Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- · We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote motorcycle safety and awareness.
- We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees; this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.

SOUTHEAST CHAPTER MEETING MINUTES HELD AT AMERICAN LEGION POST 142 171 SW 2ND ST POMPANO BEACH FL, 33060 DECEMBER 15th, 2024

Kris "That Guy" called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m., there were 21 members and guests present. This was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and prayer, led by Barry "Bear" Crown.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT - LOUIS "OB":

OB began by welcoming the various groups represented at the meeting, Baptized Riders, LAMA, Widows Sons, our newest ABATE Life Member and Clive and Tony from the Dania Beach Vintage Motorcycle Show. Details regarding ABATE providing parking support at the vintage motorcycle show and our booth was discussed. Tony and Clive provided both promotional cards posters and cards for distribution.

OB then handed the floor over to Keesha who attended the meeting today to request participation in drive-by motorcycle parade to celebrate a friend's birthday. Details were discussed and some individual members in attendance indicated they would be interested in attending the event, details were to be discussed after the meeting. A big thanks was then given to both Nighthawk and the Baptized Riders for their help with The Toys in the Sun Run. He then talked about the upcoming Southeast Chapter's semi-annual event being held at Boston Johnny's and the memorial planned for our brother Dan "Slo Motion" Henderson, VP of the Palm Beach Chapter, at the event.

Finally, details for chapter's Christmas party were discussed. The event will be held at American Legion Post 321, addition details will be provided. Thank you to T-man for his generous donation towards the event.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT - JOHNNY ROSE:

Johnny was very happy to show to group the 26-year pin he received at the recent State meeting. He also let the group know how proud he is of all the great work everyone is doing, especially OB in his new role as President and Sheila as Treasurer. He then let us know that BACA could not attend today due to a conflict, and then spoke about the importance of their cause and his support for BACA.

SECRETARY'S REPORT - ROSS "ROSCOE":

He made a motion to approve the minutes, as printed in the November 2024 newsletter, seconded, and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT - SHEILA ROSE:

Sheila reviewed the Treasurer's Report for the checking and savings account, which was seconded, and approved.

<u>SERGEANT AT ARMS REPORT –</u> KRIS "THAT GUY":

Kris talked about the tourists on the road and the holiday season. Be careful out there and check your tires. It's cooling off, your tire pressure will drop. He then gave the floor to our former Sgt. Nighthawk. Watch for the flashing lights and slow down. Last week alone three kids were hit. Dade county has cameras on their buses, slow down. You will have to go to court and explain why you're a dumb#ss. The kids are not paying attention, you need to. Kris then encouraged everyone to attend the upcoming antique motorcycle show and how much he always looks forward to seeing those bikes from the early 1900s and how last year he saw the first motorcycle he rode, a KZ250.

ROAD CAPTAIN'S REPORT:

OB let us know that we are currently looking for a new Road Captain. We are looking for someone interested in getting out there talking to people and actively looking for things in which we our membership can participate.

Kris "That Guy" provided the Road Captain's Report today and reviewed the upcoming events:

He then talked about the Freedom Ride coming up in April and how there are two things in this world that drive legislation, money and people. We might not always have the most money, so let's show them we have the people.

SAFETY DIRECTOR'S REPORT - BRUCE "POET":

Poet started by thanking the entire group for a great six-months. He is really looking forward the next six. He informed us all that ABATE will be set up at Alligator Alley Harley-Davidson on December 20th for their Jingle Bell Rock Bike Night from 6:00-9:00PM and again during their Backstage Party, December 31st from 12:00-3:00PM.

STATE REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT - JOHNNY ROSE & LOUIS "OB":

OB stated that during the State Meeting it was discussed how some chapters are struggling and as a result, we are being asked to vote on whether next year's training seminars should be held via Zoom or in person. The chapter voted 12-7 to continue providing training seminars in person. However, the chapter requested that the State Representatives to request that all training sessions be

set-up in a hybrid format, allowing for both on-site attendance and attendance via Zoom or a similar service for those who are unable to attend for whatever reason.

<u>LEGISLATIVE LIAISON & LEGAL COUNSEL –</u> <u>BRAD WINSTON:</u>

Brad informed us that currently no bills are proposed or sponsored that affect the interests of ABATE. He then went on to speak about the Violations Against Vulnerable Road Users law and how mandatory minimums are not the answer and how in his experience, it does not a deterrent for negligence, or occurrences that are accidental. Mandatory minimums limit the courts discretion to determine each case based on the individual circumstances of the case. He then went on to discuss civil restitution with the group and how it can be used to the greater benefit for this type of legislation. The chapter thanks him for the well-received discussion.

PRODUCTS REPORT - AMY "PIXIE":

Pixie told us there are both t-shirts, including the totalitarian enactments shirts, and patches available to any who need them. Additional products are currently ordered.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT - SHEILA ROSE:

Sheila let the group know that SE Chapter was recognized at the recent State Meeting for the most new members in August, September and October of this year. She then read the membership report and let the group know that we are closer than we've ever been to reaching 800 members. Almost!

