



Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- · We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness
 of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote
 motorcycle safety and awareness.
- We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees; this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.

Some of the bills that we hope to have heard and passed into laws are "The Vulnerable Road Users" bill, the bill to get our safety money back, and a really important one to all of us, the profiling bill. We want to stop police from profiling motorcyclists. It's up to all of us to help ABATE have a louder voice in Tallahassee. We want all the legislators to know who ABATE is, that all us motorcyclists do care, and do vote, and that we are here to stay. Please remember when communicating with the legislators please be polite and courteous. You know, you get more flies with honey than you do vinegar, just sayin'.

Alrighty, next important subject, October 9th will be our 42nd Annual Event at Mickey's Tiki Bar in Pompano Beach. The party will start at noon and end at 5. We will have a live band, 50/50, great door prizes, and great food. Save the date, then grab your friends and come and help support the Southeast Chapter.

Please support all your American Legions and VFWs. God Bless America, the military, and the veterans who have helped keep this Country free.


2021 THROWBACK OUR VP, TROY, IS CURRENTLY ON THE MEND.





RIDE SMART FLORIDA - PART 2

Last month we discussed how, whenever you hear two people talking about the motorcycle laws in Florida and wonder, is that really what the law says? Well, there is a great web site by FDOT that has some really great information. Go to ridesmartflorida.com and click the tab on Laws and Policies. It's a great resource for learning about the motorcycle laws in Florida so you don't have to go by hearsay anymore.

Here are just a few more examples found on this very informative website:

REQUIRED TAGS

Tag required on exterior rear **316.605(1)**: Every vehicle, at all times while driven, stopped, or parked upon any highways, roads, or streets of this state, shall be licensed in the name of the owner thereof in accordance with the laws of this state.

Tag must be permanently attached not capable of being flipped 316.2085(3): The license tag of a motorcycle or moped must be permanently affixed to the vehicle and remain clearly visible from the rear at all times. Any deliberate act to conceal or obscure the legibility of the license tag of a motorcycle is prohibited. The license tag of a motorcycle or moped may be affixed horizontally to the ground so that the numbers and letters read from left to right.

Tag light required-white **316.410(2)**: Either a taillamp or a separate lamp shall be so constructed and placed as to illuminate with a white light the rear registration plate and render it clearly legible from a distance of 50 feet to the rear. Any taillamp or taillamps, together with any separate lamp or lamps for illuminating the rear registration plate, shall be so wired as to be lighted whenever the headlamps or auxiliary driving lamps are lighted.

MOTORCYCLE ENDORSEMENT


Are you required to have a motorcycle endorsement to ride in Florida? Yes, motorcycle endorsements are required 322.03(4): A person may not operate a motorcycle unless he or she holds a driver license that authorizes such operation, subject to the appropriate restrictions and endorsements. A person may operate an autocycle, as defined in s. 316.003, without a motorcycle endorsement.

Take some time and go to the website. No matter how long you have been riding I'm sure you will still learn a little something and then you would not just be relying on hearsay.

We were sitting around, talking about some people we know with cool road names, wondering where some of them got those names. Sheila and Sandy don't have road names. Little Bit and Thunder got their road names from Johnny Rose. Johnny said that Laurel was just a "little bit" of trouble, so that name stuck, and she is a little bit of trouble, but the good kind. When we all first met Dawne, we were at Café 27 and she had just joined our Chapter. She took some membership applications around at Café 27, and in less than an hour, she had 20 new members and Johnny called her Thunder for that. We have a lot of members with road names, like Abby Normal, Bear, Big Wheel, Books, Bubba, Bull, Call Girl, Dreamer, Hunter, Jimbo, Nighthawk, Old Hippy, OB, Pixie, Pygar, Rush, Sparkles, Teddy Bear, and Wavy, just to name a few, and sorry to the many I left out, not intentional. We don't know where most of them got their road names, but I'm sure they would share if we asked. We thought it would be interesting to write about others.

The easiest definition of road name is to say it's a nickname. Usually, they're given after an event or incident and have meaning to not only the person now known by that road name, but also to the rest of the community. Sometimes a road name becomes more your identity than your birth name.

