President's Message Jimbo Sherrow

I am pleased to report that since last month's update, and almost three months after my motorcycle accident, I have finally managed to get out of my wheelchair and start walking again. I am still along way from being able to ride, but with a little luck, I am hoping to cross that bridge within the next couple of months as well. Thanks to the efforts of our ABATE legal counsel, Chris Sharp, the ticket I received for reckless driving was dismissed by the judge, because the police officer who ticketed me forgot to write an explanation of just how I was supposedly reckless. The past couple of months have been difficult for sure, but they would have been a whole lot harder without all of the support I received from my friends within the Chapter and the South Florida biker community.

On the legislative front, I am happy to report as of the date of this column, there have still been no bills proposed to bring back the mandatory helmet laws in Florida, which ABATE managed to overturn back in 2000. This does not mean we are out of the woods yet, since the 60 day legislative session in Tallahassee does not formally begin until March, but the longer we go without seeing a helmet bill, the better chances we have of being able to celebrate the 10th anniversary of our Freedom of Choice on July 1, 2010. In addition, the chances of passing ABATE's stiffer penalties bill are looking better and better, and this may finally be the year that we win passage of this important law to hold drivers accountable when they injure or kill bikers by their stupidity on the road. There are also several bills limiting texting while driving, and at least one of them looks likely to pass as well.

At our State Meeting in February, our State President and Lobbyist, Doc Reichenbach, also reported that ABATE has managed to "recover" the \$500,000.00 in state funds that were allocated for motorcycle safety and education during the 2009 legislative session. This is the same money that ABATE has used in the past to fund our motorcycle safety and awareness program, purchase highway billboards and pay for giveaway items such as bumper stickers and the very popular yellow and black "Check Twice for Motorcycles" magnets that you may have seen on several hundred vehicles in Broward County. The story behind this issue is long and convoluted, but after the money was initially allocated for use by ABATE, several elected officials tried to misappropriate the money for their own purposes, and ABATE had to threaten legal action against the State of Florida before the money was finally returned to us in the last few weeks. Now that we have control of the money again, it will be used to support our safety and awareness programs, and we should have a whole bunch more of the "Check Twice for Motorcycles" magnets in the next few months, which we will try to give away as quickly as possible.

The February State Meeting also featured visits from several more politicians running for office in 2010, including Marco Rubio for the second time, and Paula Dockery, who is running for the Republican nomination for governor. The fact that these politicians are inviting themselves to speak with us shows what a political force ABATE has become in recent years, and we are hoping to use this power to benefit the motorcycling community in the 2010 elections.

At the risk of repeating myself, one way you can help ABATE flex its political muscles in this election year is to join us in Tallahassee for the Annual Freedom Rights Rally on Monday, April 19, 2010. The SE Chapter will be sending a bunch of members to Tallahassee for the Rally so if you are

interested in riding with us, give me a call or come to the March or April Chapter meetings for details on the ride. If all goes according to plan this year, we will hopefully be celebrating the 10th anniversary of Freedom of Choice on July 1, 2010.

Finally, if you are going to Bike Week this year, ABATE of Florida will be running its campground at the Volusia County Fairgrounds in Deland. With low prices for camping and secure bike parking, this is one of the best places to stay in Daytona, not to mention that ABATE throws one of the best parties around and a good time is guaranteed for all. Our Chapter will be setting up its usual "compound," so if you are in the area, stop by to say hello and have a cold one or two and if you do go to Daytona this year, ride safe and try to avoid the amateurs so you can make it home in one piece.

Remember, ABATE is for everyone, no matter what you ride. For more information, check out the Chapter newsletter and the website, www.abatese.org, or stop by one of our monthly meetings and get involved. You can also call me at 954-305-1599.

Ride safe and free, and remember that the price of freedom is eternal vigilance.

OldHippy's Corner

Motorcycle Profiling: Yes it can and does happen.

Law enforcement has used this in many situations to make reason of a stop or search. We have all seen and read where the ACLU has been called out and have declared that this was unjust. What gets me is that when they should they don't, like the terrorists that haven't been involved in different attacks, should have been, but instead we find motorcyclists being pulled over because the officer by the bikers' apparel finds reason to suspect a crime has been committed or is going to be committed.

Washington State has a bill out to correct this, bill is HB2511.

HB 2511 would force local law enforcement agencies to adopt a written policy designed to condemn and prevent the profiling of motorcyclists and to institute training to address the issue. The language used in HB 2511 is borrowed from a bill passed in 2002 that dealt with racial profiling.

"If we have to make it a legislative matter to make it stop, so be it," said Kirby, a Tacoma Democrat. "We shouldn't have had to pass a racial profiling bill, but we did because it was the right thing to do. And this is the right thing to do."

