Pastor's Corner

Think about what happens around the average meal table, whether it is in your kitchen or dining room at home, a restaurant down the street or a picnic blanket spread on fresh cut grass, it always involves more than simply obtaining nourishment for one's body.

Stories are recounted, debates occur, if the stories are sad – tears are shed, laughs are often shared, forgiveness given, relationships restored, joking and poking fun at one another all while enjoying a meal.

The gospels give account of many instances of Jesus sharing meals with various persons. He did so because He wanted to know people, and desired that people would know Him. For the next few weeks we will continue in our sermon series: "Breaking Bread With Jesus." Examining some of these meals. They always seem to have a twist: who is Jesus eating with - tax collectors and sinners? — a prostitute?, how many are invited - 4,000?, eating with His enemies, making the meal about more than the food, and many others.

I think we will learn much about Jesus, ourselves, and others. Hopefully each week will leave us with something to consider, perhaps leave us knowing God, others and ourselves better.

That is wonderful, but I do pray it goes beyond that.

Many believe that there has been a great decline in feasting in American culture – and saying we are worse off for it!

In his book Bowling Alone, Robert Putman reveals that "there's been a 33 percent decrease in families eating together over the last three decades. And more than half of those families are watching television as they eat together. Over the same period there's been a 45 percent decline in entertaining friends. Growing up I would ask each Sunday, 'Who's coming for dinner today?' Not whether but who, because I knew my parents always would have invited someone." "In the typical American household, the average number of dinners eaten together is three per week, with the average length of dinner being 20 minutes. Many homes no longer even have a dining room."

People just don't have anyone over anymore --- we've lost the creation of intimacy around a meal.

So much could be gained if we just spent some time eating together.

God understood the importance of gathering around a table – families worshipping, families enjoying each other's company... Sabbath began at 6pm on Friday and went through Saturday at 6pm. It began with a meal that recounted the goodness of God to His people.

I'd like to challenge you as we go through this series. This is not a series on hospitality – we'll discuss that this fall. However, would you be willing to restore the meal table as a place of gathering for connection, relationship and blessing? Would you increase your family meal occurrences and be intentional at creating intimacy? Would you begin the habit of blessing others by inviting them into your home to share a meal? There is something so special about this act of sharing a meal it was one of the ways Jesus depicted his willingness to connect with us.

'Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him, and he with me.'

Please share your simple food and meal table with others.



Around the world, many believers are persecuted -- imprisoned, even killed -- for their faith. Since Jesus laid down His life, 43 million Christians have become martyrs.

Right now 200 million people face persecution for believing in Jesus and 60% of those people are children, according to Christians in Crisis International Ministry, a prayer advocacy ministry for persecuted believers.

Sara (not her real name) knows first hand what it is like to be persecuted. The week before Sara and her husband planned to open a Bible School, 4 men attacked their family with metal hatchets. Because of the attacks, Sara had 3 skull fractures, a punctured eardrum, internal bleeding and

needed stitches badly.

"Before the attacks, I considered myself sensitive to the persecuted church," Sara said. "But then I woke up one night and I was one." The experience strengthened Sara's resolve to support those suffering for their faith.

Nigeria 2022. Church Security Guard Killed During Kidnapping:

On Tuesday, March 8, armed assailants abducted Rev. Joseph Akeke from his home in southern Kaduna state. During the abduction, the assailants shot and killed Luka, the church security guard. The assailants then abducted three others, a woman and two children, and killed another man as they fled the predominantly Christian village. "Pray for God's intervention and for [the pastor's] safe release," said an area resident. Pray that the kidnapped Christians will be returned safely to their homes and families. Pray that the other Christians in this village will remain firm in their faith and bear witness to the love of Christ amid ongoing attacks.

How to Pray from the Bible

Because the New Testament was written to persecuted believers, it is filled with examples of how to pray for our brothers and sisters under attack.

Here are 5 examples from Ephesians:

Please pray persecuted believers would know the hope God gives (Ephesians 1:18).

Pray the Holy Spirit would strengthen them (Ephesians 3:16).

Please pray persecuted believers would know how much God loves them (Ephesians 3:17)

Pray they would know how to share the gospel (Ephesians 6:19).

Please pray persecuted believers would fearlessly tell others about Jesus (Ephesians 6:20).
