Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2010 was our 10th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote motorcycle safety and awareness.
- We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees; this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.






It's another New Year





LET THE 2022 ADVENTURE BEGIN!



Every year at this time, pray and ask God for a word- a single word declaration to describe what He wants to reinforce in me for the upcoming year. One year it was 'Trust'; another was 'Courage.' I really learned a lot the year He gave me the word 'Authority.'

You might wonder how this works. Let me explain: I usually just ask God a simple question. I'm generally not in a church building but at home where I can be somewhat quiet. He impressed on my heart the word 'Restoration.' At the time, I could think of several areas that could use some restoration but had NO IDEA what I was in store for.

The first part of the year included selling one home and buying another. Renewal began in my heart as I saw the place of rest God was preparing for my husband and me. We've never worked harder in our lives, but the reward is finally on the horizon.

Restoration also came to us in the form of a phone call when my husband learned he had a

daughter and two grandchildren. Years and years ago, the opportunity to do a paternity test was taken from him so he never really knew until she reached out to find him. God's restoration has never been so exciting!

Every December, I get excited to think about what next year's word might be and the adventure it's sure to bring, but last year I never made it that far. I wrecked on a motorcycle just before Christmas and recovering became my biggest priority. Around February, it dawned on me that I completely missed getting my word for 2021 and in my heart, I felt cheated. After another 11-day bout in the hospital last April, I heard His still small voice say, 'I'm not done restoring.' My body needed time to mend but now I can confidently say that physically I'm almost 100% refurbished.

Restoration came to my family as well. My daughter and her husband had their first baby and moved back home. Sometimes restoration is instant, but more often it's a slow process, Him taking things apart and thoughtfully putting them back together. I've had to learn to sit on my hands and let God work things out at HIS pace.

Well, it's that time... to sit at His feet and ask for the word. I dare you to join me and let the 2022 adventure begin!

So many ways to celebrate this day...be creative..have fun!







We were all a little busy with family over the holidays and really didn't have time to get together, to research and write our article, so we thought we'd share some interesting and fun motorcycle facts that we found at www.motorcyclelegal-foundation.com/motorcycle-facts from March 16, 2018.

These 38 motorcycle facts explore the last 100 years of motorcycling. Test your knowledge and see how many of these motorcycle fun facts you know!

1. In 1887, Yamaha started as a piano manufacturer, but today is a multinational conglomerate that still produces musical instruments. They have added boats, car engines, swimming pools, industrial robots, wheelchairs, RVs, electronics, and golf carts, and motorcycles.
2. The record for the longest-ever backwards motorcycle ride was set by Dipayan Choudhury in Jabalpur, India on October 7, 2014, lasting 125.52 miles (202 kilometers).
3. Legend has it that the origin of the term "hog", when referring to a Harley-Davidson motorcycle, was from the early part of the 1900s Harley's racing team, the Wrecking Crew. They had a small pig as a mascot and one of the riders would do victory laps with the pig sitting on the bike's gas tank. In later years, HOG became the official acronym of the Harley Owners Group and is the trading symbol of Harley-Davidson on the New York Stock Exchange.
4. Recognized around the world as a leader in motorcycle helmet manufacturing, Arai Helmets started as a hat-making company in Japan in 1926 making gear for the construction industry. Company founder Hirotake Arai was once a motorcycle stunt rider and the company is still privately owned today and run by the Arai family.
5. The world's longest motorcycle was built in Gujarat,

India in 2015 by Bharat Sinh Parmar, sitting at 86 ft 3 in (26.29 m) long.

6. Sixty-eight percent of the female motorcyclists who died in crashes in 2016 were passengers, and their deaths represented 92 percent of the passenger deaths. The vast majority of male motorcyclists who died were drivers.

7. Engine sizes of motorcycles whose drivers were killed in crashes have gone up dramatically. Among motorcycle drivers killed in 2016, 33 percent drove motorcycles with engine sizes larger than 1,400cc, compared with 9 percent in 2000 and less than 1 percent in 1990.

8. The Isle of Mann TT (a high-speed motorcycle race) is held on closed public roads and the current lap record is just under 17 minutes with an average speed of 133.9 miles per hour (215 kph).