EVENTS COORDINATOR - GABE CARRERA:

Gabe was excused.

NEWSLETTER EDITOR – ADA HIBBS:

Ada spoke about how it was Slo-Mo who first encouraged her to learn to ride a motorcycle and to join ABATE. Slo-Mo will be sorely missed.

Howdy Brothers and Sisters and

Happy New Year! It's 2025, WooHooo!

New beginnings are important and every year is a new opportunity to live life to the fullest and ride, ride, ride!

New Years makes me think cold thoughts! I know you're all thinking "what is he on about now, we live in South Florida"! We basically have two seasons here... Hot and Wet; sometimes both at the same time. Of course, we always get those few days of really biting cold and wind.

Most of us, me included, usually ride in a T-shirt sometimes long sleeve, jeans, boots and my vest. For most of the year that's perfectly acceptable biker attire. When the temperatures drop into the 70s and below, it presents unique problems for us.

I'm sure most of you have seen this chart, but let me lay it on you again. As you can see, even at a very comfortable 75, at speed, it feels like 65. It's real easy to get sick riding in that without properly dressing for it!

A ROAD CAPTAIN REPORT

In March of 1977, ABATE, with the help of the staff at Easyriders magazine, held a state coordinators meeting in Daytona Florida. It was decided that as a matter of policy, ABATE Nationwide, as a lobbying organization, would discourage back patches on cut-offs. This was decided as necessary in order to not be misjudged as a club, either by outlaw groups, police, or Joe citizen. At this meeting, it was also decided that it was about time that ABATE got organized with a charter, bylaws, etc. Nominations were held, and five State Coordinators were elected as a steering committee to take ideas from all the members and chapters and boil the results down to a charter and bylaws.

A meeting was set up for Labor Day and the second national ABATE get together. At this meeting a proposal for a new national ABATE was presented by the people from Easyriders. In this proposal was the establishment of a five-member board of directors. A problem arose when it was learned that none of the board would be made up of any of the state coordinators or any ABATE people, but would be composed of people from California, led by Ron Roliff of the M.M.A. This intimidated a lot of hard working ABATE

people. Also, none of the recommendations of the ABATE steering committee were considered. The ABATE chapters were told that the Sacramento group was not going to change its name (National ABATE) and was going to go on doing business as usual. It was decided that the D.C. based national that was formed by the state organizations should be dissolved, thus doing away with a lot of the hassles taking up everybody's time, and that the states should get back to doing the business they were formed to do - fight state anti-motorcycle legislation.

ABATE formed five regions in the country, each region having about 10 states. Each region has a Regional Coordinator who coordinates information between the state ABATE organizations. Each ABATE state organization is now Independent and on its own. Because of all the hassles of trying to form a national organization, the trust and funds needed, the probability of another attempt at forming a national ABATE is most unlikely. In the meantime, ABATE people all over the country are taking care of business as always, and no matter what happens, they will be there taking care of business.

May the Lord's hand be on you today and every day this year!




CONCLUSION: MORE THAN JUST MOTORCYCLES

Ne rap against riding a motorcycle in South Florida is the limited number of fun day trips. We recently rode over to Chocoloskee for lunch. It was an awesome day! Chocoloskee is a quaint fishing town bordering on the 10,000 Islands in Eastern Collier County. A perfect distance of just over 100 miles. 

THE ART OF STAYING ALIVE ON TWO WHEELS

Let's be honest: motorcycles are dangerous. That's part of why we love them. The thrill of leaning into a corner, the wind rushing past, the raw connection between machine and road — it's intoxicating. But here's the thing: you can't enjoy any of it if you're dead.

I've been around motorcycles long enough to know that surviving on two wheels isn't about luck. It's about strategy, skill, and sometimes, swallowing your pride.

First, let's talk about the obvious: gear. Yes, it's hot in summer. Yes, that leather jacket costs more than your first bike. And yes, you look like a Power Ranger in full gear. Wear it anyway. Road rash isn't a badge of honor — it's just poor planning. Modern gear is a marvel of engineering, with CE-rated armor, abrasion-resistant materials, and comfort features that make all-weather riding possible. The minimum? A DOT-approved helmet, jacket, gloves, long pants, and over-the-ankle boots. Every single ride.

But gear is just your last line of defense. The real art of motorcycle safety happens between your ears. The best riders develop a sixth sense for danger, scanning constantly for threats. That SUV drifting slightly in its lane? The driver's probably texting. That patch of shade under the trees? Could be hiding gravel or wet leaves. You need to ride like you're invisible because, to most drivers, you are.

Speaking of visibility, position yourself where others can see you. The left third of your lane is usually best — it puts you in drivers' line of sight and gives you escape routes. And please, for the love of everything holy, stay out of blind spots. They're called blind spots for a reason.