The Confederation of Clubs, US Defenders and ABATE of Washington State Got together to put heat on their law makers after they had their annual ride to the Capital similar to the one we have coming up, This is the just of it per the letter that was written:

During Black Thursday January 22, 2009 the Washington State Patrol indiscriminately profiled the motorcycle community on the grounds of the Washington State Capital. While members of the motorcycle rights movement were inside the Capital, attempting to find sponsorship for a bill that would stop motorcycle profiling, the State Patrol was captured on video crawling through the bushes in order to record the license plate and identifying information of every motorcycle in the parking lot. When confronted the State Patrol replied that they were gathering information based on their fictitious belief that there is always a propensity for violence when motorcycle clubs are together. This is, by definition, profiling.

The Washington Courts have confirmed that the Washington State Patrol is guilty of unlawful profiling and discrimination against motorcyclists. In 2002 the Court granted a permanent injunction against the State Patrol's use of a training pamphlet titled **BIKER 101.** On November 23, 2009 the Washington State Patrol, under oath, explicitly admitted that they profile members of motorcycle clubs and continue to use **BIKER 101** as a training manual.

BIKERS ARE DANGEROUS'A copy provided by ABATE's attorney to the bill sponsors that outlines the three main motorcycle equipment violations in Washington state (helmet, noise and handlebar height); includes protocol for how to pull bikers over; directs troopers to legally impound the motorcycle and "book" the biker if possible; and tells them to talk to riders about their patches, to take pictures of their badges and bikes, and to be professional. The first line reads: "Bikers are dangerous." "Now if that isn't a statement of profiling, I don't know what is," We have all grown accustomed to those fleeting looks of disapproval and trepidation when we are on our bikes. I have ridden in areas where drivers pull up alongside my motorcycle on the highway, they grip their steering wheels a little tighter and tell their kids to look away, I have also seen and heard where riders have been denied service at restaurants for wearing a bandanna and a leather vest.

This has been going on for a long time and it has to stop and unfortunately it may take a Bill introduced to get it done.

The general public still is having a hard time understanding the biking community. They still see us the ones dressed in leather and have patches, pins, ear rings and other items that distinguish us from the main stream. Yes there is some things that is accruing in far away places and also in the distance past, but to put us all in a group is by far Profiling any way you look at it. It has gotten a little better than it was when I first started to ride when if you saw a cop, you might as well pull over and put the kick stand down because you are going to be there for a while as he "checks" you out.

There is a couple of ways that we can help to at least slow this infringement of our rights and liberty. For one we need educate the public by keeping up the good work we have been doing showing them that we are for the most part law biding people and are no threat to them, just like to ride and become part of a club or organization. Second and most important, we will fight this type of violation of our rights by legal actions and if needed be have another #@\$%^ bill on the books and you know what I think of more laws especially some of the crap lately they have been trying to feed us.

Please let me know if you think you have been a victim of this Totalitarian enforcement and also hope they do this at our Run to the State that is coming up



SAFETY DIRECTOR'S REPORT "Geo" Bograkos

Right and Left Turns - Different risks, different realities

If all you had to do was ride in a straight line, almost anybody could handle a motorcycle. But in the real world we have to negotiate turns with our scoots. It is not accurate to believe that making a right turn is the same as making a left one except for direction. There really are different risks and realities involved, which we do automatically, but rarely think about. For example, right turns are sharper than left turns.

That means that right turns are harder to negotiate than left turns at any given speed. It also means that if you mismanage the turn and go wide, you may find yourself in a lane of oncoming traffic. In a left turn situation that you mismanage you may find yourself off the road entirely. Which is more dangerous is largely a function of chance.

If, for example, there are no oncoming cars when you mismanage a right turn, at least you remain on pavement and have the chance of recovering from going wide, but any oncoming cars present you with a head-on collision as an unappetizing alternative.

Running off the road in a mismanaged left turn may not be worse than taking a tumble, but it could very well involve running into something on the roadside.

While making right turns involves greater lean angles at any particular speed than a corresponding left turn, there is usually MORE TRACTION available in a right turn than when turning to the left. This is because most roads are crowned. Thus, while turning to the right the road is cambered into the turn while turning left it is cambered away from the turn.

Left turns effectively provide you a narrower lane for use by your motorcycle. Because you must lean a motorcycle in order to make a turn, you cannot ride as far to the left within your lane when making a left turn as you might like without dragging your head or left grip across the center line and into the path of oncoming traffic. When making right turns, motorcycles typically can use their entire lane width.


Making a right turn at an intersection is FAR LESS dangerous than making a left turn at that intersection. The most obvious reason being, of course, that you do not have to cross the path of any oncoming traffic to do so.

One final thought: If you make a left turn across an oncoming traffic lane your danger is not restricted solely to that oncoming traffic. Before you actually make your left turn you must do a

head check to the left to insure that someone is not trying to pass you on the left! If you are struck by that passing vehicle YOU ARE TO BLAME as you have performed an unsafe lane change.

Just some food for thought. Ride safe!


then he is a fool. Therefore, April 1st is his day. Court is adjourned."
