
The Sixth Annual Lily Festival was a success drawing the largest crowd to date. We thank everyone for their support and assistance.

As a post-retirement venture, Nancy and John Wolfe purchased the 58-year-old Schoharie Laundromat after Tropical Storm Irene flooded the valley more than a decade ago. The couple completed a total rehab of the building, installing top of the line machines, and opened the new Wolfe's Laundry Den on March 8, 2014.

Offering well-maintained 20, 40 and 60 pound washing machines, the laundry has many regular customers, some who travel long distances. The business has a well-deserved reputation for service and cleanliness, with machines being continually cleaned during open hours, along with weekly maintenance. Dry cleaning service is also offered with turn -around on Wednesday and Friday and they have someone who does alterations including zipper replacements.

Having collected hundreds of forgotten socks, a clothesline hangs above the folding tables to hopefully one day reunite them with their missing partners. Besides socks, Nancy Wolfe has found many items of clothing, towels and textiles left behind in machines, which she shares on a "free" table.

And there's no need to just watch your clothes spin - the laundry has plenty to entertain and make patrons comfortable, including tables and chairs, magazines, puzzles, games, books, vending machines and television. The couple also maintains a large bulletin board for notices and information about events in the area.



The Laundry Den is open 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. seven days a week and on all holidays, with Sunday being its busiest day.
