

Did you know that Daytona Bike week was started on January 24th, 1937, with an inaugural Daytona 200

race. It was a beach and pavement course, 3.2 miles long. The race was won by Ed Kretz on an Indian motorcycle, with a top speed of 73 miles an hour. I think the idea for the race started with the cars, who started the year before, racing on the beach and the pavement.

And that's what put Daytona on the map. The first time I went to Daytona Bike Week was in the late 90s. It was a different time. I remember you could get away with an open container. And the girls were allowed to flash...well, maybe not allowed to, but they didn't get harassed like they do now. Heck, you could even get away with a burn-out here or there, ya know.

Those days are long gone. I wish you all could have experienced how cool it was back then. I do have to say, it is still a lot of fun, and you will make good memories. I had a lot of fun, helping in the ABATE safety booth and talking to a LOT of people.

So, here's a few facts about Daytona Bike Week. In 1998, there were about 300,000 bikers. This year there were about 500,000 bikers. Here are some of the statistics that I got online from the police department: 102 crashes, 30 that had injuries, and sadly 2 deadly motorcyclists crashes; 76 arrests; and 14 motorcycles stolen. So that was the bad part of Daytona Bike Week.

Please don't forget, on Monday, April 14th, we

will be having our 28th Annual Freedom Ride to the State Capitol. Please come out and help support ABATE. Remember, it is a numbers game in Tallahassee, for every member that we have, the congressmen know we have 4 or 5 friends that think just like we do. Help us get our voices heard, and let's make it safer out there for all of us to ride.

On Sunday, May 25th, Memorial Day weekend, we will be having our Memorial Day party at American Legion 36 in Fort Lauderdale . Please come out and help support us and the motorcycle community.

Please support all your American Legions and VFWs. God Bless America, the military, and the veterans who have helped keep this Country free.

And to the younger people out there, you have the chance to inherit an organization that stands up and fights for biker rights and safety. Help us make a difference, now, and for the future!

POET'S SAFE THINKINGS

Howdy Brothers and Sisters,

It's April, we made it! Spring is springing out all over the place and then there's the Sun and overpowering heat!

Let's face it, we live in Florida! Even in the best of situations, it's hard to find that "golden" season when you can ride comfortably. My bet is that this is it!

got to thinking about the Sun and how it affects us bikers. Most of us wear lighter clothing in response to the heat. Good, but please no bikini or speedo riding! There are sweat wicking riding clothes available on the market to keep you dry in the heat.

Side note: Sunscreen is not only necessary, it should be a given. Getting sunburned, especially on your face is "No bueno!"

I want to touch on sunglasses. The Sun is really strong here. For years I rode with only my regular prescription glasses, never realizing that it was a bad idea. Cataracts and other serious eye ailments have been proven to be directly linked or at least accelerated by the intense blue light here in ABATE of Florida SE Chapte the sun tropics

In my case I had to have surgery at a much younger age than I otherwise would have had to. Now I wear dark polarized sunglasses if it's light out. Helmet visors and goggles work great too.

Many of us have heat shields on our bikes. That's a piece of plastic or a Kevlar filled blanket type thingie that mounts under the seat between the motor and the driver's thighs. I've also seen little fans that cool the motor! Either way, WOW what a difference at those long traffic lights that seem to be everywhere in SoFlo!

Finally, as I've said many times, keep drinking water. Our bodies need it to keep functioning correctly!


Anyways, stay healthy and happy.

A ROAD CAPTAIN REPORT

Greetings, riders!

Spring is upon us, and in Florida, that means perfect riding weather—warm days, cool breezes, and some of the best scenery the Sunshine State has to offer. Motorcycling is about more than just the ride; it's about the friendships formed along the way. Group riding strengthens bonds and builds a sense of community. It's a good time to go over some of The Benefits of Group Riding. Whether it's a short cruise or a long-distance adventure, riding together enhances the experience.

