The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, May 1, 2024 in fellowship hall. Members present were Kevin Graff, Deb Furth, Sharon Vollmer, Steve Halter, Chad Coulter, Kari Halter, Brian Benedict, Kris Vollmer, Courtney Thram and Pastor Steve Walswick. President Halter called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM and Pastor Steve led the group in prayer. Secretary's Report: April minutes were read by Deb. Kris moved and Chad seconded to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried. Treasurer's Report: Kari reported the April checking balance of \$29,195.23 and savings balance of \$66,260.91. On a motion by Sharon and seconded by Courtney, the treasurer's report was approved. Pastor's Report: Pastor Steve reported a good Augustana District Convention on April 27. One of the goals of the district is to try to make the district more cohesive. Pastor will keep us informed as plans become more concrete. Reminder that there is a convention in Marion, Iowa, September 29 -October 2, 2024, and OSLC members are encouraged to volunteer to be delegates. Confirmation Sunday is ready to go and plans are in place for baccalaureate. Pastor is encouraged to try to get care teams up and running. **Committee Reports** Education: Courtney reported that confirmation will be Sunday, May 5 at 10:00 AM. Practice and pictures were held today, May 1. Our last Sunday School session for this year is May 12. The 6<sup>th</sup> grade class will receive their acolyte training that day. A huge thank you was extended to the Women's Group for their donation to the camperships.

Also, a thank you to LGS committee for adding camperships as a mission donation. All the support is appreciated. Board of Ed. is actively seeking help for Bible School week. Bible School will run Sunday, June 9 to Thursday, June 13 with outside community students also invited to join us. There is a sign-up sheet on the office bulletin board.

Worship and Music: Sharon reported they met April 21. The HELO box has been replaced on the media system. There was discussion about a possible summer outdoor movie night, an ecumenical service and possibly a tractor service. Dedication of the new piano will be Sunday, May 19.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: Kris reported LGS committee met Sunday, April 7, after church. Lenten meals, headed up by Misty Willhite and Mindi Hesse, went very well and averaged 20 - 25people/week and 11-14 take outs for shut-ins. The committee is looking to possibly purchase a larger, more powerful microwave with money left over after expenses of the Lenten meals. Mission endowments of \$1300 and where that should go were discussed. Suggestions were to do more locally, use towards OSLC missions, or the local ministerium. This was tabled until there is more information and more committee input. Mission emphasis in May will be toward Bible camp scholarships. The committee encourages more people to serve and stay for coffee fellowship after church services on Sundays. The ice cream social is set for Wednesday, July 17, 2024.

Property: Brian reported the faucet and trap in the men's bathroom has been replaced. The courtyard needs some attention with plants and possibly paint. Kevin moved and Chad seconded to approve money to fix up the courtvard. Motion carried. Kevin. Steve H. and Deb did the lead pipe check at the church and parsonage required by the city. Discussion was held as to whether to replace the boiler system or replace parts that are needed right now, not knowing how long the repair would last. More information will be brought to the next council meeting.

## "Stewardship Sound Bites"

# THE SECRET TO STEWARDSHIP!

"Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Cor. 9:7 NIV84)

Stewardship is a tough thing for us Christians to grow into. It challenges us at the very line between faith and reason. God has created us to be logical creatures who can do math, and He has created us as spiritual beings who trust in His ability to do things beyond what our mind can comprehend. At this line between reason and faith, we need to know that God in His word always tells us that His word rules/wins. We are called to be obedient to His word even if that obedience doesn't make sense to our reason and logic. But, when it comes to my stewardship, I can't help but do the math. If I give a percentage of my time, talents, and treasures to the Lord, then the net result will be that I have less time, talents, and treasures to be used as I see fit. Whether I give an hour a week or \$100 a week, my mind tells me that I will have less time or money that week.

The problem with this train of thought is that it is a train of human thought. God works in a different scope of economy. God is never a one-for-one transactor. He is always quantumly transacting. He can sow 100 seeds and harvest from 150 plants. He can touch one life, and through that life touch millions. Our God can take our hour or our \$100 and bless us in such a way that we never miss it. Somehow He makes it all work out because that is what He promised to do.

So what's the secret to proper stewardship? Start with your heart, not your head. Paul says in our verse today, "Give what you decided in your heart to give." True stewardship is a faith thing, not a reason and logic thing. God calls us to move as our heart tells us to move and not as our logical minds might move. Second, he tells us "not to give reluctantly or under compulsion." We need to freely give in such a way that left hand doesn't want to pull out of the offering plate what the right hand just put in. We need to give as the Lord is moving us to give. It ought to be as freely given and God's grace is freely given to us. Last, Paul tells us to be "cheerful" givers. Stewardship should be an opportunity, not an obstacle. We ought to be giving God back some of the time, talents and treasures He has given us in a spirit of joy. We ought to be thankful that the Lord provides us the opportunity to thank Him in this awesome way.

May the secrets of stewardship move us to be cheerful givers!


