



2022 Candice Dupree Invitational Rules

Format	Showcase Format- 4 game minimum
Bookkeeper	Home team is responsible for keeping the official book.
Game Length	4 – 8 minute stop clock quarters (8 th -12 th grade) 4 – 7 minute stop clock quarters for (4 th -7 th grade)
Warm-up	Five (5) minutes per game
Halftime	Three (3) minutes
Running Clock	If at any point during the contest the scoring margin exceeds twenty-five (25) points the clock will revert to running time. Clock will return to a stopped clock with the deficit goes below fifteen (15) points.
Timeouts	Three (3) 30 sec timeouts per team
Overtime	One (1) minute stop clock first overtime, then sudden death second overtime.
Bonus Foul Shot	Teams will shoot 2 free throws on the 6 th team foul each quarter.
Foul Limit	Six (6) per player
Ball Advancement	Under 1 minute in the 4 th quarter the team can advance the ball on their own timeout. (Cannot be advanced after a dribble.)
Home/Visitor Uniforms	Bottom is Home and wears light colored jersey; Top is away and wears dark colored jersey.
Game Balls	Game ball will be provided. Teams are responsible for bringing their own basketballs for warm-ups.
Rules of Play	Will play with modified NCAA Rules without a 30-second shot clock. There is a 10-second backcourt. 5-second calls apply with dribbling closely guarded and on held ball.
Game Start	Arrive 30 minute before game time.
Technical fouls:	If the coach gets 1 technical, they will be allowed to still stand. After the 2nd technical, the coach will have to leave the bench.
Protests	No protests will be allowed for this tournament.

SPORTSMANSHIP AND PROFESSIONALISM

- Do not use profanity. Do not embarrass your players. Do not get thrown out of games.
- *Do not complain about the officiating to site directors or staff members. Keep in mind that no one at your site assigned the officials and the officiating is completely beyond their control. Complaining will not achieve any positive result, and conversely it tends to make your program appear weak.*
- *Do not complain about your schedule (i.e. who, when, or where you play) to site directors or staff members. They had no part in the scheduling of the event.*
- *Do not leave the tournament early because of poor planning or poor performance. This is the ultimate act of disrespect to your opponents and displays to your players either disorganization, a losing attitude, or both. Leaving the event early may result in your team not being allowed to participate in the event next year.*
