Hello Everyone!

For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do (Ephesians 2:10).

Ad Astra is in full swing, in the past couple weeks I've seen dozens of young people moving about in our facility; talking with one another, smiling, laughing, sometimes scurrying down the hall to avoid a late entry into practice. In our fellowship hall and sanctuary they sing, play instruments, and hone their craft as actors, singers, and musicians all in preparation for their performances.

The musicians in the fellowship hall tuning their instruments sound so discordant. You hear woodwind, strings, and brass all blowing, humming into, strumming or drawing bows across their instruments as they tune-up and practice different stanzas on their varied instruments.

Then it becomes quiet, the conductor lifts his hands - a collective pause. As the conductor moves his hands the various instruments begin voicing their synchronized parts. Suddenly, wonderfully, the hall outside my office is filled with a delightful melody. All instruments together creating the beautiful music. The music played by the tuba, or bass, or clarinet at any particular moment on its own may not be pleasing to the listener. It is only as all instruments voice together that the music comes to life as the composer of the piece intended.

As I enjoyed and listened, Ephesians 2:10 came to mind. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

This is not directed to the individual, it is written to a group of Christians – a 'Local Church': Together we are God's workmanship! As we draw together we're created into something new - to do good works. These works are what our composer and conductor, our heavenly Father prepared for us to do.

We will be starting up IGNITE! again at Trinity UMC on September 7th and we are excited to see all the kids again!



Around the world, many believers are persecuted -- imprisoned, even killed -- for their faith. These are our Christian brothers and sisters, and need our prayers.

Jul. 21, 2022 | Guinea - Christian Man Attacked by Mus-<u>lim Wife</u> - Soulayman is a Fulani painter who came to faith in Christ through the witness of a missionary who had hired Soulayman. When his family discovered his newfound faith, they forced him to marry a Muslim woman to try to reconvert him. When a son was born to Soulayman, the family tried to force him to perform an Islamic ceremony on the boy. After Soulayman refused, the family sent his wife to attack him; she stabbed him with a knife. When Soulayman returned

home from the hospital after receiving treatment for his wounds, his family wouldn't let him see his children and attacked him again. Soulayman eventually escaped with his children and reached out to a local missionary who helped him find refuge with a local pastor. Pray that Soulayman and his children will be safe, and pray his family comes to faith in Christ.

North Koriea— Illegal to worship Jesus - In North Korea, it is illegal to worship Jesus or have a Bible. For the last three decades, believers have been known and treated as the "the hostile class." Anything that gives people an alternative allegiance to the ruling Kim dynasty is deemed to be dangerous to the state. Christians must hide their faith, even from their own children. As a result, coming together to worship Jesus is a death warrant. And yet, secret Christians are risking their lives to be part of a church or own a Bible. They're facing death to worship Jesus, knowing that their only hope is in Him. The words of North Korean believer and exprisoner Hae-Woo encourage us to pray with these families recently imprisoned and for all secret believers in North Korea. She now lives in South Korea. "While in prison, I could not understand everything, but I felt the Christians in different countries praying for us who were imprisoned." She says, "It provided comfort, and it provided a source of energy for us. Even if we cannot meet each other, let us communicate through the Spirit, in Jesus Christ." (opendoorsusa.org)

Jul. 21, 2022 | Saudi Arabia - Deported Yemeni Evangelist Continues Ministry- Brother Ahmed was born and raised in Saudi Arabia and became a successful businessman. In 2014, he gave his life to Christ, traveling to Egypt to be baptized. Upon returning to Saudi Arabia, he organized small Bible study groups in his home and led several people to Christ. Eventually, Brother Ahmed was exposed, arrested, and all his possessions were confiscated. He was imprisoned for six months, then deported to Yemen, where he spent another six months before fleeing to a country where his wife and children could join him. Brother Ahmed's legal situation is complicated, and he lives in constant fear of being deported. Still, he continues working to advance God's kingdom and has led a number of Yemenis to faith, baptizing them all. Pray for his safety and ministry.


