# **Covert Christianity**

Do you ever get really worked up or anxious when it comes to sharing your faith? Do you feel a sense of obligation or possibly stressed about publicly professing Christ? Do you feel you should act a certain way or live a certain way so that other people might believe in the Jesus that you do? What if there was a more subtle approach? A kinder, gentler way to live our lives—one not out of obligation; rather, with some level of spontaneity. I call it "Covert Christianity." What I mean by that is to live a kind of Christianity that is perhaps a little bit more subtle, purposeful, overflowing with the love and care of Jesus Christ that's not so bombastic when it comes to sharing your faith but rather "covert." My experience has been when people see your intentions it can change the results. It's the kind of Christianity that you can do all the time. You can live your life in such a way that they'll never see you coming (only Christ in you) and because of it you'll become much more effective as it relates to evangelism.

So if the Four Gospels of the New Testament reveal Christ, then the book of Acts is the unique contribution of telling us historically what people did with that message. We soon discover that the sheepish disciples of the Gospels are now in the book of Acts, endowed with increased levels of boldness which causes them to get in the same sort of trouble that Jesus got into during his earthly ministry. You can divide the book of Acts into two simple halves. The first half Peter is the main character. The second half the main character becomes the apostle Paul. Thus, it's both of these men and many others, who contribute to further growing what we now know is Christianity. It's this level of passion, which leads to many conversions, including what many characterize as the first Gentile conversion of the New Testament found in Acts chapter 16.

As we arrive at the text, we discover that Paul and his missionary associate, Silas, have been jailed because of their mission activities. They, and many others, have continued to spread the Gospel and have been met with much opposition. On this particular occasion, Paul and Silas find themselves shackled in a prison, singing hymns at midnight. It is my sincere belief that Paul and Silas did not go into that jail with a specific plan for outreach. They were simply living life and doing what would come naturally to them as followers of Jesus. They practiced what I would call a "covert" style of Christianity. Look how effective their witness was. They seem to be unaware that their impromptu worship service has drawn the attention of the other prisoners. Even in the midst of their bondage, they continue to be salt and light for Christ. Therefore, what happens next no one could anticipate. A great earthquake arises, and the very foundations of the prison are shaken. All of the doors spontaneously opened, and everybody's chains were unfastened. When the jailer comes after this has happened, he draws his short sword. All people in his position would've carried two different types of swords. He draws the shorter sword in a moment of suicidal panic because he knows full well that if all of these prisoners escape he will be killed by his superiors. Just at the moment of sheer chaos, Paul speaks and cries in a loud voice for him not to harm himself. This, too, becomes a missional moment as the jailer asks both Paul and Silas what he must do to be saved? Wouldn't it be great if we heard more people ask that question? If people, in the midst of their despair and hostility, would ask honest questions such as this? Please note, he is asking what he must accomplish for his own salvation, not realizing the length that Jesus had already gone to on the cross to ensure his rightful place in paradise. Paul seizes the opportunity by saying to him very simply, "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, you and your entire household." Verse 32 tells us of the impromptu sermon that Paul gives at that moment and then in this beautiful reciprocal picture we have the jailer washing the wounds of the prisoner, and the prisoners now baptizing the jailer. Just a footnote, there are many instances in the book of Acts where we are told that several members of the same family were baptized in a communal setting. Many scholars have taken this as one picture of the fact that infants were also baptized in these situations.

So, maybe it's time for us to be less intimidated when it comes to outreach. If our intentionality is one of the reasons why people feel manipulated as they're being evangelized, perhaps, the best approach is to be more subtle, or as I have argued here, more "covert." With a subtle, more whimsical approach a higher success rate of people coming to Christ can be wrought. May God bless you in your "covert" quest to share Christ with others.

These minutes were recorded at the last council meeting and will be approved at the next meeting.

