OUR SAVIOR'S LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES August 6, 2025

These minutes were recorded at the last council meeting and will be approved at the next meeting.

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, July 2, 2025 in fellowship hall.

Members present were Chad Coulter, Chad Beranek, Kari Halter, Deb Furth, Kris Vollmer, Janice Werner, John Smith, Steve Halter and Justtina Erickson.

President Coulter called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM and Deb led the group in prayer.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: John S moved and Steve H seconded to approve the June minutes as presented by Deb through an email.

Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Kari reported the June checking balance of \$12,730.35 and savings balance of \$61,657.34. On a motion by Chad B and seconded by Deb F, the treasurer's report was approved.

Committee Reports

<u>Care Team Visit report:</u> Care teams are making visits, with most being seen monthly.

Education: Justtina reported that members have been organized supplies in the designated area of the basement. They have a scheduled meeting on 8/20 to organize Sunday School.

Worship and Music: Janice had no report. John Cowan who works with our IT equipment was here to trouble shoot the video and installed updates. The black box has been replaced on 2 of the monitors and a 3rd is being ordered to have available for the one that has not been replaced yet.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: Directories have been delivered. Ice cream social was a huge success. Grateful to those who attended, helped &/or donated food. \$1603 in donations were received with expense of approximately \$400. This will be used toward the cleaning of church carpets. A potluck with burgers and hotdogs provided will be held on Rally Sunday.

Property: John has talked to REC about removing the pole in the parking lot as its only purpose is to feed the street lights. Updated landscaping of a tree & shrubs in the front of the church (with one more to be planted) as well as 2 shrubs in the courtyard were donated. Mulch (free) from the school was added to an area of the courtyard. Funding of the boiler has been completed (no further funds needed); no word yet on a date for install, John will talk to LPH. Landscaping at the church was cleaned up. Will spray for bugs soon.

Old Business:

Search for new pastor

Church services are covered August 17 and for the summer we will continue with services as we have now. Pastor Tom Sahl will provide pulpit supply on Aug 10th. A text will be sent to the group helping with services to fill in the remainder of Aug. Pastor Mark will be asked for a video sermon for the 31st as it's a holiday weekend and may be more difficult to cover.

<u>Call committee:</u> The call committee has sent the job description to the LCMC and it will be posted once verified acceptable. There have been 2 applicants, applications are open until Sept 15th, which will be extended as needed.

Interim and pulpit pastor requests

Letters of request have been sent out with limited response. Pastor Tom Sahl from Highmore SD will provide pulpit supply on Aug 10 and then visit with the council after the service about his interest in the interim position.

New Business

Pastor Tom Sahl Visit

Available council members will meet at the parsonage Friday, Aug 8 to do some touch up cleaning and make sure necessary supplies are available for his visit. Pastor Tom & his wife will arrive on Saturday beginning with a tour of the church followed by supper and visit with available members. Council members available will meet with Pastor Tom following the Sunday service to discuss his interest.

Council Meeting Minutes Continued

Carpet Cleaning

Holt's from Windom have been hired and will be here on Monday, Aug 18th. Furniture will need to be moved out as able. Large items can be left in place. Request in bulletin and announcements for help following services on Sunday, Aug 10 and 17th. Office can be moved out after Aug 14th.

Meeting with custodian

Deb met with Jodene & Holdan to discuss the list of items that need to be completed, weekly as well as over the summer. Windows in the fellowship hall need to be cleaned of bugs prior to carpet cleaning. Floors in the basement need to be waxed prior to the start of the Sunday school year.

LCMC Convention

Deb Furth and Kris Vollmer will attend with expenses paid by the church.

Fall Weddings

Request Nicole to reach out to the couples with fall weddings to make sure they have arrangements for a pastor; one for sure was meeting with Pastor Cathy. Pastor Carl has agreed to help out and Nicole can supply his number to the couples as needed.

Annual Meeting

Date is set for Sunday, January 25, 2026 following the worship service.

Copier proposal: A rep from Marco stopped with a new copier proposal as ours is getting old and parts are hard to find when it needs to be repaired. After discussion, it was determined to continue with the current copier and get some questions answered about when the contact is up and how much more they are going to charge to keep this one. There was information from one other company but more specifics are needed. This topic was tabled.

Inactive members

In 2019 letters were sent to members who were inactive stating that if they did not reply we would assume they are no longer interested in membership. However, at that time the council chose not to remove, rather to reach out again, but nothing further was done. The question has come up again about moving them to the former member list.

"Based upon our constitution all members contacted in 2019 who did not respond forfeited their inactive membership and will be moved to former member list." Motion made by Chad B, second by Steve H, all in favor, motion carried. Any member on this list who becomes active in the future can be moved back to the active list. This information can be found in the bylaws part 3, Section C Membership status. Council will also address communion cards at the annual meeting.







Overflow/Office Hall Refresh

Look for some changes, updates and new additions when we gather on Rally Sunday!

A seating area has been added to the overflow area. Use this for gathering at coffee, resting with your children when they need a break or just a place to relax & gather your thoughts.

A coffee bar is available. We will still offer pots of coffee and goodies following church services but coffee, tea & cocoa will be available at all times at this new area. See additional notes.

The hallways have been refreshed with new mirrors, changes to locations of bulletin boards and announcement/sign up areas. All décor may not be in place by rally Sunday but we hope you will notice and appreciate the changes that have happened.

Coffee Bar

We now have a place to officially call a coffee bar. This area will host Sunday morning coffee fellowship following services but will also be a permanent fixture with beverages available at all times. There are some "rules" that go along with this exciting update.

It is suggested that the Keurig be used by adults

Any beverage made with the Keurig should be in the provided cup with a lid secured

One of the options of the Keurig is a hot water dispenser; this allows us to provide tea bags & cocoa packets as new options

Flavored as well as regular coffee K-cups are available as well as flavored and plain creamer

When the water reservoir is empty the last person to use it should refill from the drinking fountain by the office. We want ONLY FILTERED water used in the Keurig.

K-cups, tea & cocoa cost more than a pot of coffee, so we are suggesting a donation of \$.50 to \$1 for coffee/coffee & creamer/tea/cocoa. There is a donation box on the coffee bar.

Additional supplies are stored with in the coffee bar.

Coffee will be will be allowed in the sanctuary during the services using the cups with lids on. A discussion was held with the church council and met with approval.

Food Shelf (WAFER)

In the past we have had boxes by the office to drop off items for the food shelf. As part of the refresh plan the boxes have been replaced with baskets under the entry table.

Only non-perishable items can be placed in these baskets. Please be mindful of expiration dates as items may not be delivered immediately.