Group rides are a lot more enjoyable with an experienced Road Captain. If you've never ridden in a group, make a point of staying close to the Road Captain rather than at the back of the pack. It's a lot easier to maintain speed and position. Also make sure to fill your tank and empty your bladder before the scheduled departure time.

Once underway, maintain the requested interval and lane position. Try to avoid drifting back and creating a big hole in the formation. If someone ahead suddenly wakes up to being in the wrong track and moves over, every following rider should immediately re-establish the proper staggered formation. Watch the RC for hand signals. When riders ahead give warning signs, pass the signal back down the line. If another rider has a problem and pulls over, stay with the group and keep rolling unless the RC also pulls over, or asks you to stop and help.

When the group pulls into a parking lot, follow the parking drill with everyone else. Don't ride up behind the next rider, but pull up alongside to the left, and immediately roll your machine back into the parking space. Avoid "creative" parking decisions on your own, which might result in a line of others following you and blocking tail-end riders still trying to get off the street.

Try It, You Might Like It

If you have been avoiding group rides like the plague, consider joining up once in a while as part of your skill improvement program. Maybe you will even discover some fellow enthusiasts with whom you enjoy riding. If you're new to group riding and feel unsafe on the ride - remember the importance of riding your own. Safely excuse yourself at the next turn and if none of the others measure up to your standards of group leadership, maybe you'll just have to be a Road Captain and show 'em how it's done.

With all this said, who is Jesus to you? Do you understand the power of His resurrection?


Have you asked Him to be the Lord of your life?







**EDUCATE, DON'T LEGISLATE - STUFF WE THOUGHT YOU MIGHT LIKE TO KNOW

We were sitting around talking about our upcoming ABATE of Florida 28th Annual Freedom Ride to the Florida State Capitol on Monday, April 14th. A lot of our members have put in for PTO at work, to take off that Monday and Tuesday, to join us as we go up to Tallahassee, to talk to our congressmen about what we are all about. Some of us are also lucky enough to have their own businesses or are retired, so it is easier to take a day off. Johnny, our Chapter VP, has been on this ride more than a dozen times, and he is excited to go again. He says you will never forget it. If any of you reading this, might want to go, but want more information, please reach out to Johnny, (954) 868-4390, and he will be happy to tell you all about it.

We also have a few Bills that we are interested in right now, HB 889, Driver License Education Requirements, specifying the age at which an applicant for a driver license must complete a traffic law and substance abuse education course: requiring an applicant for a learner's driver license to complete a certain driver education course approved by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, etc., (related Senate Bill SB 994) and HB 501, Hands-free Driving. Prohibits person from operating motor vehicle while using wireless communications device in handheld manner: provides exception; requires that sustained use of wireless communications device by person operating motor vehicle be conducted through handsfree accessory until such use is terminated; revises exceptions to prohibition; removes obsolete provisions; revises penalty provisions relating to use of wireless communications devices in handheld manner in certain circumstances (related Senate Bill SB 1318). Sheila is going, and it is her first time, even though she's been with the Chapter almost 10 years. It's just hard to take the time off from work, especially in April, as she is an accountant. While we were all talking about this, wondering what to say to a congressman, or even how to get our voices heard, at the State level and national level, a friend of ours shared this great article with us, with permission for anyone to copy and share.

"FOR THOSE OF YOU LOOKING TO TURN YOUR despair INTO ACTION, here's some advice from a high-level staffer for a Senator. There are two things that we should be doing all the time right now. You should NOT be bothering with online petitions or emailing.

- 1) The best thing you can do to be heard and get your congressperson to pay attention is to have face-to-face time if they have town halls, go to them. Go to their local offices. Try to find a way to go to an event of theirs. Go to the "mobile offices" that their staff hold periodically (all these times are located on each congressperson's website). When you go, ask questions. A lot of them. And push for answers. The louder and more vocal and present you can be at those the better. BUT BE RESPECTFUL!
- 2) But those in-person events don't happen every day. So, the absolute most important thing that people should be doing every day is calling. YOU SHOULD MAKE 6 CALLS A DAY: 2 each (state office and your local office) to your 2 Senators & your 1 Representative. The staffer was very clear that any sort of online contact ba-

sically gets immediately ignored. Calls are what all the congresspeople pay attention to. Every single day, the Senior Staff and the Senator get a report of the 3 most-called-about topics for that day at each of their offices (in the state and local offices), and exactly how many people said what about each of those topics. They're also sorted by zip code and area code. These calls can push a congressmen that is on the fence to vote with the majority of callers choices.

