

How do I scan a QR code with my smartphone?

QR codes, which give your phone or tablet an instant link to a specific web page, have become more common because of the pandemic, especially at restaurants that don't want to hand out printed menus. To scan a QR code, point your phone's camera at the code. But instead of taking a photo tap the icon that appears once the phone correctly scans the code. That will take you to the associated website via your phone's web browser, which should launch automatically. If you are having trouble with this method, you can find and download free QR readers apps in the Apple or Android app stores.

KCRTA Scholarship Foundation

The Knox County Retired Teachers Association Scholarship Foundation is a 501 © (3) non-profit tax-exempt organization. The goal of the Foundation is to provide financial assistance in the form of scholarships to students who are classified as full-time seniors or graduate students, who are pursuing a Tennessee teaching certification. The scholarships are awarded to students enrolled in a college or university in East Tennessee.

Since the 1980's, the scholarship foundation program has been a major emphasis of the Knox County Retired Teachers Association, and each November the KCRTA Scholarship Foundation holds its annual scholarship foundation awards ceremony and luncheon at The Foundry. For many years there were three standing scholarships---the Tom Underwood and the Reuben Hunter, named for the two men who established the scholarship program (1993), and the Colleen Bennett who left an endowment at her death to sustain the program. Since 2018, the families of Bill Crosland and Cindi Schowalter have funded a scholarship in their names. In addition, each year, the Knox County Retired Teachers Association, honors a member whose outstanding service to the organization merits recognition. Other named scholarships come from donations in memory of or in honor of those whose friends and/or family members wish to recognize someone special.

Although the scholarship initiative as we know it today has grown substantially and has evolved into a thriving, recognized effort of the KCRTA, it still remains true to the goals and core values established by its founders. Scholarship recipients are chosen from the applications of exceptional future educators enrolled in an East Tennessee college or university teacher education program. Each fall a selection committee, made up of former educators, critiques the scholarship entries. Over the years, the amount awarded to students has increased from \$300 during the first three years to the current total of \$1,500.

Gifts are welcomed in any amount and may be designated for either the Scholarship Fund or the Endowment Fund.