9. On the 1970s TV police series, CHiPS, actor Erik Estrada suffered a very serious motorcycle accident while filming an episode. Until he recovered, he literally shot his scenes from his hospital bed.

10. Did you know that modern sport bike tires don't contain any natural rubber? The tread of a tire is composed of synthetic rubber, which has been compounded to give a compromise between durability and traction.

11. Motorcyclists in Indiana only have to stop for 120 seconds (2 minutes) at a red stop light. They can treat the stop light as if it were a stop sign, then proceed through the intersection cautiously. The law was nicknamed "The Dead Red" law, but officially is designated IC 9-21-3-7b-3 signed in 2015.

12. Honda began selling pushbikes in 1946 fitted with two-stroke 50cc generator engines originally designed for use with army field telephones. In 1992 (another 46

years later) it launched one of the most complex production motorcycle ever made with the Honda NR750. The NR boasted oval pistons with two connecting rods and eight valves per cylinder. Initially made as a racing only model, Honda later made 300 road versions of the NR available to the public.

13. Suzuki originally began making weaving looms for Japan's silk industry in the early part of the 1900s. Company founder Michio Suzuki wanted to diversify his company and began an engineering firm that started making small cars and engines during the 1930s. The first Suzuki motorcycle appeared in 1952 and was a motorized bicycle called a Power Free. It had a two-stroke 36cc engine that featured a double-sprocket gear system for the rider to either pedal with engine assistance, pedal without the engine, or simply disconnect the pedals and use the engine. Today, along with motorcycles, Suzuki makes cars, marine engines, wheelchairs and is Japan's second largest manufacturer of small cars and trucks.

14. The streamliner motorcycle, the Ack Attack, holds the record for world's fastest motorcycle. In 2010, Rocky Robinson used a streamliner-shaped motorcycle to set a world record for the fastest motorcycle at just over 376 miles per hour on the famed Bonneville Salt Flats in Utah.

15. A man in North Carolina buried his Harley-Davidson on his property and claimed it stolen in 2006. He was paid for the stolen motorcycle and his loan also paid off. The motorcycle was discovered in 2012 by a new owner of the property having some grading done by a contractor.

16. Prior to 2008, the leading age category for motorcycle fatalities was 29 years old and less, but 2008 saw a decrease in that category and lead change to the 50 years and older crowd.

17. The longest distance riding a motorcycle in 24 hours is 2,023.5 miles (3256.5 kilometers) and was achieved by Matthew McKelvey aka "Bushy" at the Phakisa Freeway in Welkom, South Africa, on 8 October 2014.

18. Did you know Steve McQueen's famous 65-foot motorcycle jump in the movie 'The Great Escape' was done by stand-in rider Bud Ekins and he did it in just one take?

19. In the earliest days of Harley-Davidson motorcycles, small advertisements were placed in the Automobile and Cycle Trade Journal offering bare Harley-Davidson engines to the do-it-yourself trade that could assemble their own motorcycle. By April 1905, complete motorcycles were in production on a very limited basis. That year, the

first Harley-Davidson dealer, Carl H. Lang of Chicago, sold three bikes from the five built in the Davidson backyard shed.

20. Peter Fonda wore the Captain America jacket and rode his chopper a week around Los Angeles before shooting began on the movie Easy Rider, to give them a broken-in look, and to get used to riding the radically designed bike. The American flag on the back of the jacket, and on the gas tank of the bike, caused him to be pulled over several times by the police.

21. Aside from making motorcycles, Kawasaki also manufactures personal watercraft, ships, electronics, construction equipment, tractors, trains, helicopters, jet engines, missiles and space rockets.

22. Only 3 states in the US do not require a helmet for any motorcyclist, while 28 states require a helmet for certain riders and the other 19 states plus the District of Columbia require a helmet for any rider (called a universal helmet law).

23. The highest three months for motorcycle theft are July, August, and September while the lowest are February, December, and March.

24. Dodge built and sold nine motorcycles with a Viper V-10 engine called the Dodge Tomahawk. The motorcycle featured 500 horsepower with dual front and rear 20" wheels and tires. Each sold for between \$500k and \$700k.