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, April 2, 2025 in fellowship hall. Members present were Pastor Steve Walswick, Chad Coulter, Chad Beranek, Kari Halter, Deb Furth, Kris Vollmer, Janice Werner, John Smith, Steve Halter and Justtina Erickson.

President Coulter called the meeting to order at 7:35 PM and Pastor Steve led the group in prayer.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Chad B moved and Steve H seconded to approve the March minutes that were sent out to council members by Deb Furth prior to the meeting. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Kari reported the February checking balance of \$12,145.80 and savings balance of \$66,609.10. On a motion by Steve H. and seconded by Kris, the treasurer's report was approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Steve submitted a written report of his activities for March, which included 13 personal contact visits, 2 communion visits, 1 pastoral care visits, Worship and Music committee meeting, Lutheran Brethren Seminary in Fergus Falls where he preached in the Chapel, met with Pastor Cathy Hoffbeck to plan Holy Week, and conducted a VVM service. Pastor asked what we would consider his ending date at OSLC. Chad Beranek moved that we accept Pastor Steve Walswick's resignation effective May 18, 2025. John seconded and the motion passed.

**Committee Reports** 

<u>Education</u>: Justina reported that they will meet, Wednesday, April 9 when they will finalize plans for Vacation Bible School.

Worship and Music: Janice reported that we will have slide shows for Mother's and Father's Day. Pictures should be submitted for those occasions.

<u>Worship and Music continued:</u> It was also brought to our attention that Facebook will only save 4 weeks and then delete services. We need to decide whether to continue with Facebook or switch to something else. We will have Jodi Smith check with John Cowan, our IT person, to see how we might handle this.

<u>Life, Growth & Stewardship</u>: Kris reported Lenten meals are going well. Directory photos also went well with 106 appointments made. Those that are submitting photos have until May 1<sup>st</sup> to do so. \$320 in donations were made toward the directories.

<u>Property:</u> John reported that we are looking into the sliding curtain at the old school as a possible replacement for the curtain between the sanctuary and the overflow.

#### **Old Business:**

<u>Action Plan:</u> Due to Pastor Steve's resignation, council feels we are done with the action plan.

<u>Care Teams:</u> There will be a care team meeting after church on Sunday, April 6. This is open to anyone who would like to be a member of this group and do visits for our members who are shut-in or in need. Pastor wants to equip people on the teams especially over the summer, with some guides for visits and communion distribution.

Overflow Refresh update: The painting is almost complete and lighting is done. There a few things left for the electrician to do. New rugs have been ordered for the entryways. The committee will start decorating after Easter.

<u>Boiler</u>: Property committee received a quote from Lamberton Heating and Plumbing of \$25,384.95 that includes 2 boilers, warranties and installation. This doesn't include the electrical hook-up. Steve H moved to table the purchase of the boilers until next month. Janice seconded and the motion passed.

Membership: Kris moved to form a committee to look into our church membership. John seconded. Motion passed. A request will be put in the monthly newsletter and the bulletins for people to volunteer to be on a committee to contact and update our membership list. A sign up sheet will be posted on the church bulletin board by the church offices.

<u>Donation:</u> We have received an anonymous donation of \$5000 to be used for the overflow refresh, if not needed for the general fund. John moved to use the donation directly toward the overflow refresh. Chad B seconded. Motion passed.

Church Spring Cleaning: Deb moved and Kari seconded to have a church spring cleaning week from Friday, June 13 to Friday, June 20, 2025. Motion carried. We are looking for volunteers to sign up for cleaning tasks that will be posted at a later date, that cannot be done by our custodian. Tasks can be done at any time during that week. More information to follow as time gets closer.

<u>Luther League Lock-in April 5-6, 2025:</u> Kris moved and Janice seconded to approve a Luther League lock-in at the church for Saturday, April 5 to Sunday, April 6, 2025. Motion carried.

Search for a new Pastor: Council decided to contact Aaron Deutsch from the Augustana District to meet with us as soon as possible to give us quidelines on how to move forward with this task.




