🌶 God is Near

Perhaps you've had someone tell you during the course of your life that it is important to rejoice in God. Perhaps you've even read that in a verse from the fourth chapter of Philippians? Perhaps, the admission to rejoice, came to you through song...*Rejoice in the Lord always*. But how does one truly rejoice? How does someone rejoice in the midst of the travails of life?

A potentially powerful answer to this question can be found at the conclusion of Philippians. Like many of Paul's letters, he starts off in the first half of the letter with what would be called the doctrinal section. This is the teaching. The theology. The proclamation of the faith. Then, in the second half of the letter, is what might be deemed the application. The encouragement to live out the theology that has been taught. In other words, theology is always designed for doxology. That's a fancy way of saying that our theology is always designed to be used as an article of worship. With that, when Paul gets to the end of the letter to the churches in and around Philippi, his deep desire is for them to be a community that rejoices. Their spirit of rejoicing is predicated on their ability to recognize the nearness of God. The end of Philippians 4:5 simply reminds the reading audience that God is near. It becomes the centerpiece of the entire chapter. Our rejoicing in the Lord continually happens as a result of the nearness of God.

As verse five encourages us, our gentleness is possible because of the nearness of God. Verse six, which I think is of particular importance to contemporary Christians, speaks of not being anxious about anything. This is only possible in the context of a God who is near. As it reads, "...but in everything, by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your request be known to God." This is only possible because God is near enough to hear and answer our prayers. Finally, verse seven speaks of the peace of God which transcends all understanding. This transcendent peace, which is beyond our own comprehension, is again only possible because of the nearness of God.

As another Lenten journey reaches its culmination at the vacated tomb, let us be reminded of how close God is to us even in the midst of our own struggle with sin. God refuses to distance himself from us. He is truly the God who is near. The God who hears prayer. The God who gives us everlasting peace. Thanks be to God that we have a Savior who is so close.

"Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near." Philippians 4:5 NIV

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, March 6, 2024, in the library. Members present were Kevin Graff, Deb Furth, Sharon Vollmer, Steve Halter, Chad Coulter, Kari Halter, Brian Benedict, Kris Vollmer and Pastor Steve Walswick.

President Halter called the meeting to order at 7:40 PM (after Lenten service) and Pastor Steve led the group in prayer.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: February minutes were read by Deb. Chad moved and Sharon seconded to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Kari reported the January checking balance of \$31,501.55 and savings balance of \$66,145.69. On a motion by Kevin and seconded by Brian, the treasurer's report was approved.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Steve reported that the confirmation retreat went well and was well organized. Pastor requested some additional time off this summer due to family events. Pastor is willing to find replacements for needed Sundays and Council is willing to work with Pastor on this request.

Committee Reports

Education: In a brief report sent to President Halter, Courtney stated that they had not met, but wanted to extend a thank you to trust for the confirmation retreat money. The last Prayer Partner gathering will be on March 17 and then students will go sing at Valley View Manor. Youth will again carry palms at the beginning of Palm Sunday service. They will be meeting on March 19 to confirm confirmation plans.

Worship and Music: Sharon reported no meeting, but she had received some feedback on whether to pass the plate and a few things on worship services. They will meet April 28.

<u>Life, Growth & Stewardship</u>: Kris reported they will meet after Easter. Lenten meals have gone well. A donation of \$500 was made to 2nd Harvest Heartland as they were doing a match for funds in March.

<u>Property:</u> Brian reported some plumbing issues with the men's bathroom and still working on expansion tank issues with Lamberton Heating and Plumbing. A range burner and connection was repaired in the kitchen.

<u>Curtain/Divider Discussion</u>: Steve has found a second company to look at our curtain replacement. They seem a little more willing to work with us on this project. We will pursue this option.

<u>Pew Bibles:</u> Pastor recommended we order the ESV version for our pew Bibles. Kevin moved to order 150 ESV Bibles at a cost of approximately \$13-\$15/Bible. Brian seconded. Motion passed. Congregation members will also be allowed to order a Bible for themselves by filling out an order form and turning it in by April 15, 2024.

"Stewardship Sound Bites" BE A STEWARD – GOD'S WAY

"So Joseph found favor in his sight and became his personal servant, and he made him overseer over his house, and put him in charge of all that he owned." Genesis 39:4

The life of Joseph consists of the highest of highs and the lowest of lows:

From being thrown into a pit to die one day – to being raised to second-in-command in Egypt, the mightiest nation on earth, the next.

We can identify with Joseph in many respects because we all have highs and lows. Sadly, many of us tend to neglect the Lord when things are going well, only to return to Him when we are in crisis.

When we read the story of Joseph, after he was sold by his brothers to some traders, he ended up in the household of Potiphar, an Egyptian leader. Before long, Potiphar made Joseph "overseer of all his house and put him in charge of all he had" (Genesis. 39:4).

Now, when Potiphar put him in charge, Joseph begins to prosper. There is no indication that Joseph takes undue credit for anything, or that he uses his prosperity to further himself. On the contrary, he continued to oversee and **steward** all that God, through Potiphar, puts into his care.

A steward? What's that?

A steward is a manager of something or someone that does not belong to them.

Just as Joseph was, every single follower of Jesus is called to be a faithful steward, or manager, of all that He has entrusted to us.

And this goes way beyond simple management of our money. God has entrusted us with many things. As Christians, God has given us gifts, talents, and abilities that are meant to be used to bring Him glory, make disciples, and build up His church.

So, how are we doing?

Parents, God has entrusted us with children to raise and teach the truth of God's Word, modeling for them what it means to be a faithful disciple of Christ Jesus.

Stewardship Sounds Bites continued:

Or what about where we live? Are we inviting neighbors, opening our homes, and being hospitable, so we can share the love of Christ with them?

Undergirding all of this is the fact that being a steward implies that none of what you have is your own, 1 Corinthians 4:7 says, "What do you have that you did not receive? If then you received it, why do you boast as if you did not receive it?"

The skills, talents, and abilities you use were given to you by God.

Even the very next breath you take is provided by the King over all creation. How are you going to steward it?

When we take those things that the world deems will give us status and prestige – money, abilities, power and we steward them as Christ would have us steward them, it shows an unbelieving world the value of Christ, that He is our treasure.

Joseph showed us how to "steward" for the glory of God.

Will we do the same? For none other than the glory of God?

Let it be so, Lord.


New Pew Bibles


