Membership

The goal of any church is to grow. Growth is often qualified numerically, but it can and should also be qualified in terms of maturity. Embedded within this goal of most churches is to have casual attendees become members. The question is: what is a member? What constitutes Christian membership? Did you know that church membership is an authentically Christian idea? One of the greatest theologians in the last 150 years is a man named C.S. Lewis. He wrote an essay on membership. He reminds readers that membership is Christian-the concepts of believing and belonging are inextricably linked in the faith of Christianity. Unfortunately, the world has transformed the concept of church membership into a pattern of paying dues, meaningless rituals, silly handshakes, and the like. Perhaps it's helpful for us to have a simple, gentle reminder of what membership is in Christianity. The roots of membership are primarily based in saving faith in Christ. Specifically this means placing our faith in the correct object, which is Christ and him crucified for us. Thus, we no longer live but Christ lives in us (Galatians 2:20). If we have a correct understanding of who God is, and what Christ has done for us, placing our faith exclusively in that. Then the result is saving faith. The invitation of the New Testament for any believing Christian is to find a suitable congregation to be a part of, or in the language of the 12th chapter of Romans, to become a vital organ in a living body.

Becoming a member in a church also offers many other ancillary benefits. The protection and encouragement of a church environment in which one can foster and discover their spiritual gifts. A place where accountability is offered with the expectation that real growth will occur. Along with faith in Christ, we can be invited into a genuine understanding of the means by which God demonstrates his grace to us. Therefore, Baptism and the Lord's Supper become vital components in a fully ebbed picture of what a functioning member in any given congregation might look like. As members continue to assimilate into the greater mission of the church, they can grow in their understanding of why we as a church exist, what we are intended to do, and how we are invited to multiply.

Let us be encouraged by this beautiful picture of what membership in a church, or specifically our church, looks like; a wonderful friendship between God and us and then that friendship transitions among us as well. With that, I'm happy to announce the acceptance of new members into our fellowship: Gary and Penny Mattison; and Brad and Katie Girsh. We welcome them to our church family! May we continue to pray for our church that God will continue to grow us, lead us deeper in relationship with him, and continue to transform us from being strangers to friends as Ephesians 2:19 describes.

These minutes were recorded at the last council meeting and will be approved at the next meeting.

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, August 7, 2024 in fellowship hall. Members present were Kevin Graff, Deb Furth, Steve Halter, Chad Coulter, Kris Vollmer, Courtney Thram and Pastor Steve Walswick. Absent: Brian Benedict, Sharon Vollmer, and Kari Halter

President Halter called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM and Pastor Steve led the group in prayer.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: July minutes were read by Deb. Kevin moved and Courtney seconded to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: In the absence of Kari, Courtney reported the July checking balance of \$16,222.79 and savings balance of \$66,376.33. It was noted that the ending balance from last month does not match the beginning balance of this month due to the fact that the IRS payroll tax, AFLAC and Culligan were not entered last month. The adjustment was made. On a motion by Kris and seconded by Chad, the treasurer's report was approved.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Steve reported that he is changing the rotation of confirmation lessons so that confirmation students have a better basic background. Due to changing our rally day schedule this year, the September Sunday services will be as follows:

Sept. 1 – Regular church service

Sept. 8 – Ecumenical service in city park at 11 AM. No regular service at OSLC

Sept. 15 – Church at 10 AM. Rally Sunday w/communion and new piano dedication

Sept. 22 – Contemporary service

Courtney will check and adjust the acolyte schedule for the month.

Committee Reports

The committee will decide at their next meeting where this will be donated. Rally Sunday will be Sunday, September 15 with potluck following the service. This week's Bibles, Burgers and Brew will be held at the church with a praise and worship concert by Dave Anderson and Roger Walck entitled "The Rescue Tour."

<u>Property:</u> Mike Vollmer has talked to Al Wacker about checking out what needs to get done with the boiler. Steve will contact Brian Werner about changing the filter in the water fountain. If anyone has interest or would like the floor buffer from the church, please contact the church office.

Old Business

<u>Pew Bibles</u> – Donation stickers will be put inside the pew Bibles. Members who ordered Bibles for personal use will be contacted. The Bibles were about half the price as we thought, so those who ordered Bibles for personal use have the option of getting a return.

New Business

Wedding – A non-member has requested using our church for a wedding in May of 2025. Council approved the request after a discussion of our current wedding policy. Kevin moved that we follow the guidelines of the present wedding policy, with the addition that we update our policy to include a deposit upon the booking of the wedding, with a portion of the deposit being returned if the church is left in order after the wedding. Kris seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Vacation Day request</u> – Nicole has asked to have off on Tuesday, Sept. 3, 2024. Kris moved to allow the request and to close the church office for that day. Courtney seconded. We will ask Nicole to include the office closing in the bulletin and on the newsletter calendar.




So many months we have worried. Wondered. Doubted. Prayed. And then your check shows up. God knows. And is using YOU.