Now, about speed. Here's where I might ruffle some feathers: going fast isn't impressive. Anyone can twist a throttle. The truly skilled riders know when to slow down. That sweeping corner might look perfect, but what if there's gravel mid-turn?

That straight stretch might beg for full throttle, but what about the hidden driveway? Speed should match conditions, not ego.

Maintenance isn't sexy, but it's crucial. Tires are your only connection to the road — treat them accordingly. Check pressure weekly, inspect tread regularly, and replace them before they're completely worn. That clicking sound you've been ignoring? Fix it now, before it becomes a problem at 70 mph.

Perhaps the most overlooked aspect of motorcycle safety is mental state. Angry? Tired? Stressed? Leave the bike parked. Motorcycles demand focus, and emotional baggage is dangerous excess weight. The old saying "ride your own ride" isn't just about pace — it's about knowing when not to ride at all.

Finally, never stop learning. Take advanced riding courses. Practice emergency maneuvers in empty parking lots. Read about riding techniques. The best riders know they're never done improving. Remember: the goal isn't just to survive — it's to ride tomorrow, next week, and for years to come. The road will always be there, waiting for those wise enough to respect it. Ride safe, ride smart, and keep the rubber side down.

ELARTE DE MANTENERSE VIVO SOBRE DOS RUEDAS

Seamos honestos: las motocicletas son peligrosas. Eso es parte de por qué las amamos. La emoción de inclinarse en una esquina, el viento que pasa rápidamente, la cruda conexión entre la máquina y la carretera: es embriagador. Pero aquí está la cuestión: no puedes disfrutar nada si estás muerto.

He estado rodeado de motocicletas el tiempo suficiente para saber que sobrevivir sobre dos ruedas no es cuestión de suerte. Se trata de estrategia, habilidad y, a veces, tragarse el orgullo. Primero, hablemos de lo obvio: el equipo. Sí, hace calor en verano. Sí, esa chaqueta de cuero cuesta más que tu primera bicicleta. Y sí, pareces un Power Ranger en plena marcha. Úselo de todos modos. Los accidentes en la carretera no son una medalla de honor, es simplemente una mala planificación. El equipo moderno es una maravilla de la ingeniería, con armadura con certificación CE, materiales resistentes a la abrasión v características de comodidad que hacen posible la conducción en cualquier clima. ¿El mínimo? Un casco, chaqueta, guantes, pantalones largos y botas sobre los tobillos aprobados por el DOT en cada viaje.

Pero el equipo es solo tu última línea de defensa. El verdadero arte de la seguridad en motocicleta ocurre entre tus oídos. Los mejores ciclistas desarrollan un sexto sentido del peligro, explorando constantemente en busca de amenazas. ¿Ese SUV se desvía ligeramente en su carril? Probablemente el conductor esté enviando mensajes de texto. ¿Ese parche de sombra bajo los árboles? Podría estar escondiendo grava u hojas mojadas. Tienes que conducir como si fueras invisible porque, para la mayoría de los conductores, lo eres.

Hablando de visibilidad, ubícate donde otros puedan verte. El tercio izquierdo de su carril suele ser mejor: lo coloca en la línea de visión de los conductores y le brinda rutas de escape. Y por favor, por el amor de todo lo santo, manténganse alejados de los puntos ciegos. Por algo se llaman puntos ciegos.



Ahora, sobre la velocidad.

Aquí es donde podría irritar algunas plumas: ir rápido no es impresionante. Cualquiera puede girar el acelerador. Los ciclistas verdaderamente expertos saben cuándo reducir la velocidad. Esa curva amplia puede parecer perfecta, pero ¿qué pasa si hay grava a mitad de la curva? Ese tramo recto podría requerir acelerar a fondo, pero ¿qué pasa con el camino de entrada oculto? La velocidad debe coincidir con las condiciones, no con el ego.

El mantenimiento no es sexy, pero es crucial. Los neumáticos son su única conexión con la carretera; trátelos como corresponde. Verifique la presión semanalmente, inspeccione la banda de rodamiento con regularidad y reemplácela antes de que esté completamente desgastada. ¿Ese sonido de clic que has estado ignorando? Arréglelo ahora, antes de que se convierta en un problema a 70 mph.

Quizás el aspecto que más se pasa por alto en la seguridad de las motocicletas es el estado mental. ¿Enojado? ¿Cansado? ¿Estresado? Deja la bicicleta estacionada. Las motocicletas exigen concentración y el equipaje emocional es un exceso de peso peligroso. El viejo dicho "monta tu propio vehículo" no se trata sólo de ritmo: se trata de saber cuándo no montar en absoluto.

Por último, nunca dejes de aprender. Toma cursos avanzados de equitación. Practica maniobras de emergencia en estacionamientos vacíos. Lea sobre técnicas de conducción. Los mejores ciclistas saben que nunca dejan de mejorar.