Some road names are a reflection of who you are and what you portray or stand for. A good road name doesn't just sound cool, it tells a story. Many are personal and are unique to that biker. Many are funny, which can be a great conversation starter! Road names are usually short and simple so fellow bikers will remember it. No matter what, make it worth remembering

Here are a few interesting ones from the world of motorsports:

*Einstein – Miguel Oliveira, a Tech 3 KTM rider, got this name because of his tongue-out celebration following his victories

*Educate, don't legislate stuff we thought you might like to know

*Kleenex – Max Biaggi, a four-time 250cc world champion, got this nick name from a competitor, but we don't think he likes it. He liked to call himself the Roman Emperor and sometimes he had two guys dressed as Roman centurions standing outside the back of his pit to make the point. When he graduated to the 500cc class he clashed with reigning 500cc king Mick Doohan. Doohan said "Max loves himself too much. He thinks too much about his appearance. He's more of a product than a person – he's plastic. He just comes up with excuses and lies. And he cries so much he should be sponsored by Kleenex." Haha


*Careless Chucker – Carlos Checa, another 500cc rider, was young, fast, dedicated and extremely brave. He hated to crash, but when he did, he would limp back to pit lane, climb aboard his spare bike and immediately go even faster. Everyone in pit lane called him 'Careless Chucker'. Checa was never ashamed to talk about crashing and how it affected him, physically and mentally. MOTORCYCLIST KILLED BY SELF-DRIVING CAR

"A motorcyclist was killed on I-15 in Draper, Utah when a Tesla crashed into the back of the bike," reported Fox13 News in Salt Lake City on July 24, adding that "the driver of the Tesla said he had the 'auto-pilot' setting on...he told police he didn't see the motorcyclist."

"Wow, and even in a driverless vehicle, the 'I didn't see the motorcyclist' gets a rider killed," commented NCOM Board Member Ed Schetter, who recently presented a "We Just Want Our Place on the Road" seminar at the National Coalition of Motorcyclists' NCOM Convention in Nashville that examined the inevitability of driverless cars, relating the impact on motorcycling.

"Such an incident stresses our need to protect our space on the road, as I pointed out in my presentation," said Schetter, a veteran of the auto industry and Executive Director of ABATE of Ohio. "I wonder who the biker's family gets to sue? The Driver? Tesla? The Software Company? Sometimes you just shake your head."

<u>UN SET TO ALLOW INCREASED SPEED FOR</u> AUTONOMOUS VEHICLES

The United Nations (UN) is set to allow for an increase in speed for the operation of self-driving vehicles, as well as new tests focused on how well they can detect motorcycles.

Until now, the speed limit for the autonomous driving of vehicles has been 60kph (@37mph), but that is now set to increase to 130kph (80.7mph) thanks to an amendment to UN Regulation No. 157 adopted by the UNECE's World Forum for Harmonisation of Vehicle Regulations. The amendment also allows for autonomous lane changes, and is set to be implemented from January 2023.

The regulation also states, according to the Federation of European Motorcyclists' Associations (FEMA), that "all tests that need to be conducted for a system like ALKS (Automated Lane Keeping System) or LCP (Lane Change Procedure), have to be carried out with a passenger car target as well as a powered two-wheeler target."

This means that, although the autonomous technology is able to operate at a higher rate of speed, the safety for bikers when approaching an autonomous vehicle should now be improved upon, because their ability to detect motorcycles should (hopefully) be improved.

HONDA DEVELOPING LANE ASSISTANCE SYSTEM FOR THE BIKES OF THE FUTURE Recent patent filings from Honda for camera- and radar-enabled lane assist for motorcycles across its roster would keep their bikes in-lane via AI.

"Lane assist" is a commonality now in modern cars, but not so common in motorcycles, as electronic aids which detract from the actual riding of the motorcycle for the person holding the handle-bars are generally avoided by the manufacturers, who do not want to lose their core enthusiasts, which is also why autonomous technology has not advanced far in the two-wheeled world, especially compared to the much larger automobile market and tech-hungry car culture.

Honda is developing their lane-keeping assist system (LKAS) with the aim of making accidents a thing of the past, but if they are to reach their goal of slashing car and motorcycle deaths by half in the next eight years and bring the number down

to zero by 2050, we can expect to see a massive influx of rider-assistance systems like this in the very near future.

The plan combines driver assistance tech with a predictive AI computer system that can spot situations which lead to driving errors before they happen, and is intended to be introduced in the second half of this decade.