25. Only about 30% of all stolen motorcycles are recovered, which is half of all automobiles at 60% recovery.

26. Actual motorcycle clubs were on the set of the 2003 movie Biker Boyz to aid with tricks, stunts, and racing.

27. Honda motorcycles in California were the most stolen cycles in 2011 while Harley-Davidsons were the least stolen of the top five brands that made the list.

28. The Givenchy 'motorcycle jacket' was listed in 2016 as the most expensive jacket on the market. At \$9,100, the women's Hooded Biker Jacket is clearly one of those pieces that was designed for the sake of fashion rather than wearing while riding. Most of the jacket is made of lambskin, but pillowy lamb fur lines the collar and inside of the hood.

29. An estimated 10 cents of every \$1 in insurance premiums goes toward payment of fraudulent claims, according to the North Carolina insurance department as of 2012.

30. The longest motorcycle jump on record was set by

Robbie Maddison in Melbourne, Australia, jumping 346 feet (107 m) to set the world record.

31. Doug Domokos was inducted in the American Motorcycle Association (AMA) Hall of Fame in 2002. He was nicknamed “The Wheelie King” and once held the record for the longest wheelie at an amazing 145 miles in length. That record stood for over 8 years. (Before you start doing wheelies on your own, check out our state-by-state guide to motorcycle wheelie laws.)

32. The sound made by the “motorcycle” that Chris Pine rides to the shuttle departing to Starfleet Academy in the film Star Trek is the same sound used on The Jetsons from 1962 for the “cars” they fly.

33. The 2007 movie, Wild Hogs, features quick cameos from Paul Teutul Sr. and Paul Teutul Jr. of American Chopper: The Series (2003) . The two famous bike builders appear in the Wild Hogs’ favorite bar as the bar owner and a background patron. The olive-drab green bike the character named Jack (played by actor Ray Liotta) was riding is made by Orange County Choppers and features their logo on the motorcycle in the movie.

34. In 2016, California reported the highest amount of registered motorcycles in the country (842,106 registered); Delaware had the least amount (28,156).

35. Emilio Scotto holds the world record of the longest motorcycle ride, spanning 10 years, 279 countries and a total distance of 457,000 miles

36. Harley-Davidson is the leading motorcycle manufacturer in the U.S. market, producing \$5.6 billion dollars in revenue in 2017.

37. The first company that advertised a motorcycle’s top speed of over 100mph was Brough Superior. That claim was made for its SS100 in 1924. Considered even today to be innovative and beautifully designed machines, Brough motorcycles were the first to have prop stands, twin headlights, crash bars, interconnected silencers and 1000cc v-twin engines. Every SS100 was road tested on public roads to check that it could reach 100mph. If it didn’t, it was returned to the factory for further work until it could reach that feat.

38. In 2017, California became the first state to legalize lane-splitting through the AB-51 Bill.

U.S. EXPERIENCES LARGEST 6-MONTH INCREASE IN TRAFFIC DEATHS EVER

U.S. traffic deaths soared in the first six months of 2021, making for the most deadly 6-month period ever recorded. An estimated 20,160 people died in motor vehicle crashes on U.S. roads, an 18.4% increase from the same period in 2020, announced the U.S. Department of Transportation's NHTSA (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration).

Traffic deaths surged after Coronavirus lockdowns ended in 2020 as more drivers engaged in unsafe behavior like speeding and lack of seatbelt use, according to NHTSA behavioral research findings. That made for the largest six-month increase ever recorded in the Fatality Analysis Reporting System's history, which has been in use since 1975.

As U.S. roads became less crowded, some motorists perceived police were less likely to issue tickets because of Co-ViD-19, experts said. Incidents of road rage and driving under the influence were also found to be higher than before the pandemic. Travel on U.S. roads was up 13% in the first half compared to a year earlier.

"This is a crisis," noted Pete Buttigieg, the transportation secretary, adding that the rising traffic deaths left "countless loved ones behind," he said. "We cannot and should not accept these fatalities as simply a part of everyday life in America."

Buttigieg announced the Department's first-ever National Roadway Safety Strategy to launch in January with a comprehensive set of actions to reverse the current trend.

The initiative will be rooted in the Safe System or approach to roadway design that takes human error into account, first put

into effect in Sweden's Vision Zero in the 1990s, with the goal of eliminating all road deaths and serious injuries.

