With that realization, I accepted a call to serve Grace Lutheran Church in Erhard, Minnesota. This was truly not an easy decision. When I accepted the call to serve you as pastor here at Our Savior's, my intention was to embark on a long and fruitful ministry among you. Perhaps I had lofty expectations about what to expect and how things would go. Even though when I began, my assumption was that we were a really good fit, over time it has occurred to me that perhaps I am not the best candidate to be your servant leader. It is fair to say that the Church Council and I have struggled with issues relating to marriage and how the Bible is applied to one's life. For me, it is quite simple. The Word of God is our only source for all doctrine and conduct. It must serve as an authoritative foundation for all elements of life. If it's not the final word, it's no word at all. My fervent belief is that we must take the word of God in its totality or we can't take it at all. The Bible does not contain the Word of God. The Bible is the Word of God, and that Word is authoritative in all elements of life. It is authoritative in the verses that we like and the verses that we don't like.

My faith teaches me to be very optimistic about the future. I'd like to share some of that optimism with you. I think Our Savior's has an incredible opportunity for ministry. It is my belief that because of the unique and strategic way where God has placed you, you are in an incredibly powerful position to serve your neighbor in and around Redwood County. The Gospel is the eternal hope for all of humankind. As that life-giving Gospel message is shared with more and more people, the rule and reign of God continues to advance. It is this Gospel inundation of which I hope you continue to passionately pursue. "He who began a good work will perfect it until the day of Jesus Christ" Philippians 1:6. In you, God will continue to see his mission as it comes to fruition in the hearts and lives of countless people in whom you encounter. May God richly bless you now and forever. Amen

#### **OUR SAVIOR'S LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES** March 5, 2025

These minutes were recorded at the last council meeting and will be approved at the next meeting.

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, March 5, 2025 in fellowship hall. Members present were Pastor Steve Walswick, Chad Coulter, Kari Halter, Deb Furth, Kris Vollmer, Janice Werner, John Smith and Chad Beranek. Absent: Steve Halter and Justtina Erickson

President Coulter called the meeting to order at 7:54 PM and Pastor Steve led the group in prayer.

Secretary's Report: Corrections to secretary's report as printed in the March newsletter: Prayer partners will meet March 23, Ash Wednesday meals will begin March 5, and next council meting will be March 5. Chad B moved and Kari seconded to approve the minutes as corrected that were sent out to council members by Deb Furth prior to the meeting. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Kari reported the February checking balance of \$7,855.33 and savings balance of \$66,559.66. On a motion by John and seconded by Kris, the treasurer's report was approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Steve submitted a written report of his activities for February, which included 13 personal contact visits, 2 communion visits, 3 pastoral care visits, Board of Ed meeting, Life, Growth and Stewardship committee meeting, an LCMC Theological Conference, Confirmation retreat, meetings for Augustana District Certification, conducted a VVM service and attended a community event.

#### **Committee Reports**

Education: Justtina reported to President Coulter by text that March 23 will be the last prayer partner meeting and kids will sing in church; April 13 is Palm Sunday and kids will bring in palms at the beginning of church; 6<sup>th</sup> grade will have acolyte training during Sunday School to be able to acolyte during the summer; they are working on dates and coordinating with Pastor on presenting memory work;

and the last day of Sunday School will be May 11. Next Board of Ed. is Tuesday, April 9<sup>th</sup> at 6 PM.

Worship and Music: No report. Will be meeting on Tuesday, March 11.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: Kris reported that they started Lenten meals tonight (March 5) and they are working on the directory.

Property: John reported that they put an igniter on the boiler and are waiting for a quote on the boiler.

#### **Old Business:**

Action Plan: A brief discussion was held regarding how the action plan was going. Exec committee will meet with Pastor after Easter.

Care Teams: There will be a care team meeting after church on Sunday, April 6. This is open to anyone who would like to be a member of this group and do visits for our members who are shut-in or in need.

Boiler: A boiler igniter was installed.

OSLC personnel job descriptions and evaluations: The exec committee met with the church secretary. custodian and caretaker before the Lenten meal on March 5 to go over job descriptions and job tasks. Meetings went well. Council decided to hire help for the custodian as she is having trouble getting all the work done. Chad B moved to hire Holden Mariner as an assistant custodian at a rate of \$11.50/hour, upon his agreement to take the job. John seconded. Motion carried. All job descriptions will be kept on file in the church office and evaluations will take place annually moving forward.

Overflow renovation: This is a work in progress. Kris reported some of the confirmands and their mentors will be painting on Saturday, March 8.

Retreat/camp scholarships line-item on budget: Kris moved and Chad B seconded to make the retreat/camp scholarships a line item in the budget moving forward. Motion carried.

#### **New Business**

Membership: With the upcoming directory happening, a discussion was held about the different types of membership in our church and what determines each category as defined in our constitution. The discussion was tabled until our next meeting.

<u>Camperships:</u> Chad B moved to pay up to \$250/ child for summer Bible camps, not to exceed the total amount for this year. Janice seconded. Motion carried.

Red Rock Central testing: Kari moved to allow Red Rock Central to use our church for testing purposes on April 2 and 8, 2025. Kris seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Communion Assistants**

Congregation members are encouraged to sign up on the bulletin board outside the offices if they would like to assist with communion.
