

Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

• On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.

• We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).

• We got the handlebar heights law modified.

• We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.

• We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.

• We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote motorcycle safety and awareness.

• We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.

• Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.

• Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees; this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.

• We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.

• The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.

• The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations. *For more Information:*



SAFETY DIRECTOR

Thank you for picking up this newsletter and reading it! and thank you for your support. Just a few things I would like to say about when you are driving your vehicle - First, use your turn signals when changing lanes and turning. I know most motorcycle riders are good drivers but sometimes we forget the simple things like the turn signals. Also when in your vehicle and it is raining, please turn on your lights. Some vehicles don't have daytime running lights and some, such as my wife's car, the DRLs don't turn the rear lights on. Also always look twice for motorcycles. We now have MSAP (Motorcycle Safety Awareness Program) instructors in the SE Chapter of ABATE. This program is to help all drivers to be more aware of motorcycles. This course is mostly for people who do not ride a motorcycle. It really does work, statistics have proven this. If you know of a person or a group that may be interested, please contact our Safety Director, the number is in the newsletter. This course only takes about an hour and is well worth the time. 

Pre-Ride before you Ride

You hear a ding on your phone that an email has arrived. A smile appears because your Road Captain just gave a KSU (Kick Stands Up) time of departure for a new upcoming weekend ride with your Brothers and Sisters! That usually is welcome news, but now what is bestowed upon you is the responsibility to get prepared and willingness to follow the Bikers code of respect. All these preparations start with your bike. Fill up your tank even if you think you have enough fuel for the proposed trip. Why? Like all of life, things can change quickly. Take the time to thoroughly check out your bike the previous night or at least a few hours before you meet up with your fellow riders. Especially when a long ride is planned, grab a few wrenches and make sure all your motorcycles nuts and bolts are tight, look for cracks in hoses, check the chain or belt tension, and take a few minutes to just give your trusted steed a good overall visual inspection. The longstanding T-CLOCK acronym can be a great way to remember all the basic checks. Tires & Wheels, Control levers, Lights and batteries, Oil levels, Chassis, Kickstand.

A few minutes before the signal for KSU and you ride off to the open road to feel that freedom in the wind, take a moment to let your bike warm up. That doesn't mean your iron horse has to sit and idle for 5 or 10 minutes. Harley's, as well as most motorcycles, can reach enough of an operating temperature in about 1 to 1 1/2 minutes after start up. Most motorcycle oil functions best at around 140 degrees which can usually be obtained in this short amount of time. Now your engine may be ready, but your tranny takes a little longer and needs some forward motion, so for the first few miles just take it easy. Just like old bikers waking up in the morning, it takes a few minutes for your old scoot to wake up and function at its best. During this short warm up it's a great time to do that last-minute double check on your bike. Operate all your lights and see they are functioning, tap your

brakes and make sure all the levers are working. It's better to find out something is not functioning properly before you head out instead of letting the truth be told while being stranded on the side of a busy highway.

Even more important than checking the mechanics of your bike is making sure you are prepared. That ranges from wearing the right clothing, having rain gear which is always a good idea, and in south Florida includes making sure you are hydrated, have plenty of sunblock and a pair of day and night eye protection. Being caught out at night with only a dark pair of sunglasses can make life like riding in a total blackout. Also, have a full charge on your cell phone. This can be one of the best pieces of equipment you can have for those unexpected highway emergencies. Most importantly though, have the right mind set before you get on your bike.

Now comes the old adage "full tank, empty bladder" which still holds true today. Disrupting the group ride because you didn't make a restroom stop or your bike wasn't prepared can create an unnecessary hardship for the whole group let alone a few nasty stares.

And lastly out of Old Skool Biker respect, be on time, every time.





Kingdom of God. The Christian Motorcyclists Association is interdenominational and evangelistic in nature." Of course, in our community, they are so much more to us, as our friends, our brothers and sisters, thank you for all you do!

We found this organization, Rolling Thunder Chapter 1 Florida. Their mission statement is "is to publicize the POW*MIA issue. To educate the public that many American Prisoners of War were left behind after all previous wars and to help correct the past and to protect future Veterans from being left behind should they become Prisoners Of War (POW) or Missing In Action (MIA). We are also committed to helping American Veterans from all wars." This is from their website https:// www.rollingthunderflorida1.org,

"HOW IT ALL STARTED:

The Vietnam War proved to be a difficult time in America's history. Similar to today's political climate, our nation was divided, primarily over issues of peace and war. As the Vietnam war came to a close, more than 58,000 American soldiers were killed, and thousands more were still being held as Prisoners of War, or deemed Missing In Action. Our government failed its mission of accountability, by not bringing home the remains of the fallen or missing for an honorable and respectful burial.

