Feature-length Screenplays

Mrs. Maxine Becker is a dark dramedy about an ambitious film producer, who, with her screenwriter husband, does whatever it takes to become head of the studio in the male-dominated world of 1940s Hollywood.

One Bad Day is a drama thriller about a corrupt Texas border cop, who must discover who murdered his son only to realize that it has been his own choices that have brought him to this current crossroad.

Harvey Hobbes (Working Title; currently in development) is an anti-romcom about a 40-year-old, single, struggling writer and professor, who invents an imaginary boyfriend so she can spend time with her married friends.

Other People is a drama about four individuals who take a subway ride to hell...literally, revealing their sins, crimes and how their choices were products of their experiences. Inspired by Jean Paul Sartre's *No Exit*.

Nessie's Song (Alt. Title: *Slave to the Knight*) is a drama about a disillusioned Texas guitar player who helps a 17-year-old girl with the voice of an angel realize her potential, thereby redeeming his own wasted talent.