Further ahead, the intention is to introduce "Safe and Sound Network Technology" that allows cars, bikes, roadside furniture and even pedestrians (via their phones) to communicate, allowing a server to create a virtual model of traffic movement to predict and prevent accidents before they even start to unfold. The system is scheduled to be phased in from the 2030s.

THE UK WANTS TO BAN THE SALE OF NEW FOSSIL FUELED MOTORCYCLES

The government of the United Kingdom has launched an open consultation, called "L-category vehicles: ending sales of new non-zero emission models," in which they announce a sales ban for new non-zero emission motorcycles from 2035: "It is important that motorcycles do not remain fossil fueled as the rest of the transport fleet cleans up," states Trudy Harrison MP, Minister of State for Transport.

'L-category' vehicles include 2- and 3-wheeled mopeds, motorcycles, trikes, sidecar-equipped motorbikes, and quadricycles, and in the consult the government clearly states: "While cars and vans vastly outnumber motorcycles on UK roads, motorcycles are an important and sizeable vehicle population, with 1.3 million currently licensed in 2021. We do not want to see them remaining fossil-fueled as the rest of our vehicles clean up."

The British government has already committed to phasing out new cars and vans that run solely on petrol or diesel by 2030, and all new non-zero emission road vehicles by 2040.

Jim Freeman, Chairman of the British Motorcyclists Federation (BMF) said: "The BMF will oppose any proposals to ban the use of motorcycles powered by internal combustion engines while such vehicles are still capable of being run. We also oppose a ban on the sale of new internal combustion engine-powered motorcycles while there is the possibility of providing alternatives to fossil fuel and while the electric vehicle charging infrastructure does not adequately support electric motorcycles."

JURY ACQUITS TRUCKER CHARGED WITH SEVEN-COUNT MOTORCYCLE HOMICIDE

On the morning of June 21, 2019, truck-driver Volodymyr Zhukovskyy admitted to driving under the influence of fentanyl, heroin and cocaine before crashing his 2016 Dodge Ram 2500 Tradesman crew-cab pickup into a pack of Marine Corps veterans riding their motorcycles near Randolph, New Hampshire, killing seven members of the Jarheads Motorcycle Club.

Prosecutors argued that Zhukovskyy, who had previous DUI convictions and should have had his license suspended, repeatedly swerved back and forth before the collision and told police he caused it. But the judge dismissed eight charges related to whether he was impaired, based on a contested blood test, and his defense attorneys blamed the lead biker for causing the accident, claiming that "he was drunk and not looking where he was going when he lost control of his motorcycle and slid in front of Zhukovskyy's truck."

Following a 2-week trial, jurors deliberated for less than three hours before finding Zhukovskyy, 26, innocent on seven counts of manslaughter, seven counts of negligent homicide and one count of reckless conduct, setting him free after being held in custody since the accident.

This high-profile case has garnered staggering coverage across the country, and the surprising verdict has been soundly criticized by many, including New Hampshire Governor Chris Sununu

(R) who said he shares in the "shock, outrage, and anger that so many have expressed" since the crash. "The Fallen Seven did not receive justice today, and that is an absolute tragedy," Gov. Sununu stated.

New Hampshire Attorney General John Formella said he believes the state proved its case. "Mr. Zhukovskyy should have been found guilty of the charges in this case and held responsible for causing seven deaths and numerous injuries," he said. "We thank the Court and the jurors for their service, and while we are extremely disappointed, we respect the verdict and our system of justice."

<u>PETITION CALLS FOR PROPER PUNISHMENT FOR</u> BIKE THIEVES

A petition has been launched on the Change. org website calling for tougher sentences for bike thieves. The petition was started by British biker, Xander James from Hull, U.K., and has already amassed thousands of signatures -- enough to draw attention of local news.

"As we know, motorcycle & vehicle theft is the highest it's ever been, this is partly due to the minimal sentences from the Crown Prosecution Service," explains James on his petition to the U.K. Parliament and Scotland Yard. "We need change. We can't safely park our vehicles outside our own homes anymore! But with the Crown Prosecution Service handing out cautions & early release they keep doing it."

Along with tougher sentencing, James wants to see Operation Yellowfin receive more support from the Government, a police operational initiative which was launched locally in 2018 to tackle motorcycle crime and anti-social behavior.

