

Dear Friend,

Fall is a most wonderful time of year! The harvest is gathered. The earth turns many shades of dazzling colors. School is (supposed to be) back in full swing. The holidays are before us. Yet, as this year has presented unanticipated and

unprecedented challenges, some find themselves more than anxious about the present, let alone the future. Because of the economic impact of COVID-19, many are hard-pressed by loss of work and income, unemployment, and housing insecurity. Students and teachers alike struggle with distance learning. We all may be experiencing what some experts call "Pandemic Fatigue", meaning that we are tired of the restrictions on our lives imposed by the reality of COVID-19. And then there are families whose lives have been decimated by the tragic loss of loved ones to COVID, let alone the myriad other causes of disease and death present year-after-year.

As Christians, what might the Bible have to say to us in these strange days? I am led to what the Apostle Paul wrote to the Christians in the city of Philippi, as they were being persecuted and faced daunting threats: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God" (Philippians 4:6). Pray. That is a powerful resource that is always available to you! But if you are like me, we often worry without praying, which leaves us anxious rather than at peace even in the midst of trouble.

I am struck in particular by two words in this verse, and this is apropos given this time of year: "with thanksgiving". Pray, yes, about everything, but do so "with thanksgiving." Do these words mark your prayer life? How is the state of your prayer life? Does it even exist, beyond quick requests of "Lord, help me!" I am not saying to "be thankful" for everything that happens to you; there is much that happens that is troubling and terrible. But, God invites you to pray about "everything," and to do so marked by a heart full of thanks, not necessarily for what occurs, but with a heart full of thanks to God, Who has promised His presence and peace, even in the valley of the shadow of death.

And what is the result of such prayers? The Scripture continues in verse 7: "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Now, I think we all could benefit from God guarding our hearts and minds by surrounding us with His peace. Isn't that what you desire? I do. So, join with me in saturating our prayers with expressions of thanks to God, and then look for His peace to be yours, through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

OUR SAVIOR'S LUTHERAN CHURCH **COUNCIL MINUTES** October 7, 2020

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on October 7, 2020 at 7:00 pm in Fellowship Hall, abiding by the social distancing guidelines. Members present were: Todd Horning, Cory Blomgren, Sharon Vollmer, Chantel Neperman, Jocelyn Geske, and Pastor Todd. Absent were Brian Kletscher, Brian Werner, Kris Vollmer and Char Graff.

President Horning called the meeting to order. Pastor Todd led the group in devotions and prayer.

Secretary's report - emailed to council. On a motion by Cory, second by Chantel, the regular monthly minutes for September 2020 were approved. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report - Checking Balance \$5,480.31. Savings Balance of \$24,279.10. The parking lot funds remaining from the Trust loan is \$14,504.84. The project needed \$140,000 to complete. Funds donated were \$80,000 and we secured a loan from the Trust account of \$20,000: funds still needed to complete the parking lot is \$40,000. Chantel reported the PPP Forgiveness Program is still in process; the Cares Act county program awarded OSLC \$10,000 to be used for projects. Bills need to be paid by the church first then reimbursed. These funds are available to us until November 16. On a motion by Sharon, second by Jocelyn, the report was approved.

Education: No meeting. Jocelyn reported Sunday School is going well.

Worship & Music: No meeting.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: No report.

Property: The monitors in the sanctuary are tripping the breakers. This issue will be looked into.

Old Business: The Child Protection Policy was approved by the council on a motion by Chantel; second by Cory. Red Rock Central had approached the council asking to use the parking lot for Phy Ed, etc if needed. The insurance company approves this request. SMSU has posted our Organist position for 3 Sundays per month. We will also place a local ad. The new video system should be ready for use November 1st. The council reviewed the motion and second regarding the Luther League Turkey Supper and was approved as presented.

New Business: The 2021 budget is in progress.

Pastor's Report - Pastor Todd presented a written report of his monthly activities. He made numerous visits and phone calls to members and the community. He was in attendance at Confirmation Classes, Board of Ed. Sunday School teacher training, Church Council and was on vacation September 24-29. Pastor then reported that our IT company stated we will need to purchase Vimeo Premium to host our live streams on the new system at a cost of \$900/ year. This request was approved on a motion by Sharon; second by Cory.

With no further business to conduct, the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Chantel, second by Jocelyn.

The next Council Meeting will be held on November 4, 2020 at 7:00 pm.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Sunday School Teachers Needed

With about 70 students in grades preK-9th grade getting to grow closer in their faith, our team of 11 fantastic volunteer teachers is not quite enough.

Open teaching spots include:

Grade 2 or 3 - We have a pair of teachers that will take one of these grades, so the new teacher(s) can choose. 2nd graders are learning Bible stories through sharing of stories (all from the teachers workbook). 3rd graders just received their new Children's bibles, so they dig into those each week to learn more about the characters in the Bible.

6 or 7 students

6th grade - This is a part-time position. These 8 students are learning about Bible stories from the New and Old Testament.

Substitutes -This is a great way to learn more about our students, work with a variety of ages, and learn a Bible story with them!

Each grade has a set of curriculum designed just for that age group and a teachers guidebook designed for volunteers (not professional teachers!). The sign up sheet is one the bulletin board by the church office or let the church office know if this is a role you can fill in our church. NEW Board of Ed members:

Our team gets to focus all about sharing God's Word with our young people! Some things we lead include: Sunday School, Prayer Partners, Christmas program, Vacation Bible School, First Communion, Confirmation. This doesn't mean we do all the work - we get to work with other amazing adult and youth volunteers. We meet most months of the year to touch base on what's coming up and how we can make our youth's church experience the foundation for their life as a Christian.


