I Was Just Thinking

Every so often I encounter a verse that I don't recall reading before in my life. A verse that is uniquely captivating. Recently I encountered Hebrews 11:35. It was interesting to me because of the verbiage that was used. It speaks of not casting aside your boldness so that you are able to receive a great reward. I was particularly interested in the words "boldness" and "reward". What is the boldness that the author of the book of Hebrews speaks of and what is the reward that is referred to? Subsequent questions arise: are we bold at one stage of life? Is it possible to be more shy, or less bold in other seasons of life? And then is it possible to grow in boldness as we grow in Christ?

J.B. Phillips in his commentary on the book of Hebrews says, "one of Satan's favorite tactics is to wear out the Saints of the Most High." Endurance, I believe, is becoming one of the most important attributes of the Christian life. This faith, once delivered to the Saints, which is now our possession, is the faith that I've had for the vast majority of my life. The struggle seems to be that as I continue to age, the same expectations are present. The same call to serve, to love, and to give never goes away. That high call of service remains throughout all of life. For me, the necessity is to endure. To be able to hold onto this faith and this willingness to serve even in difficult situations. John Bunyan's book, *The Pilgrim's Progress*, is a famous Christian fiction work. I was awestruck to find out that Bunyan wrote it while he was in prison. The rule of the day was that you were not allowed to preach if you were not ordained by a sanctioned church body. Bunyan, who was a lay person, did not heed that rule; therefore, he was thrown into prison. He chose to endure by his willingness to write one of the greatest works of literature the modern world has ever read.

My prayer for us as a congregation is that we will remain bold, steadfast, and confident in our confession. Not just because we ought to, but because we realize that the great reward spoken of in Hebrews 10:35 is Christ himself. In Genesis 15:1, Jesus says to Abraham that "He is my great reward." This is astonishing to me. The great reward of Hebrews, as well as Genesis, and many other citations of Scripture is that the reward is Christ himself! The greatest gift that God can give us is the gift of His Son, and His presence, which is exactly what we have in faith. That to me is what helps us to remain confident and bold. And yes, in Christ!

COUNCIL MINUTES
February 7, 2024**

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, February 7, 2024, in fellowship hall. Members present were Kevin Graff, Deb Furth, Courtney Thram, Sharon Vollmer, Steve Halter, Chad Coulter, Kari Halter, Brian Benedict, Kris Vollmer and Pastor Steve Walswick.

President Halter called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and Pastor Steve led the group in prayer.

Secretary's Report: January minutes were read by Deb. Kevin moved and Chad seconded to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Kari reported the January checking balance of \$34,802.02 and savings balance of \$66,145.69. On a motion by Sharon and seconded by Kris, the treasurer's report was approved.



Pastor's Report:

Pastor Steve has been approached by Trinity and Bethany Lutheran churches of Storden and Jeffers, to conduct a communion service for them sometime during Lent. Pastor Steve was open to that idea, and council felt if he could find a way to work that into his schedule, he should go ahead. Pastor Steve will be attending the Confirmation Retreat with our confirmation students from Mar 1 – 3, 2024. He has found Pastor Dave Nelson from Willmar to conduct our worship service on March 3. Pastor Steve stated that the Augustana conference he attended Feb. 4 - 6 was good.

Committee Reports

Education: Courtney reported they met January 29. Justina Erickson and Lexi Benedict are the new members of this group. Sunday School students will be singing in church on March 17 and Prayer Partners will follow after church that day. There are 10 students who have committed to attend the confirmation retreat in Vining, Minnesota at Inspiration Point from March 1-3, 2024.

Education Report continued

Jason Willhite has agreed to chaperone and they are looking for 1 more adult chaperone. Pastor Steve will also attend the retreat. The Trust committee will be asked to pay for students and chaperones to attend the retreat at a cost of \$125/person. Vacation Bible School dates are tentatively set for June 9-13, 2024.

Worship and Music: Sharon reported that they met on Sunday, February 4, 2024, following the worship service. Doreen Johnson is the new member on this committee. Orders will again be taken for flowers for Easter service to remember and honor loved ones. Meals before Lenten services will again take place this year. The question of whether to keep passing the collection plate during the service or placing boxes at the entrances to the sacristy for offering was discussed. Council had mixed feelings about this and would like more input from members of the congregation. Congregation members are asked to voice their opinions to council members or worship and music committee members on this matter. The quality of color on media streamed services is not clear and will be looked into. The committee also talked about some new ideas for summer and fall services. They would also like to see a return to the more traditional baptism service as in our older hymn books, especially the lighting of the Christ candle and music. The committee also stated they would like to see Bibles, Burgers and Brew services again this summer.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: Kris reported that this committee has not met since last fall. She also stated there will be meals before Lenten services. Kris mentioned that members who belong to Thrivent are able to request dollars toward projects and they encourage members to do that for church events such as Lenten meals.

Property: Brian reported the office doors are installed. Brian received a note about the wax buffer not being able to be used on the tile floors and to move it out of the custodial closet. There has been more problems with the boiler. There appears to be pin holes in the expansion tank and we might need a new expansion tank.

Property Report continued:

They are working with Lamberton Heating and Plumbing to correct the situation. The cost for a new expansion tank would be about \$1000. Kevin moved to go ahead and order a new expansion tank and have it installed, if that will correct the problem. Chad seconded. Motion passed.

Old Business

Curtain/Divider Discussion: Steve received 2 new quotes for the curtain separating the sanctuary and the overflow, ranging from \$8,855 to \$12,780. The two quotes for fellowship hall were \$149,787 and \$86,220. Steve thought the difference in numbers were how soundproof the curtains are. Steve will continue to contact this company to see if there is some place we could visit that has these curtains, to make sure this is what we are looking for, and to also to have a company rep come out here to do final measurements before we order from them.

Computers: Pastor and Nicole have received the new laptops and they are working well. Nicole will order a DVD/CD burner to go with her computer.

Old Church Records: As requested by some members, old church financial records, from back as far as 1987 and up to 2014 and no longer necessary, were examined and destroyed.