BBB AND ELECTRIC MOTORCYCLES

It's not law yet, and many political insiders don't believe it ever will be in its present form, but the Biden Administration's "Build Back Better Act" as currently written includes a tax credit toward the purchase of qualifying two- or three-wheeled electric vehicles, of 30% of the purchase price, up to a credit of \$7,500.

What kinds of bikes qualify for this credit; you may wonder? For starters, only motorcycles made "for use on public streets, roads, and highways" make the grade. Additionally, qualifying vehicles must be capable of achieving speeds of at least 45 miles per hour, and be powered by a 2.5kWh or greater battery.

Unfortunately, that also means that low-speed electric motorbikes (and scooters), often used for urban transport, do not meet the criteria for this credit. Additionally, while a \$7,500 tax credit sounds like a sweet incentive, your electric motorbike purchase must cost at least \$25,000 to hit that ceiling.

Various criteria, such as a taxpayer's modified adjusted gross income, can also affect the available tax credit offered. If married, taxpayers paying jointly make over \$500,000 in a year, or \$250,000 if filing as single taxpayers, the credit goes away completely.

The nearly \$2-trillion BBB, H.R. 5376, has passed in the House of Representatives and now awaits further action in the U.S. Senate when Congress returns from Holiday recess.

ELECTRIC COALITION PLANS MASSIVE INCREASE IN CHARGING STATIONS

In America, with its wide-open spaces, one of the biggest hurdles to EV adoption is range anxiety, and while cars manufacturers have made great strides in addressing this issue, electric bike OEMs still face an uphill ride due to size and shape limitations. Still, all EVs traversing American roads could stand to gain if the National Electric Highway Coalition has its way.

Simply stated, the NEHC wants to provide DC fast charging infrastructure along "major U.S. travel corridors" by the end of 2023. With current projections estimating that around 22 million EVs will take to U.S. roads by 2030, the Edison Electric Institute estimates the need for around 100,000 EV fast charg-

ing ports readily available from coast to coast.

That's a tall order, considering the U.S. Department of Energy current lists a total of 5,644 DC fast chargers across the entire United States. By the EEI's own estimates, that's nowhere near enough.

A total of 53 separate energy companies across the U.S. formed this NEHC power company coalition, with most being investor-owned energy companies from whom many of us receive our electric bills every month.

"EEI and our member companies are leading the clean energy transformation, and electric transportation is key to reducing carbon emissions across our economy," according to EEI President Tom Kuhn. "With the formation of the National Electric Highway Coalition, we are committed to investing in and providing the charging infrastructure necessary to facilitate electric vehicle growth and to helping alleviate any remaining customer range anxiety."

EUROPEAN MOTORCYCLE MANUFACTURER ASSOCIATION REVEALS FUTURE GOALS

Despite the growth and development in the electric mobility sector, the European Association of Motorcycle Manufacturers (ACEM) wants to go much further by 2030. On November 17, 2021, ACEM held an online conference to introduce its Vision 2030+. The strategic documents lay out a roadmap for the European motorcycle industry to continue development in conjunction with regional decarbonization goals. European Parliament and European Commission policy-makers were in attendance as well as industry leaders.

"The Vision 2030+ that we are presenting today is the result of a long-term reflection at the highest levels of the European motorcycle industry," said ACEM Vice-President and Head of BMW Motorcycles Dr. Markus Schramm. "Vision 2030+ is about the future of mobility but also about the valuable contribution our industry can make to help Europe achieve its goals in areas such as industrial policy, decarbonization, and road safety."

The presenters stressed the importance of cooperation among manufacturers such as the Swappable Batteries Consortium, but also noted that alternative fuels play a major role in meeting future goals. New proposals like the Fit for 55 package and alternative fuel deployment initiatives are all aimed at achiev-

ing the objectives set forth by the European Green Deal and the European Climate Law. Under the two bills, the E.U. is expected to reduce emissions by 55% by 2030.

"Through this Vision 2030+, the motorcycle industry is gearing up to be a part of tomorrow's European transport system, with advanced and increasingly sustainable products meeting different societal needs, such as personal mobility, leisure, and last-mile deliveries," concluded ACEM Secretary General Antonio Perlot. "Recognition and support by policymakers will be key to turn it into reality."

