President Coulter called the meeting to order at 7:02 PM and Pastor Tom led the group in prayer.

Secretary's Report: John moved to correct the motion from the September meeting pertaining to donating the endowment funds from "The Table Ministry" to "The Banquet". Chad B seconded. Motion carried. Steve moved to approve the minutes from September as corrected. Kari Seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Kari reported the September checking balance of \$10,324.09 and savings balance of \$61,703.98. On a motion by Kari and seconded by Steve H, the treasurer's report was approved.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Tom Sahl reported holding 6 confirmation classes and making 5 visits. He is working on making more visits. He will be attending the LCMC convention from Oct. 5-8, 2025 in Lakeville, MN.

## **Committee Reports:**

Education: Justtina reported that Prayer Partners will meet on Sunday, October 12, 2025 after the church service. The Sunday School students will also sing at the nursing home after Prayer Partners.

Worship and Music: Janice had no report.

<u>Life, Growth & Stewardship</u>: Kris reported that they served approximately 75 people on Rally Sunday.

Property: John reported that both Lamberton Heating and Plumbing and Anderson Electric have been at the church working on the boiler installation. Lefty Coulter has sprayed at the parsonage. Pastor Tom requested that the showerhead in the main floor bathroom be looked at in the parsonage. It seems to be leaking. Steve moved that the property committee check with Jess Bittner to install linoleum on the landing by the Southwest entrance to the church. Chad seconded. Motion carried. There is enough linoleum left from the southeast entrance landing.

Sunday School students will be singing during 9am church service on Sunday, November 16th.


## **Prayer Partners:**

## LCMC 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Gathering and Convention

## Our Help and Hope

"At this milestone anniversary gathering, we are looking back at God's help in ages past & claiming God's hope in the years to come."

## Report from Kris Vollmer

I attended the conference with Pastor Tom & Sandy and Deb Furth. We participated in worship ranging from contemporary music with a full band to a hymn sing with piano accompaniment. Each day began with Bible Study. There were meetings, keynote speakers, and breakout sessions. And we ate, a lot! This was the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of LCMC so there was cake, and Deb learned that I LOVE CAKE! We met new people, visited with old friends & I marveled at what started with 6 congregations 25 years ago and has bloomed to over 1000 in 2025, including almost 200 international congregations. Lamberton OSLC was one of the six founding churches, this I didn't know. Julie Smith, who was a pastor in Springfield and pulpit supply for OSLC several times was installed as the new Service Coordinator, overseeing the day-to-day operation of LCMC, communicating the vision & values of the association & equipping congregations.

Not having background in LCMC (I transferred from an ELCA church and did not receive any instruction as there was no pastor at the time) the conference was a sort of introduction for me to LCMC. My understanding of the "why" is so much more now and my curiosity and desire for more understanding has been piqued. Here are some of my key take aways.

## **Primacy of Congregations**

LCMC exists to support congregations; not to be a ruling body or something bigger LCMC lives in the congregation

Be good neighbors to one another

## Flat Structure

No hierarchy

Seek to equip and empower churches to do for themselves what is needed & carry out their mission

Accountability to one another

## What we've (LCMC) learned

Congregations could use a little help; in the early days avoided "interfering"; it is possible to be "responsive"; help them find the tools & to connect to others Need to be in relationship to one another to be accountable to one another; district can help

## **Youth Mission Trip**

#### REFORMATION

#### **Moments with Martin Luther**

In response to news that he was called to Rome in order to recant of his criticisms of the papacy and the abuses of the Church, Martin Luther wrote the first of three documents which expressed the major concerns of the nascent Reformation movement. In a treatise entitled "Address to the Nobility of the German Nation" (August, 1520), Luther sought to gain the attention of Emperor Charles V and other Christian nobles in the land by pointing out the three "walls" that insulated the Church and the Pope from taking seriously any reviews that would lead to reform.

The walls Luther spoke of were three tenets of the church that protected them punishment or the assessment of those who charged abuse. The Pope claimed: 1) Worldly power has no jurisdiction over the Church; 2) No one is permitted to admonish the Pope with the Scriptures because only the Pope can interpret the Word; 3) No one but the Pope had the authority to call a council therefore the Pope and the Church can never be questioned in public. Drawing on the biblical story of Joshua's victory at Jericho, Luther called on Christian leaders, saying, "Now may God help us, and give us one of those trumpets that overthrew the walls of Jericho, so that we may blow down these wallsof straw and paper."

Through Luther's writing to the Christian nobility he opened up a whole new perspective, saying, "All Christians are priests to one another," "All are to be concerned with the Word of God," "Christ is the head of the Church," and "If God spoke by an ass against a prophet, why should He not speak by a pious man against the Pope?" His words brought encouragement to common believers.

Because of privacy laws, a phone call from a family member or friend is the best way to make sure the pastor is notified if you or a loved one are hospitalized or in a nursing home or would like a pastoral visit.