However, in 1988, several veterans of the Vietnam War rallied together their families, fellow veterans, and veterans' advocates, to organize a demonstration at the Capitol Building in Washington, DC over the Memorial Day weekend. They announced their arrival with the roar of their Harley-Davidson's, a sound similar to the the 1965 massive B-52 bombing campaign against North Vietnam named 'Operation Rolling Thunder'. Approximately 2,500 motorcycles participated in that rally, demanding that the U.S. government account for all POW & MIA's.

The group then became known as Rolling Thunder, and each year up until 2019, has held an annual "Ride for Freedom" to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall. It was estimated that nearly 1.2

million motorcycles participated in the final Washington, D.C. Ride For Freedom XXXII in 2019. ROLLING THUNDER® TODAY:

Rolling Thunder today has more than 86 chapters throughout the United States, Canada, Australia and Europe. The group is actively involved yearround in promoting legislation to increase veteran benefits and resolve the POW*MIA issue from all wars. They also provide financial support, food, clothing and other essentials to veterans, veterans' families, veterans groups, and women's' crisis centers"

There is also the Southern Cruisers Riding Club, which we talked about in detail in our July 2022 article. Go back and check it out. They have raised over \$4 million over the years, for St. Jude Children's Hospital.

And we will finish with this group, created for the women who have a love of motorcycles, the Motor Maids MC, now 1,300 members strong across the US. "They require that members be female and own a motorcycle, as well as display a passion for the open road. They support many women empowerment charities as well. History: In the late 30's, a young woman motorcycle enthusiast named Linda Dugeau of Providence, Rhode Island, conceived the idea that there might be a number of women who owned their own motorcycles and might be interested in becoming acquainted with one another. Linda wrote to dealers, riders and anyone she thought might know of women motorcycle riders. After this extensive search, she compiled a list from which the Motor Maid organization was founded with 51 Charter members in 1940. The American Motorcycle Association Charter #509 was issued to the club in 1941. Uniting Women Motorcyclists: The founding premise of the Motor Maids was to unite women motorcyclists in promoting motorcycle interest. The initial Constitutional Article establishing the requirements for membership has remained the Motor Maid hallmark since the first meeting - membership shall consist of women who legally own and operate their own motorcycle or one belonging to a family member. At a meeting

in 1944, came the club colors - Royal Blue and Silver Grav – and the Motor Maid emblem in the form of a shield. The uniform had its beginnings at this meeting also. Initially the uniforms were tailor-made of silver-gray gabardine with royal blue piping. It evolved into a uniform consisting of gray slacks, royal blue over-blouse with white boots and tie. In 2006, the membership voted for a new uniform. The official uniform now consists of black pants and boots, royal blue mock neck long sleeved shirt with a white cotton vest, and of course white gloves. The Motor Maids became known as the "Ladies of the White Gloves". The Motor Maids have been asked to parade at numerous races across the country and in Canada. They now have members in almost every state in the US (including Hawaii and Alaska) and several Canadian Provinces." You can find out more about this group at https://www.motormaidsinc. org/








COUNTRY MUSIC LEGEND AND MOTORCYCLE FAN LORETTA LYNN HAS PASSED

Country Music Star and AMA Hall of Fame inductee Loretta Lynn died in her sleep on October 4, 2022 at her popular ranch and tourist destination in Hurricane Mills, Tennessee, at age 90.

The Grammy Award winning singer rose to stardom in the music industry over six decades with hit singles like "Coal Miner's Daughter" and "Don't Come Home A-Drinkin," but Ms. Lynn was also a long-time supporter of amateur motocross racing, and hosted the AMA Amateur National Motocross Championship at her "Loretta Lynn Ranch & Family Campground" since 1982, personally inspiring many young riders, and was appropriately inducted into the American Motorcyclists Association (AMA) Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2021 for "opening her arms and ranch to countless motocross families."

ARIZONA LANE FILTERING LAW GOES INTO EFFECT

The new Arizona state law that allows lane-filtering for two-wheeled motorcycles under very specific circumstances officially went into effect on Saturday, September 24, 2022.

The Arizona state legislature passed bipartisan Senate Bill 1273 in March, signed into law March 24, 2022, by Governor Doug Ducey (R), and the bill does not allow "lane splitting," but rather "lane filtering" by motorcycles traveling between lanes of street traffic at a speed of 15 miles per hour or less. Three-wheeled vehicles, such as trikes or sidecars, are specifically not included in this change in the law.

