New Paper Checks

We recently warned about traditional paper checks being altered by scammers. Apparently new safer paper checks are coming and may be available through your bank or check supplier. An article in Consumer Reports (March 2025) indicated that they use chemical sensitive paper, watermarks, holograms, and special links that change color when exposed to heat. I will be checking with my check supplier since we prefer checks for some transactions.

Legislative News

Sadly, Bill Lee's voucher proposal passed the House with 54 ayes to 44 nays and one amendment to the bill. The amendment requires school boards to pass a resolution accepting the state's new school voucher system in order for teachers in that district to receive the one time \$2,000 bonus included in the bill by June 1. The proposal passed the Senate with 20 ayes and 13 nays and has been signed into law by Governor Bill Lee. This is a \$447 million program offering about \$7,300 each to students to attend certain state accredited private schools with a lot of specifics to be worked out in the coming weeks and months. The program will be ready to launch in time for students to enroll for the 2025-26 school year.

More sad news: Book removals in public schools hit a new high in 2024, with nearly 1,400 books (spanning 1,155 unique titles) pulled from school library shelves across the state. Familiar books like "Wacky Wednesday" by Dr. Suess and a graphic novel rendition of "Time Machine" by H. G. Wells along with recent popular releases like "Six of Crows" by Leigh Bardugo and "Where the Crawdads Sing" by Delia Owens have been removed from libraries across the state over the past year.

There are numerous bills out there regarding education, a couple that caught my attention were a bill to allow public schools to hire chaplains, and another bill to require proof of citizenship in order to attend public schools.

And to think just last year at this time we were pleading for everyone to continue to push back 3rd and 4th grade retention. Whatever became of that???

There are trips to Nashville planned for March 4th and March 11th, however, I fear that those dates will have past by the time you receive this newsletter.
