"The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." Numbers 6: 24-26 NIV

January is often the time of resolution. The time to: lose weight, exercise more, spend more time with family/friends, spend less time at work, and the list goes on. January can also be a time for spiritual resolution. A time where we endeavor to read the Bible more, pray with more fervency, or serve in a new way.

Have you ever thought of what God's resolutions are as it pertains to you? The very first question in Luther's Small Catechism is: What are God's thoughts of you? The catechism answers this by simply saying that God's thoughts about us are thoughts of love and blessing. I suspect you know what the word love means, but what does the word blessing mean? John Calvin, the great 16th century reformer of the church, defined blessing as God's goodness in action. God's desire, or if you will, his resolution for you this year is that he wants to bless you in an ongoing fashion. The blessing is not simply contingent on your goodness, but rather it is contingent on his. For many of us, we have spent the vast majority of our lives hearing church services end with the benediction of Aaron recorded in the sixth chapter of Numbers verses 22 through 26. But have we ever considered those words, really thought about them?

The Lord says in verse 22 to Moses that this is how you are to bless the people by saying these words. You bless them by reminding them of what God has done. This is actually a prayer. A prayer that God will keep us—to protect us. In its original context, it meant the blessing of some 603,000 people as is recorded in Numbers 1:46. This truly is his ability to preserve our faith that we should be most thankful for. Verse 26 speaks of peace. The Lord will turn his very face towards us and give us peace. The Hebrew word for peace is shalom—which has rich, deep meaning. This is not just the peace between warring factions, or the peace that comes between governmental officials, but this is fundamentally the peace between God and man. The book of Romans chapter 8, verse 17 speaks of the end of this conflict between God and man. The reality is that Christ ended that conflict between God and us, "Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ," Romans 5:1. This sort of peace is what we can trust in now and always.

OUR SAVIOR'S LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES December 6, 2023

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, December 6, 2023 in fellowship hall. Members present were Kevin Graff, Deb Furth, Courtney Thram, Janice Werner, Steve Halter, Kari Halter, Brian Benedict, John Smith, Kurt Willhite, and Pastor Steve Walswick.

President Graff called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and Pastor Steve led the group in prayer.

Secretary's Report: November minutes were read by Deb. Correction to minutes indicates that the CEV version of the Bible is being used with our confirmation students, not the NIV. Kari moved and Courtney seconded to approve the minutes as corrected. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Kari reported the November checking balance of \$51,883.61 and savings balance of \$46,062.05. On a motion by Steve and seconded by John, the treasurer's report was approved. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Steve reported that he is working towards using the care giving team to assist with visits and administering communion to members of our congregation as needed. Pastor Steve questioned whether he should plan to attend the confirmation retreat with students and what had been done in the past. Council said if he would like to attend, he should. The discussion then went as to how to handle Sundays where Pastor Steve would be unavailable. Pastor Steve would help us find someone or congregation members would assist with services.

Committee Reports

Education: ESV study Bibles have been ordered for 7th graders for confirmation and will be the version being used in the future. The Christmas program will be Sunday, December 17, 2023 at 10:30 AM.

There will be no confirmation December 20 and 27. No Sunday School on December 24 and 31. Wendy Wondercheck will be the new chairperson for the Board of Education.

Worship and Music: Janice reported the Christmas Eve service will be at 5 PM with communion.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: Kurt reported that they met on Monday, Nov. 20th, 2023, with Pastor Steve present at the meeting. He looks forward to working with the care giving team on visits and for lay people to assist with communion for shut-ins. The committee is looking into options for the 2024 Mission Endowment and reports will be put in the newsletter. Coffee fellowship is going well. They will continue with soundbites in the newsletter. Rally Sunday went well. The 2024 -26 council rep and committee chair will be Kris Vollmer and Bridget Arkell will take over as missions' treasurer. Lenten meals will be kept the same as in prior years. Sent \$330 to the Salvation Army for October missions and \$1200 to Share the Spirit in November.

<u>Property:</u> Brian reported the office doors had arrived that day. A new water heater and faucets have been ordered. A window pane needs to be replaced in the parsonage garage.

One of the lights in the overflow area needs to be fixed. A new vacuum cleaner used for the church may need replacing soon.

<u>Curtain/Divider Discussion</u>: We need to proceed with this project. The problem is we can't find a company that can give us the size we feel we need and something that can keep the sound down between partitions. We continue to explore this problem.

Next council meeting: Wednesday, January 3, 2024


Adjournment: With no further business to conduct, John moved to adjourn and Kurt seconded. Motion carried. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.


ANNUAL MEETING