So, WHEN YOU CALL:

A) When calling the state office, ask for the Staff member in charge of whatever you're calling about ("Hi, I'd like to speak with the staffer in charge of Healthcare, please") — local offices won't always have specific ones, but they might. If you get transferred to that person, awesome. If you don't, that's ok — ask for that person's name, and then just keep talking to whoever answered the phone. Don't leave a message (unless the office doesn't pick up at all — then you can — but it's better to talk to the staffer who first answered than leave a message for the specific staffer in charge of your topic). Give them your zip code. They won't always ask for it, but make sure you give it to them, so they can mark it down. Extra points if you live in a zip code that traditionally votes for them, since they'll want to make sure they get/keep your vote.

- B) If you can make it personal, make it personal. "I voted for you in the last election and I'm worried/ happy/whatever" or "I'm a teacher, and I am upset by ——," or "as a single mother" or "as a white, middle-class woman," or whatever.
- C) Pick 1-2 specific things per day to focus on. Don't rattle off everything you're concerned about they're figuring out what 1-2 topics to mark you down for on their lists. So, focus on 1-2 per day. Ideally something that will be voted on/taken up in the next few days, but it doesn't really matter even if there's not a vote coming up in the next week, call anyway. It's important that they just keep getting calls.

- D) Be clear on what you want "I'm disappointed that the Senator..." or "I want to thank the Senator for their vote on... " or "I want the Senator to know that voting in _____ way is the wrong decision for our state because... " Don't leave any ambiguity.
- E) They may get to know your voice/get sick of you it doesn't matter. From experience since the election: If you hate being on the phone & feel awkward (which is a lot of people) don't worry about it there are a bunch of scripts (Indivisible has some, there are lots of others floating around these day). After a few days of calling, it starts to feel a lot more natural. Put the 6 numbers in your phone (all under P Politician.) An example is the senator sponsoring our Bill SB 994, Senator Jay Collins, put him in your phone as "Politician FL Senator Jay Collins", etc., which makes it really easy to click down the list each day.




CAPTAIN'S CORNER

"TROUBLE AHEAD.

Trouble behind. And that notion just crossed my mind". The Grateful Dead. Hard for me to imagine, but I am writing my second consecutive article on biker safety. Fifty percent of our riding experience lies ahead of us. But don't forget, fifty percent of our riding experience lies BEHIND US! How many times have you read about or possibly known a biker that was hit from behind at a traffic light or even on the open highway? What I call situational awareness covers a full 360°, everything ahead of us AND everything behind us. I want to say again that I am not in any way a nervous rider fixated on what is behind me. However, I periodically check my mirrors so I have knowledge of what is behind. This situational awareness saved my life in one instance. I was running about 75 mph on interstate 40 in North Carolina. Three lanes of traffic in my direction. Roadway straight . Terrain absolutely flat. Visibility perfect. There was an exit lane to my right that extended over 1/4 of a mile. Exiting traffic was backed up due construction at the exit. I was in the right lane and traffic was heavy. A car in the exit lane just slightly behind me was running about the same speed with no sign of slowing. He was completely oblivious to the backed up exiting traffic. My guess is that the driver must have been distracted maybe by his phone. I saw the impending disaster unfolding so I accelerated. The car smashed into the lineup at full speed almost exactly next to me. Pieces of fender flew up across my helmet. The car spun violently into the lane where I had been only a fraction of a second earlier. SITUATIONAL AWARENESS saved my life that day! Please stay aware of the other 50% of the ride.
