Dear Congregation,

Nearly one and a half years ago, we took a congregation-wide survey asking to prioritize our ministry needs. Nearly tied for first place was this need: **to care for those crushed by life's circumstances**. That phrase came from the survey itself, not from our own wording, but it certainly struck a chord across our congregation as a deeply felt need. So, we have put in place some action items to address this need, and while the pandemic has curtailed some of the training involved, we are still committed to meeting this need as best we can.

I find it interesting that, as a congregation that really doesn't like to admit that we have "needs," let alone that life might be "crushing" us, that this was a high priority among us. Life truly can, and does, crush people, and we need each other more than ever when life presses in.

Now, here we are today, nearly six months into the Covid-19 pandemic, and while you might not be directly affected by an infection, the impact of the pandemic is felt by everyone each day. You might not feel "crushed" by Covid-19 (and I pray you never do), but we all are in the "vice grip" of the pandemic that keeps tightening day-after-day. We might have thought that, early on, we could alter our life for a few months; yet now things haven't changed and seem to be getting worse, and we don't know how long this will go on. Add in questions about how to open our schools for the next academic year, and the pressure increases.

As people of God, how should we then live? I am reminded of the words of scripture from 2 Corinthians 4: 8 *We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; 9 persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed.*

Hard pressed, but not crushed: that might well describe how you are feeling about now. But catch the context of these verses: 7 *But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us.... 10 We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. 11 For we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that his life may also be revealed in our mortal body.*

Jesus repeated calls for us to "take up our cross daily and follow him." The cross is not just a metaphor; back in the days of Jesus, everyone knew what a cross meant: death! The one who carried a cross was about to die. Do you, as a follower of Jesus Christ, look at how God might be calling you to "die" daily for the sake of Christ? Thankfully for us, this is more of a metaphor than physically dying, but "dying to ourselves" may feel like a death, yet this is what Jesus calls to us each day.

So, when you feel "hard pressed" due to Covid-19 or whatever else may be going on in your life, look for God's invitation to "die to self" that might be calling to you from within daily circumstances. And remember from where - better yet, from Whom - the power to do so comes: it is from God, the purpose of which is that life in Christ Jesus might be revealed in your day-to-day living. May God give you the faith and strength to follow Jesus this day and beyond.

COUNCIL MINUTES
July 1, 2020**

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on July 1, 2020 at 7:00 pm in Fellowship Hall, abiding by the social distancing guidelines. Members present were: Todd Horning, Cory Blomgren, Brian Kletscher, Sharon Vollmer, Chantel Neperman, Molly Werner, Jocelyn Geske, Brian Werner and Pastor Todd. Absent was Kris Vollmer.

President Horning called the meeting to order. Pastor Todd led the group in devotions and prayer.

Secretary's report – emailed to council. On a motion by Brian K, second by Chantel, the regular monthly minutes for June 2020 were approved. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report – Checking Balance \$23,1234.86. Savings Balance of \$24,279.10. The parking lot fund has a balance of \$41,288.15 at the present time. On a motion by Molly, second by Brian W, the report was approved.

Education: No meeting. The Council will review the Child Protection Policy at the July meeting.

Worship & Music: No meeting. The Media list has been updated. Molly reported that hymnals, etc have been removed from the pews. The church will follow all social distancing recommendations.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: No meeting.

Property: A new AC unit was installed in the parsonage. The team will be shingling the parsonage and garage in July. Brian W stated the Property team would welcome volunteer labor. Please call Brian at 507-822-0641 if you would be willing to help out!

Old Business: Discussion was again held on the Parking Lot project. The crew will begin pouring cement on July 7th. Volunteer labor is welcomed for the project as this is a huge undertaking. We are still accepting donations!

The Council again discussed and reviewed a media quote from Computer Lodge for a Dell tower, Stream record device and video equipment for the church in the amount of \$3,892.13 plus installation. On a motion by Sharon; second by Cory this project was approved. The Council feels this will upgrade our online presence as it may be some time before everyone feels comfortable back in the sanctuary and ministering to our congregation is our number one priority.

New Business: None

Communion Assistants: None needed.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Todd presented a written report of his monthly activities. He presided over two Baptisms in June and we welcomed 5 new members on June 7th. Meetings and special events during the month of June were: Church Council; preparation for drive in services; reopening task force; moved their son to St Paul; moved Anne and Pastor to Lamberton; travel to Vermont on personal business; held our first reopening service inside the sanctuary on June 28; home visit with a family.

Pastor Todd also noted that the weekly devotions live stream is going well. The hand sanitizing stations will be arriving in early July. The Council would like to thank Brian K and Todd H for the hand sanitizing liquid from Highwater Ethanol; as well as Todd H for the offering buckets and traffic cones for drive-in worship. Also to Steve Halter for coaching the ushers on their expanded Sunday duties.

Pastor Todd stated that he and Anne were so very grateful to the 10 people from OSLC who helped them move to Lamberton on June 12 and to those who helped them unload on June 22. Much appreciated!

With no further business to conduct, the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Chantel Neperman, second by Cory Blomgren.

The next Council Meeting will be held on August 5, 2020 at 7:00 pm.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

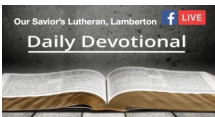

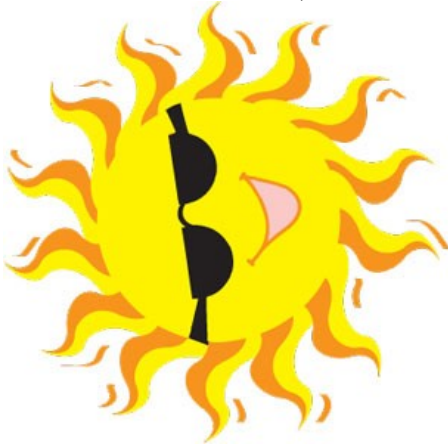

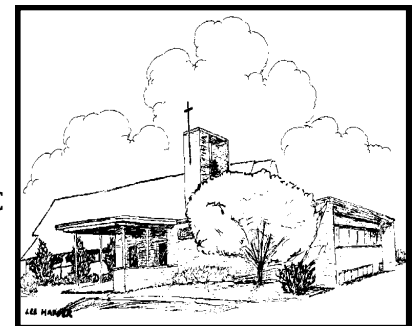
