It never gets old

It happened again. It inevitably happens on a regular basis, and I really hope this happens to you as well. I was minding my own business simply doing my daily devotions and it happened again. I encountered an incredible passage in the Bible that talks about Jesus and this time it did it from a very peculiar angle.

For the purposes of this article, we find ourselves in the 21st chapter of the book of second Kings. Simply put, the book of second Kings is about a succession of bad kings who did what was evil in the sight of God and the prophets whom God sent to minister to these bad kings with the expressed purpose that the kings and all the inhabitants of the land would repent. As we arrive at chapter 21, this process has been going on for the entire corpus of the book, and we now are introduced to Manasseh. He is very much like many of his predecessors and many kings who would follow him. He did evil in the sight of the Lord by following the detestable practices of the nations, the Lord had driven out before the Israelites (2 Kings 21:2). The degradation continues in verse nine when we are told that the people did not listen to the voice of the prophets that God has sent to correct their behavior. Rather Manasseh, and all of his followers, were again led astray and did more evil than the nations of the Lord had up to that point (2 Kings 21:9). For me, this is one of those instances when someone asks me if I think the condition of the world is getting worse? I will often think of a passage such as this, or the situation of Sodom and Gomorrah or the like, and conclude that things have always been bad and that is why God sent Jesus to address the continual spiritual poverty of humankind.

The concept is called typology. This is an instance or an example in a story which points to Christ. That is, an Old Testament story or illustration, which is intentionally given as a reminder of what Christ will accomplish at Calvary. Typologically speaking verse six of second Kings 21 is that sort of an example. We're told, in the midst of the degradation and the utter lostness of the people of Judah, that Manasseh's depravity had escalated to the point that he was willing to sacrifice one of his own sons in fire. In the midst of practicing sorcery and witchcraft and consulting mediums and spirits he did much evil in the sight of the Lord (2 Kings 21:6). Please keep in mind that this is a king. This is God's emissary on earth, and he is utterly sinful to put it mildly. But in the midst of all of this mess, we see the illustration again of what Christ will eventually accomplish. Just as Manasseh sacrificed his son, God too, will sacrifice his. In the midst of all of the mess of our lives, God sent Jesus right in the middle of it all, just as he sent his prophetic voice right in the midst of the mess of second Kings 21. Unlike the evil that prompted Manasseh to sacrifice his son, God's motives are exactly the opposite. It is out of his supreme love for all of humankind that he is willing to sacrifice his own son so that we can all go free from sin and have eternal life. This is the point of typology that we can see over and over and over again. The grace and love of God towards us in the person and work of Jesus. Thanks be to God that he has given us countless examples of his redemption plan for us.

The OSLC Church Council met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, January 8, 2025 in fellowship hall. Members present were Pastor Steve Walswick, Steve Halter, Chad Coulter, Kari Halter, Deb Furth, Courtney Thram, Kris Vollmer, Janice Werner and Brian Benedict.

Absent: Kevin Graff

President Halter called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM and Pastor Steve led the group in prayer.

Secretary's Report: Chad moved and Courtney seconded to approve the minutes sent out to council members prior to the meeting. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Kari reported the December checking balance of \$23,281.29 and savings balance of \$66,559.66. On a motion by Sharon and seconded by Kevin, the treasurer's report was approved.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Steve submitted a written report of his activities for December, which included 10 personal contact visits, 3 communion visits, 3 pastoral care visits, 1 baptism, and several church and community events including conducting a monthly VVM service.

Committee Reports

Education: Courtney reported that the Sunday School students will sing Feb. 9, 2025 and March 23, 2025, followed with Prayer Partners after the church service those days. They are guiding and encouraging students to keep up with sermon notes (a bit of a struggle) and memory work. First communion is tentatively scheduled for April 16, 2025, with these plans to be finalized at the next Board of Education meeting on January 15, 2025 at 6:00 PM. The confirmation retreat is February 28 – March 2, 2025 at Inspiration Point in Vining, MN. They are looking for drivers and chaperones.

Worship and Music: Janice reported no meeting.

Life, Growth & Stewardship: Kris reported no meeting, but their next projects include planning for Lenten meals and setting up a meeting with Holly Rohlik to answer questions on what needs to be done for the church directory.

> Property: Brian reported that the lady's bathroom problem and the boiler are fixed.

Old Business:

Wedding policy: The updated OSLC wedding policy was presented to council. Brian moved to approve the update policy and Chad seconded. Motion carried

Overflow Refresh Group: This group met Tuesday, January 7, 2025 and decided they will remove everything from the walls in the overflow so they have a blank slate to evaluate what it could look like. Priorities right now are painting and lighting. The goal is to have some estimates and a plan to present at the February council meeting.



Tartu Academy

One of the recipients of benevolence this past year from OSLC is Tartu Academy. Tartu Academy of Theology (TAT) is a private university in Tartu, Estonia. The history of TAT begins with Harri Haamer.

Harri Haamer, author of the book We Shall Live in Heaven was ordained in 1929 and the story of a pastors dynasty began. Harri experienced hardships during his 58 years of service as a Lutheran pastor, because he suffered together with his nation under those difficulties Estonians were facing because of World War 2 and aggressive atheistic Soviet occupation that began in 1940. Harri wasn't afraid to continue proclaiming the Word of God during Soviet occupation although it was life threatening. He got his punishment. He was arrested in 1948 and was accused of organizing youth work at the church. He spent 8 years of his life in slave labor camps in Siberia, but while there he didn't stop being a pastor. He wrote a book about his journey to Siberia in those labor camps in very vivid detail.

Harri's grandson, Simon, visited a couple of members of OSLC congregation the summer of 2023 and told about the TAT and left us several copies of his grandfather's book, We Shall Live in Heaven, that are available in our church library. The book is a very real testimony of faith and trust in our God, for it was the Holy Spirit that sustained Pastor Haamer through those torturous years.