<u>STURGIS TRAFFIC DOWN, BUT STILL HIGHER THAN</u> AVERAGE

The good news is; the Department of Transportation counted over half a million vehicles entering Sturgis, South Dakota during the 82nd annual Black Hills Motorcycle Rally week, but the bad

news; that's down 4.4% from last year.

The city of Sturgis estimated the 2021 attendance at 555,000. Although down from 2021, the 2022 total vehicle count is still higher than the five-year average of 492,535.

Sturgis City Manager Daniel Ainslie told the Black Hills Pioneer that 2021 was far better than expected because people had been in lockdown during the pandemic and just wanted to get out and travel. "It was a significant Rally last year. It was actually the largest Rally we had other than the 75th for more than a decade," he said. "Given that last year was such a large Rally, it's not unexpected that numbers are down."

Some worried initially that gas prices -- which hovered near \$5 a gallon mid-summer -- might have deterred people from attending this year's Rally, but according to Ainslie; "With a lot of individuals that come here, no matter what, they're going to be coming. But, I think they are being a little more careful with what they are spending."

BONNEVILLE MOTORCYCLE SPEED TRIALS CANCELED DUE TO FLOODING

On August 13, 2022, the Bonneville Motorcycle Speed Trials organizers officially announced that the 2022 event is canceled. This year's speed trials had originally been scheduled to take place from August 28 through September 1, 2022, but due to flooding on the Bonneville Salt Flats, the BMST, FIM Land Speed World Records, and AMA Land Speed Grand Championship is officially canceled for 2022.

Heavy storm systems brought flooding to the salt flats, and when organizers did an aerial assessment of the state of the standard track area on August 12, they found that "the entire length of our tracks and beyond are flooded," and noted that "Although the area is drying, it is unfortunately not drying quickly enough for the event to take place."

GWRRA CALLS IT QUITS

Putting down their kickstand for good, the Gold Wing Road Riders Association (GWRRA) is waving farewell after 45 years of meeting the nicest people, and ceased operations following this year's Wing Ding 43 in Shreveport, Louisiana at the end of July.

Founded in 1977 with the motto, "Friends for Fun, Safety and Knowledge," the GWRRA called itself, "the world's largest single-marque social organization for owners of Honda Gold Wing/Valkyrie motorcycles" that once boasted nearly 80,000 members across 53 countries, with 800-plus chapters staffed by 4,000 volunteer leaders.

GWRRA Founders Paul Hildebrand and Shirley Stevens-Garcia made good on the '60s era ad slogan "You meet the nicest people on a Honda" by creating a non-profit, non-religious, non-political organization "that advocated for rider education and safety, motorist awareness, and leadership training."

Next year's 38th annual NCOM Convention is now scheduled for Father's Day weekend, June 16-18, 2023 in Phoenix, Arizona, so plan ahead to join with hundreds of like-minded bikers' rights activists from across the country for a weekend of learning, sharing and camaraderie!

"TRUCK DRIVER IN HORRIFIC"

Connecticut about two months earlier.

Connecticut officials alerted the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles, but Zhukovkskyy's license wasn't suspended due to a backlog in out-of-state notifications about driving offenses. In a review, federal investigators found similar backlog problems in Rhode Island, New Hampshire and at least six other jurisdictions.

The motorcyclists who died were from New Hampshire, Massachusetts and Rhode Island and ranged in age from 42 to 62. They were part of a larger group that had just left a motel along U.S. Route 2 in Randolph.

Killed were Mazza, of Lee, New Hampshire; Edward and Jo-Ann Corr, a couple from Lakeville, Massachusetts; Michael Ferazzi, of Contoocook, New Hampshire; Desma Oakes, of Concord, New Hampshire; Daniel Pereira, of Riverside, Rhode Island; and Aaron Perry, of Farmington, New Hampshire.

FRUSTRATING NEWS FOR MOTORCYCLISTS

In the last few weeks two national stories related to motorcyclists have been in the headlines. Last week a jury in New Hampshire acquitted a truck driver accused of killing seven motorcyclists in 2019. The Boston Globe reported, "The verdict was at odds with findings from the National Transportation Safety Board, which concluded in 2020 that the driver's drug use was the probable cause of his initiating the collision."

THE STORY OUT OF NEW HAMPSHIRE COMES ON THE HEELS OF NEWS FROM CALIFORNIA AND UTAH IN WHICH TWO DIFFERENT TESLAS, ALLEGEDLY OPERATING ON AUTOPILOT, KILLED MOTORCYCLISTS IN EACH STATE. IN RESPONSE, THE NATIONAL HIGHWAY SAFETY ADMINISTRATION (NHTSA) SENT INVESTIGATIVE TEAMS TO THE TWO CRASHES LAST MONTH.

