Membership

Legislative

This has been quite a Legislative Session. It's disappointing that our Governor and our Legislators did not do more to better fund our public schools. Tennessee currently funds its public school system at a level that consistently places it in the bottom five most poorly funded states in the country. During the current Legislative Session, numerous bills have been introduced by members from both sides of the aisle to provide additional funds for some of our public school's urgent needs. Among those needs adequately funding school counselors, social workers, and school nurses, and sufficient numbers of interventionists to support state mandated programing.

The state is running a budget surplus that is on track to exceed 2 billion this and future years and, the state is sitting on cash reserves exceeding 7 billion dollars.

There is no legitimate excuse for failing to fund our schools properly.

In light of this surplus, there was hope that this would be the year that Governor Lee would finally address the inadequacies of the Basic Education Program (BEP), the state's K-12 funding formula. Tennessee has under-invested in our children for far too long. The BEP formula needs to be adjusted to more accurately reflect the real needs and costs of providing a good public school education. The BEP formula should be adjusted by 20% or more to bring Tennessee's support of public schools into line with our students basic needs.

The focus now is setting next year's budget. It is never too late to write or call the Governer and you Legislators and let them know how you feel about better funding for our schools: Governor Bill Lee, bill.lee@tn.gov and copy his assistant, caroleanne.orsborn@tn.gov

The FCC is Getting Serious About Robo Calls

This is a glimmer of good news about the most prevalent method of fraud for retired adults. Per the NY Post and other media outlets, the FCC has issued an order to phone service providers to that they must refuse to accept traffic that is not listed in the new "Robo Call Mitigation" Database by September 28, 2021. This should greatly reduce the unwanted fraud phone calls. Just a few years ago another Federal expert group had declared the conventional telephone so obsolete that nothing could be done to prevent telephone fraud. Perhaps even newer technologies has improved the situation. Keeping this in mind, continue to be vigilant and never consider a telephone call from a stranger to be legitimate.
