Dear friend,

If you have been following me on our Facebook page with the weekday Bible readings and reflections, I've been struck by how the Apostle Paul has such personal words of welcome and greeting to people receiving his

As your pastor, I encourage you to (re)connect with one another, even as school ends and summer begins. We continue to live stream our Sunday worship services, but it's nothing like

OUR SAVIOR'S LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES May 5, 2021

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on May 5th, 2021 in Fellowship Hall. Members present were: Cory Blomgren, Susan Jeckell, Kevin Juhnke, John Smith, Kris Vollmer, Janice Werner, Misty Willhite and Pastor Todd Mathison. Absent were Todd Horning and Chantel Neperman. President Blomgren called the meeting to order. Pastor Todd led the group in an opening devotion.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: April minutes were read by Susan. On a motion by Kevin, seconded by Kris, the regular monthly minutes for April 2021 were approved. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurers Report</u>: Reported checking balance \$37,184.25 and savings balance of \$29,287.23. On a motion by John, seconded by Kevin the report was approved. Motion carried.

<u>Education</u>: Misty reported on the upcoming First Communion for this year's 5th grade class, the last day of Sunday School and memory work certificates being awarded. VBS dates are set for June 6-10th.

Worship & Music: Announced the summer music team, Stone's Cry, will be visiting Our Savior's and the community July 17 & 18. Saturday performance will be an event in the park, Sunday's performance will be during regular OSLC worship services. The committee approved providing funds for rights to music used during services for the upcoming year at \$20 per song up to \$500. Julie Senst has donated a new funeral banner in memory of Stew Carlson.

<u>Life, Growth & Stewardship</u>: Flowers will once again be handed out to all mom's on Mother's Day. May's mission is the Ronald McDonald house.

<u>Property:</u> There has been a gas leak detected at the parsonage, a new furnace will be purchased and installed in the coming weeks.


Old Business: Continuing to work on an Auditing committee replacement. New church directories were tabled for the time being due to Lifetouch no longer being in business. After brief Confirmation Sunday discussion, John moved to ratify the approval for 7 confirmands. Kevin seconded it, motion passed.

New Business: The property committee will look into options and costs for the new partitions for Fellowship Hall. In-person communion will be discussed again in June, due to possible upcoming COVID19 restriction changes. Discussion was held on new Pew Bibles, Confirmation Bibles and congregational hymnals. Council will review different examples of scripture texts from various editions in the coming months.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Todd presented his Pastor's Report that included notables of Easter services, visits & phone calls, confirmation preparations and baccalaureate planning. He was also able to attend a worship service and visit with the LCMC Church Planter in Sioux Falls, and presented a recommendation to have the Church Planter speak at OSLC during a worship service this June. Kevin moved and Kris seconded, to have Pastor set up the guest speaker for the church, paying travel and speaking expenses. Motion passes. We all look forward to this special worship service!

With no further business to conduct, the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Misty, second by Kevin. The next Council Meeting will be June 2nd at 7:00pm. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.



We had an amazing school year with our Youth and we look forward to seeing everyone this summer and meeting the new members and saying goodbye to our blessed Seniors.






