



OSLC Worship & Music Team Meeting August 4, 2021 **Minutes**

Present: Pastor Todd, Char Graff, Janice Werner, Tyler Luttman

- Stew Carlson Memorial Keith Carlson has donated money in memory of Pastor Stew Carlson. Team agreed that the new LCMC Hymnals would be purchased with these funds.
- Video Camera replacement the video camera is outdated for the new technology we have in place for our worship media. At a cost of about \$800, we will recommend to the council to replace this camera with a new updated camera.
 - The video system has been stabilized, working well, and live-streaming to Facebook.
- III. Pew Bibles the pastor, council, Worship & Music, and the Board of Education have been reviewing different versions of the Bible in order to get a faithful contemporary version for our church body. We will endorse the Contemporary English Version (CEV), which is also what the Board of Education is leaning towards. This will allow for a more understandable Bible reading for both youth and adults. This evolved from the Holy Cow church survey that was completed.
- IV. COVID Updates Pew cards will be placed back in the pews. The offering bucket will be used again instead of ushers passing the offering plate. Communion cards can also be placed in this bucket. We will recommend to the council to return to communion kits instead of full line communion.


Coffee Fellowship Resumes Sept. 19th!




PRAYER PARTNERS WANTED:

New Hymnals & Pew Bibles!

Our Savior's has received two memorial gifts that serve as the heart of bringing new hymnals to our pews. The ReClaim Hymnal is the official hymnal of the LCMC (Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ), of which Our Savior's is a member congregation. When we held a congregational-survey two years ago, one of the top recommendations was to update our liturgy and hymnal. These two memorial gifts are providing nearly one half of the hymnals already, and is a great way to honor the memory of Pastor Stew Carlson and of Darrell Holmberg. The overall cost for the new hymnals is \$3,000 (\$23/hymnal). You have the opportunity to purchase these hymnals in memory or in honor of a loved one (see form below). The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on August 4th, 2021 in Fellowship Hall. Members present were: Cory Blomgren, Susan Jeckell, Chantel Neperman, John Smith, Kris Vollmer, Janice Werner, Misty Willhite and Pastor Todd Mathison. Absent were Todd Horning and Kevin Juhnke.

President Blomgren called the meeting to order. Pastor Todd led the group in an opening devotion.

Secretary's Report: July council minutes were read by Susan. On a motion by Chantel, seconded by Kris, the report was approved. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Chantel reported on the July checking balance of \$15,104.94 and savings balance of \$44,290.88. On a motion by John, seconded by Janice, the report was approved. Motion carried.

Education: The committee will be meeting in August for Sunday school preparations with a Rally Day start date scheduled for Sept 12th. Hopeful Prayer Partners will be able to return this vear.

Worship & Music: Janice presented a request for the purchase of a new 4K video camera, valued at \$800. After discussion, Chantel moved to grant approval to the Worship & Music committee for the purchase of a new 4K video camera, valued at approximately \$800. Misty seconded it. Motion carried. Discussion was had on returning to rail communion.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: Next meeting will be to plan the Rally Day celebration, Coffee Fellowship, and to determine the amount of support to send to The Table Ministry.

Property: No report. The furnace has been installed and paid for.

Old Business: Kris moved, Chantel seconded to approve and install Grace Guggisberg to the Board of Audit committee. Motion carried. Thank you to Grace for volunteering to fill this position!

New Business: Kris and Anne will be communion assistants during the August 8th church service. The family of Stew Carlson has given a memorial donation, upon recommendation by Worship and Music, of new hymnals and pew Bibles. The project would begin with the memorial donation. going towards individual hymnals in memory of Pastor Stew. Church members will have the opportunity to donate funds in memory of loved ones for additionally needed hymnals. After all needed hymnals are purchased, funds would continue to be raised for memorial pew Bibles. John moved to authorize and begin fundraising for the project of new hymnals and pew Bibles, starting with the gift from Stew Carlson's family. Chantel seconded it. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Todd presented on a July baptism, upcoming weddings and counseling, VVM service and visits, IT meetings, Stone's Cry and the much enjoyed Luther League Sioux Falls trip, among various other events. He will be on vacation August 12-19, discussion on a service leader for the August 15th service was held. The live stream system is now stable and preparations for Rally Day are in motion. He will be working alongside Life, Growth and Stewardship to re-engage members this fall with this big in-person celebration, ice cream social, coffee fellowship, welcome packets and consideration of a new church directory. Health insurance update- coverage will begin Sept 1, 2021 at a lower cost than anticipated.

With no further business to conduct, the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Chantel, and Kris second. Motion carried. The next Council Meeting will be September 1st at 7:00pm. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
