

# **President's Message**

# Legislative

We (KCRTA members) will be meeting with our legislators this month March 24 in Nashville. I personally find meeting with our legislators interesting, fun, and educational. There are numerous bills which impact education such as SB1787/HB1550 which deletes the Tennessee Education Savings Account Pilot Program (Vouchers), HB2026/SB1916 requests 1 nurse and 1 counselor for each school funded by BEP, HB2025/SB1917 increased number of teachers funded by BEP to 1 per 20, HB2051/SB2701 fund 1 social worker per 1500 students, HB 2229/SB2160 dictates K-2 reading curriculum (this is bad bill, no "1 size fits all" solution to literacy), and HB 1687 removes Science/Social Studies standards for K-2 (another bad bill). There may also be a petition drive for better funded schools. If this is something that might interest you, we can always use more people on our committee.