S.B. 1273 was sponsored by Senator Tyler Pace (R-Mesa), who clarified that lane filtering and lane splitting are not the same thing. This new law now in effect will only allow for low-speed lane filtering in very specific situations, and it was crafted to resemble a similar lane filtering initiative that became law in Utah in 2019.

Lane splitting or filtering in some form are now allowed in Arizona, California, Hawaii and Utah, while states including Connecticut, Oregon, Washington and Virginia have introduced or are considering such legislation.

'NOISE' UNDER ATTACK IN CALIFORNIA

California Governor Gavin Newsom (D) has signed AB-2496 into law, to now require a certificate of compliance for a violation of noise limit requirements and certain modified exhausts, and putting a "Hold" on vehicle registrations if proof is not adequately provided in a timely manner.

"AB-2496 creates a system in which, if you are cited for noise, you must provide certification to the court within 90 days of citation that your exhaust has been corrected to acceptable standards," wrote ABATE of California in a 'Call to Action' opposing the measure; going on to explain that; "However, there is no system to test and certify, thus you can not get it. Further, IF you do not get it, your vehicle will NEVER be able to be registered in the State of California again. They want to remove us from the road."

The new law requires the court to inform the Department of Motor Vehicles if a certificate of compliance is not provided within 3 months of the violation date, treating this failure as noncompliance, and requiring the DMV, before renewing the registration of any vehicle, to check whether the

court has issued a hold on the vehicle registration for a violation of the noise requirements and to refuse to renew the registration until it has received a notification from the court that a certificate of compliance has been issued.

These requirements would become operative on January 1, 2027.

FEDERAL BILL DEMANDS ANSWERS ON ANTI-BIKER PROFILING

Congresswoman Susie Lee (D-NV), a member of the House Appropriations Committee, has included language [House Report 117-402] demanding answers from NHTSA regarding anti-biker profiling into a government funding bill, H.R. 8294, which states;

"The Committee is concerned that NHTSA may be conducting activities that encourage states to adopt legislation, regulation, or other policies that unjustly profile motorcycle riders. The Committee directs NHTSA to report to the House and Senate Committees on Appropriations on the extent to which the agency works with states on motorcycle passenger policies within 120 days of enactment of this Act."

Additionally, cosponsors are still being sought for H. Res 366 to prevent the discriminatory targeting of motorcyclists by law enforcement, similar to the anti-profiling resolution passed by the U.S. Senate in 2018. Meanwhile, the states of Washington (2011), Maryland (2016), Louisiana (2019), Idaho (2020) and New Hampshire (2022) have proactively passed laws to curb profiling.

E-BIKES MAY SOON BE AS COSTLY TO CHARGE AS ICE BIKES ARE TO REFUEL

Rising electricity costs are impacting public charging stations, leading to increased costs for charging electric bikes that could be higher than gasoline.

Historically, the comparatively low price of charging an electric vehicle versus fueling one fitted with an internal combustion engine (ICE) has meant that for those who can afford such vehicles, the switch from gas to electric transport has been a financially beneficial one.

However, as the price of energy continues to rise internationally, electric motorcycles could soon be more expensive to charge than combustion bikes cost to fill up.

Assuming the price of gasoline doesn't outpace the cost of electricity, a study summarized by VisorDown.com reports that costs per kilowatthour (kWh) of electricity at 'rapid' charging stations in the U.K. have increased by 42% in the four months from May 2022 to September 2022; "That has led to charge costs per mile that are not far short of fill-up costs per mile."

Whatever the case, fueling or charging your motorcycle is only going to get more expensive, it would appear.

<u>RUSSIAN ATTACK ON UKRAINE CAUSING POTHOLES</u> <u>IN THE U.K.</u>

Hostilities between Russia and Ukraine is being touted as the reason for much of the financial troubles in the world today, and the British Local Government Association (LGA) is now claiming that the Russian led invasion is preventing pothole repair work as costs increase.

So aside from other more obvious wartime aftereffects, like higher gas prices and utility bills, the war between Russia and Ukraine is apparently being felt in even more wide-reaching areas. One of the areas that are being reported to have been hit hard by the conflict is road building and repair. The RAC in England reports that around 60% of the bitumen used to build new roads, and repair potholes, was bought from Russia. With trade embargos on the nation now in force, the cost of carrying out these repairs is said to have risen, with the LGA claiming a 22% increase.