These two stories, less than one month apart, are very disturbing. The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) has long advocated for accountability from individuals and manufacturers when their actions result in the loss of a motorcyclist's life. The MRF remains committed to defending the rights and safety of our nation's 10 million bikers. We will monitor the finding from NHTSA and remain vigilant in Washington, D.C. on behalf of all bikers. Remember, if we don't stand up to protect our rights and safety no one will!

TRUCK DRIVER IN HORRIFIC 2019 NEW HAMP-SHIRE CRASH ACQUITTED IN DEATHS OF 7 MO-TORCYCLISTS

CONCORD, N.H. – A jury on Tuesday acquitted a commercial truck driver of causing the deaths of seven motorcyclists in a horrific head-on collision in northern New Hampshire that exposed fatal flaws in the processing of license revocations across states.

Volodymyr Zhukovskyy, 26, of West Springfield, Massachusetts, was found innocent on seven counts of manslaughter, seven counts of negligent homicide and one count of reckless conduct in connection with the June 21, 2019, crash in Randolph. Jailed since the crash, he appeared to wipe away tears as the verdict was read and

briefly raised his index finger skyward before leaving the courtroom.

Jurors deliberated for less than three hours after a two-week trial during which prosecutors argued that Zhukovskyy, who had taken heroin, fentanyl and cocaine that day, repeatedly swerved back and forth before the head-on crash and told police he caused it. But a judge dismissed eight charges related to whether he was impaired, and his attorneys blamed the lead biker, Albert "Woody" Mazza, who was among those killed.

In closing statements Tuesday morning, the two sides raised questions about who was more "all over the place": the trucker accused of swerving back and forth across the road or the eyewitnesses accused of contradicting each other.

"There is no doubt that this accident was a tragedy," said defense attorney Jay Duguay said. "But we are not here to decide whether or not this was a tragedy."

Duguay said Mazza was drunk and not looking where he was going when he lost control of his motorcycle and slid in front of Zhukovskyy's truck. He also accused prosecutors of ignoring that their own accident reconstruction unit contradicted their theory that Zhukovskyy crossed into the oncoming lane. An expert hired by the defense, meanwhile, testified that the crash happened on the center line of the road and would have occurred even if the truck was in the middle of its lane because Mazza's motorcycle was heading in that direction.

Volodymyr Zhukovskyy looks back at the gallery before closing statements started at his trial at Coos County Superior Court in Lancaster, N.H., on Tuesday, Aug. 9, 2022. Zhukovskyy, 26, of West Springfield, Mass., faces negligent homicide, manslaughter and reckless conduct charges in connection with the June 21, 2019, crash that killed seven members of a Marine motorcycle club.

"From the beginning of this investigation, the state had made up their mind about what had happened, evidence be damned," said Duguay, who also highlighted inconsistencies between witness accounts or when witnesses contradicted themselves.

"Those witnesses were all over the place about what they recalled and what they claimed to have seen," he said.

In particular, Duguay suggested that members of the Jarheads Motorcycle Club "shaded" their accounts to protect Mazza and the club. Prosecutor Scott Chase acknowledged some inconsistencies, but asked jurors to remember the circumstances.

"People were covering the dead, trying to save the barely living, comforting the dying. This wasn't story time," he said. "They were up here talking about some of the most unimaginable chaos, trauma, death and carnage that we can even imagine three years later. They were talking about hell broke open."

Witnesses were consistent, he argued, in describing the truck as weaving back and forth before the crash. That behavior continued "until he killed people," Chase said.

"That's what stopped him. It's not that he made some responsible decision to start paying attention or do the right thing," he said. "The only thing that stopped him was an embankment after he tore through a group of motorcycles."

Chase called the attempt to blame Mazza a "fanciful story" and "frivolous distraction," while reminding jurors of that Zhukovskyy, who didn't testify at trial, told investigators "Obviously, I caused the crash."

"He was crystal clear from the very beginning that he caused this crash," Chase said. "That is what he said, because that is what happened."

Zhukovskyy's commercial driving license should have been revoked in Massachusetts at the time of the crash because of a drunken driving arrest in Continued on page 47