AI BEING DEVELOPED TO PREDICT AND AVOID COLLISIONS

Honda has announced that they will be embarking on an ambitious program to help make our streets safer by incorporating predictive Artificial Intelligence technology into driving and riding Honda automobiles and motorcycles.

"Honda will strive for zero traffic collision fatalities involving Honda motorcycles and automobiles globally by 2050," said Honda CEO, Toshihiro Mibe. Mibe also added that to eliminate motorcycle collision fatalities especially in emerging countries, Honda will "continue to strengthen research on safety technologies that enable motorcycles and automobiles to safely coexist and lead the way in realizing a collision-free society."

With Honda's "Safe and Sound Technology," information about potential risks in the traffic environment, which are detected based on information obtained from roadside cameras, on-board cameras and smartphones, will be aggregated in the server to reproduce that traffic environment in the virtual space. In that virtual space, in consideration of the conditions and characteristics of each individual road user, the system predicts/simulates the behaviors of road users at high risk of a collision. Then, the system derives the most appropriate support information to help the road users avoid such risks.

Such support information will be communicated intuitively to automobile drivers, motorcycle riders, and pedestrians through "cooperative risk HMI (human-machine interface)," which will make it possible for the system to encourage road users to take action to avoid a collision before it happens.

According to Honda, the company is targeting the testing and effectiveness of the system within the next few years, while standardization with industry-wide private-public collaboration will commence after 5 years. Honda also hopes to deploy the technology for “real world” applications sometime after 2030.

MOTORCYCLE EVENTS ONCE AGAIN CANCELED DUE TO CHINA VIRUS

Just as we thought the world was beginning to return to some semblance of normalcy, the global pandemic seems to be striking back with a vengeance, especially as majority of the Northern Hemisphere is right in the thick of winter. Several countries have seen massive increases in Coronavirus cases, particularly worrisome mutations, which unfortunately spells disaster for numerous motorcycling events -- be it indoors or outside -- such as The Elephant Rally, iconic IMOT, and high-adrenaline Supercross Dortmund, as biker gatherings across Europe are being postponed or have gotten the axe.

The racing scene, too, is not left without its casualties, as the Dortmund 2022 motocross series has also been canceled.

With worldwide travel bans, health mandates and safety restrictions once again set in place to curb the spread of the virus, hopes remain high that the events we motorcycle riders are so passionate about will return to the calendar soon.

OF CONCERN: 4 OUT OF 5 KINDERGARTNERS CAN'T RIDE A BICYCLE

Ryan McFarland, the founder of Strider kids bicycles, told his motorcycle industry audience at the Orange County IMS Outdoors event that today only one in five kindergartners know how to ride a bicycle.

Similarly, most young drivers today have never learned to use a clutch to drive a car with a manual transmission.

Most motorcycles require both balance and use of a clutch, and in the past one could assume that new motorcycle customers would already be familiar with both.

Not-so-much today, but the motorcycle industry is aware of both of these challenges, and are developing new rider programs, power assist bicycles, and new technologies such as clutchless shifting and continuously variable transmissions, as well as more affordable rides.

No, today we can't count on as many kids riding bicycles or teens learning to drive a stick, but the motorcycle industry is working hard in other ways to attract new riders.

THEFT ALERT: THIEVES USING APPLE TECH TO TRACK VEHICLES OF INTEREST

Apple created AirTags to help users find commonly misplaced items like keys or luggage. When paired to an Apple device via Bluetooth, each AirTag allows the owner to track the item's whereabouts. Hidden AirTags have even been used to track down stolen vehicles, including motorcycles.

However, AirTags don't just let the user track their belongings, they also allow thieves to track other people's property. Authorities have discovered that crooks are stashing AirTags on luxury vehicles, out of the owner's sight. Once the thief tracks the automobile (or motorcycle) to the owner's residence, they can steal it once out of the public's eye.

"Inspect your vehicle regularly and call police if you notice any suspicious potential tracking devices," suggested the York Regional Police in Ontario, Canada. "If possible, park your vehicle in a locked garage," and "consider purchasing a quality video surveillance system."