A recent study by the LGA concluded that prior to

the Russian aggressions, the UK's pothole problems would have taken ten years to rectify, costing around £12 billion (\$13.5B US) in total.

FRENCH COMPANY TESTING PLANT-BASED ASPHALT

The worldwide movement towards a greener future of mobility doesn't stop with the vehicles, but also the roads we drive and ride on. Indeed, infrastructure plays an equally important role when it comes to sustainability, and this is something that many countries have overlooked in their efforts to go green, but not France, as it's now ready to test a new plant-based asphalt called Biophalt.

Currently, asphalt roadway surfaces are made primarily out of petroleum crude oil, a far cry from carbon neutral, so French company Eiffage has been working on an alternative to traditional asphalt since 2018, called Biophalt, that is said to offer the same benefits as asphalt while taking the crude oil out of the equation. The technology has so much potential, that in 2019, it was given an award by the Roads and Streets Innovation Committee of the Ministry of Ecological Transition.

Biophalt sets itself apart from traditional asphalt by making use of a vegetable binder instead of crude oil. Moreover, in terms of traffic volume, climatic resilience, traction, and durability, Biophalt has similar attributes to conventional asphalt. It is also applied at mild temperatures and has a reduced production temperature requirement, both of which provide energy savings. With all of this, Biophalt claims to have a carbon-neutral footprint.

Recently, the southwest French department of Haute-Garonne made the decision to test the Biophalt mix from Eiffage by resurfacing a mile-long section of road, in hopes that Biosphalt will soon set the entire road infrastructure on a new course.

<u>SELF-DRIVING CAR 'DRIVERS' GIVEN GREEN LIGHT</u> TO WATCH VIDEOS

As world governments move towards a full rollout of self-driving cars on the roads, one rule is being introduced in the United Kingdom to allow 'drivers' to watch videos while the vehicle is in motion! After a consultation on the matter, the U.K. government is now set to allow those in control of self-driving cars to watch videos while driving down the road.

The changes came when the government updated the highway code earlier this year. At the time, it was done to consider the new autonomous technology and incorporate it into the rules of the road, but this new rule could cause vulnerable road users to be put at risk. It concerns watching content that is not related to the vehicle (films, TV, music videos, social media, and emails) on the vehicle's built-in display screens built into the cockpit. These are generally used to change the settings of the car, relay information to the driver, or provide navigation assistance, though many can now be set to display videos via internal or external storage devices, with some being able to surf the Internet either through 5G or Wi-Fi.

The move will likely strike fear into the hearts of vulnerable road users, such as motorcyclists, as it's already been widely reported that many self-driving cars do miss "seeing" us in some circumstances. At this time, autonomous car manufacturers claim that the liability lies with the driver of the vehicle to spot the danger and take back control of the vehicle, so how badly is an operator's concentration and reaction time impacted by watching a movie, or playing a game?

BMW just announced AirConsole to allow owners to play both single- and multiplayer videogames from the comfort of the driver's seat to "make every waiting situation in the vehicle an entertaining experience."

<u>'WALKING DEAD' STAR JOINS 'THE BIKERIDERS'</u> CAST, JAX RETURNS FROM THE DEAD

For your Moto-tainment pleasure, Hollywood sources report that "The Walking Dead" star Norman Reedus has become the latest celebrity to join the cast of "The Bikeriders," a fictional film inspired by the photography of Danny Lyon and

his 1967 book of the same name, and follows the rise of a fictional Midwestern motorcycle club. Seen through the lives of the members, the club evolves over the course of the decade from a gathering place for local outsiders into a more 'sinister gang'.

The biker theme is fitting for Reedus, a longtime rider whose 'TWD' character Daryl Dixon is known for riding a motorcycle across the show's 11 seasons. The 53-year-old actor also hosts the travel series "Ride with Norman Reedus" as he hits the open road to explore biker culture.

In other 'Dead' News, Charlie Hunnam has reportedly hinted at resurrecting his Jax Teller character, who died in the final episode of "Sons of Anarchy," for a redux role.

MOTORCYCLE POKÉMON TO HELP GAMERS EXLPORE POKÉ-UNIVERSE

Two new Legendaries, Koraidon and Miraidon, are here to aid in your exploration of the newest games in the Pokémon franchise. In the 26 years since Pokémon was first released, it's gained a lot of fans around the world, and while pedal-powered bicycles have been a part of Poké-canon since the beginning, traditional motorcycles haven't been -- until now!

On November 18, 2022, Nintendo is set to release the two newest games in the franchise worldwide -- Pokémon Scarlet and Pokémon Violet -- on the Switch.
