God's Design for Marriage

Over the last several months, we have been working on a policy as it relates to marriage here at Our Savior's. My contribution to this is multifaceted. It will include, but not be limited to, teaching on the subject, both in small group settings and from the pulpit. I would also like to offer an adult education class on marriage for anyone who may be interested after Easter.

Marriage is an incredibly important subject. It is the only ordinance that predates the Fall. What I mean by this is, it's the only mandate given by God to creation prior to Adam falling into sin in Genesis 3. This has been on the mind and heart of God since the inception of creation. The reality is, what do we do when our culture has such radically, different views about marriage than the Bible. Do we acquiesce to culture? Or do we stand on the Word of God? In my view, there is no question. Scripture is the only source for life and doctrine. It is the first word and the last word and every word in between on any given subject. A wedding is much more than a ceremony. It is a solemn pledge made before God and other witnesses, uniting two lives in a lifelong commitment to love and faithfulness. The role of the pastor is to assist couples in building a Christ-centered marriage and family. God gives specific instructions to those seeking his blessing in marriage. For this reason, the pastor must be convinced that God's blessing may properly be asked upon every marriage officiated in a church.

In preparing for a marriage, there are four essential commitments to make in order to have a Christ-centered marriage and family. Even if you have not made these commitments previously, now is a good time to get started. If you sincerely desire God's best for your marriage and chosen mate, then God will help you in keeping them. Subsequent classes can be scheduled with the pastor to help couples lay a foundation for a deeply satisfying relationship and marriage according to God's design.

1: A commitment to Jesus Christ—This means to trust Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior and to grow in the love and knowledge of Him through God's Word, prayer, worship and Christian Fellowship. Regular church attendance is expected by both those participating in the marriage.

2: A commitment to God's design for marriage—This commitment is to build your marriage on God's principles rather than on your own desires in order to become one in spirit, soul, and body (Genesis 2:18-24; Matthew 19:3-9). God's standards are often different from those of our society. The Bible gives clear principles on choosing whom to marry, how to prepare for marriage, and how a husband and wife are to relate to one another.

3: A commitment to strengthen and deepen your relationship—This takes time and effort. Time can be used for each of you to help understand the needs of each other and how to meet them, how to communicate effectively, and how to use conflict to strengthen your relationship instead of tearing it apart.

4: A commitment of Purity—This means sacrificing intimacy in your physical relationship in order to gain a deeper intimacy in your spiritual and personal relationship. You cannot properly prepare for a marriage when engaged in an intimate sexual relationship (1 Thessalonians 4:3-5,7). Couples living together without legal marriage are violating God's clear instructions (Ephesians 5:3) and need to make other arrangements during this period of engagement. This may seem unrealistic for many personal and financial reasons, but God's ways are always the best in spite of the cost.

This article does not give us the space to exhaustively research topics such as this; however, I believe this is a good starting point. My hope is that this can be used as a springboard into further prayerful contemplation on the subject. Please know that I am always available to discuss this and any other topic that is on your mind and heart.

OUR SAVIOR'S LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES February 5, 2025

These minutes were recorded at the last council meeting and will be approved at the next meeting.

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, February 5, 2025 in fellowship hall. Members present were Pastor Steve Walswick, Chad Coulter, Kari Halter, Deb Furth, Justina Erickson, Kris Vollmer, Janice Werner, John Smith and Chad Beranek. Absent: Steve Halter

President Coulter called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM and Pastor Steve led the group in prayer. President Coulter welcomed the new council members. All council members received copies of the updated constitution and the action plan for pastor and council.

