A Look Back



THOMAS J. KILMER was born at Cobleskill, N. Y., Nov. 22, 1833. His early education was obtained at Whitesborough Academy, in Utica, N. Y. He graduated from the Eclectic Medical College of New York in 1854, and practiced his profession for the following eight years at Port Crane, Broome County, N. Y., whence he removed to the village of Schoharie, where he has for thirty-two years maintained a large and successful practice. He founded in this village, fifteen years ago, a sanitarium and dispensary, at which the doctor treats especially, diseases of women and children. The doctor is a member

of the Schoharie County Medical Society, and is a Master Mason. He was married in 1852 to Miss Elmira Palmatier, and has one daughter, Julia.

The doctor, besides his large personal practice, has for years compounded and sold from his dispensary a variety of special remedies, among which are a liver, kidney and bladder compound, cough cure, complete special croup cure, catarrh cure and cream pills.
