because obedience opens the door for blessing and wisdom.

#### Reflection

Think about how you walk into the Lord's house each day. Not just the church building, but your life, your thoughts, your marriage, your work, your riding, all of it. Are you carrying yourself with the respect a son of the King ought to carry. Are you living in a way that sharpens the people around you or dulls them. Take a moment and ask the Lord to show you where your spiritual clubhouse etiquette needs some tightening up. Then commit to walking it out with strength and humility.