Secretary's Report: Kari moved and Kris seconded to approve the minutes as corrected that were sent out to council members by Deb Furth prior to the meeting. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Kari reported the December checking balance of \$13,750.88 and savings balance of \$66,559.66. On a motion by Chad B and seconded by John, the treasurer's report was approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Steve submitted a written report of his activities for January, which included 14 personal contact visits, 3 communion visits, 3 pastoral care visits, Board of Ed meeting, Worship and Music committee meeting, 1 funeral, and several church and community events. Pastor will be taking vacation on Feb. 23 and will be gone to the confirmation retreat on March 2. Reverend Dave Nelson will be preaching on Feb. 23 and Mike Lohre will preach on March 2 with John Smith assisting with the service.

Committee Reports

Education: Justina reported that Savannah Engen has joined the board of education. Sunday School students will sing during services on February 9 and 23, followed by Prayer partners, followed with students singing at the nursing home.

Education continued

First communion for 5th graders is set for Sunday, April 6, with preparation of their chalices on March 30. Vacation Bible School is tentatively set for June 8-12, 2025. Confirmation interview day is set for April 2nd. The next Board of Ed meeting will be February 12 at 6PM.

Worship and Music: Janice reported that they met on January 29. They went through the baptism and confirmation services, comparing how we have done them in the past and the services in our LCMC hymn book. They decided and recommended that since we are LCMC and have new LCMC hymn books, we will use the services in our new hymn books. Council agreed. Loose Change Sunday will begin this Sunday, Feb. 9 and will be the 2nd Sunday of every month following. Acolytes will collect the loose change and money collected will be given to the mission of the month. This committee is also looking for new worship ideas. Their next meeting will be March 11, 2025 at 6PM.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: Kris reported they met on February 4. The amount available the mission endowment fund from 2024 is \$5390.32. Where that money will be directed was tabled while the committee gets some clarification on the intent of the endowment. Church directory sign up Sundays will be Feb. 16, Feb. 23 and March 2. Lenten meals will begin on Ash Wednesday, March 2. Donations above the expense of groceries will go to the overflow refresh. Kris encouraged anyone that could get a Thrivent card to help with the grocery expense for these meals, please consider doing so. The group decided to change the March mission giving to WAFER.

Property: John reported that the boiler needs a flame sensing probe to repair it. This will be taken care of and will continue to monitor what needs to be done moving forward. The ladies bathroom has been repaired.

Old Business:

Action Plan: A brief discussion was held regarding how the action plan was going.

Care Teams: Council decided that this project needed a “restart” as it has not really been activated over a lengthy time period. Congregations members will be asked to join this group. Pastor Steve will schedule a date for training the group in March.

Boiler: Property committee is working on solving the boiler problem and will bring more information to the next meeting.

OSLC personnel job descriptions and evaluations: A discussion was held regarding the job descriptions/guidelines for OSLC church secretary, caretaker and custodian. All need to be updated. After updates, the executive committee will meet with these employees to review and evaluate. March 4th was set as a date for these evaluations.

Overflow renovation: Kris reported that this group has met and she presented recommendations and quotes for painting and lighting and how to accomplish completing those tasks. Chad B moved to approve the plan as proposed by the committee and to request funds from trust out of the building fund. John seconded. Motion carried.

New Business

Luther League: A request was made by Kari Redman to add Misty Willhite (present Luther League advisor) on the Luther League checking account and remove Cheryl VanMeveren (no longer a Luther League advisor). After some discussion, John moved to add Misty Willhite and Mindi Hesse (both present LL advisors) on to the Luther League checking and saving accounts and to require 2 signatures on checks and transactions. Janice seconded. Motion carried.

Wedding request: A request was made by a OSLC member, Jenna Paplow, to have Pastor Mark Jamison perform her wedding ceremony in June of 2026. Kris moved to approve the request from Jenna Paplow to have Pastor Mark Jamison perform her wedding ceremony. Kari Halter seconded. Motion carried.

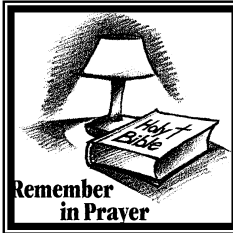
With no further business to conduct, Brian moved to adjourn and Kris seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned 8:40 PM
