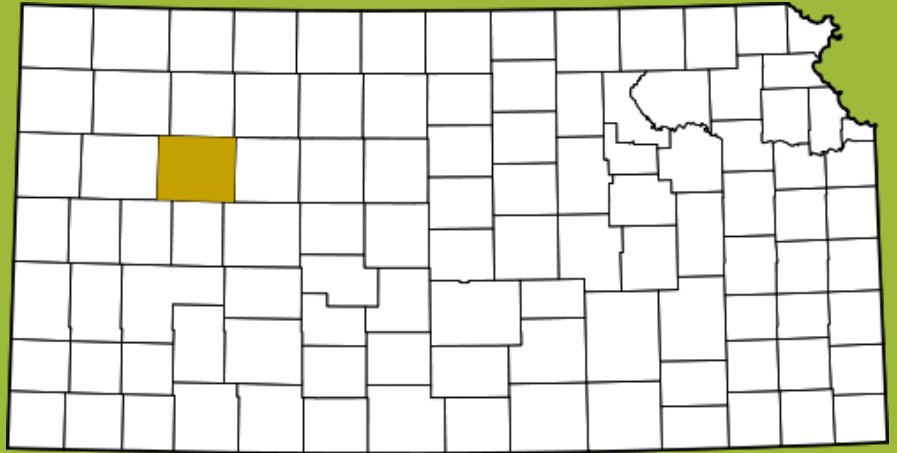

The First District Commissioner governs Quinter.

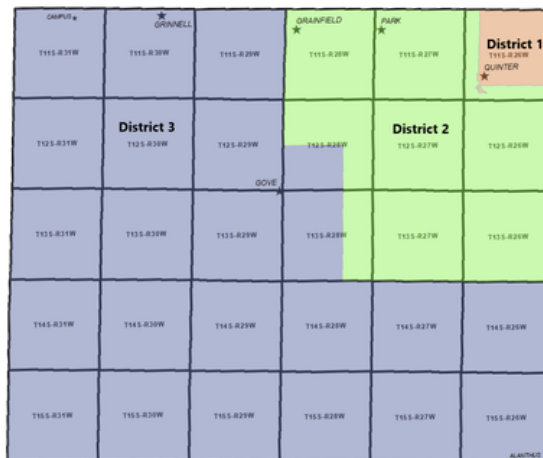
The Second District Commissioner governs Park and Grainfield.

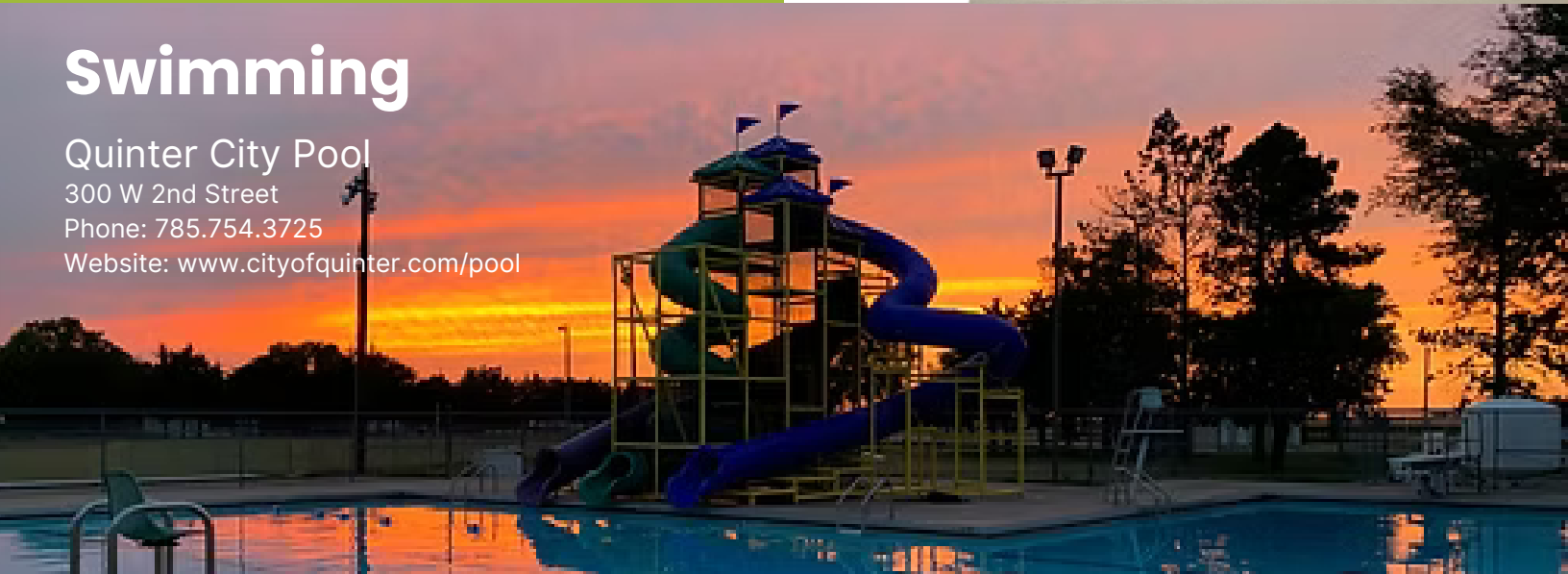

"Old Settlers Day" in Gove is a community heritage celebration. It honors the town's roots and brings together current and former residents for social, cultural, and fun events. It is held in Gove, Kansas, centered around the local city park.

After Harvest Fest

The After Harvest Fest in Grinnell, Kansas is hosted every year as a way for the community to come together and celebrate the completion of harvest — one of the most important and unifying times of year for rural farming communities. It is held the third weekend of July each year, centered around the local city park.

Gove County Rodeo

The Gove County Rodeo, is a beloved local tradition that brings the community together to celebrate the spirit of the West. The event typically features classic rodeo competitions like bull riding, barrel racing, team roping, calf roping, and bronc riding—showcasing both local and regional talent.

Gove County Fair

The Gove County Fair is a summertime highlight that brings together families, friends, and neighbors from across the county to celebrate community, agriculture, and hometown pride. Held each year in Grainfield, Kansas, the fair features a full lineup of events including livestock shows, 4-H and FFA exhibits, craft and baking competitions, and plenty of entertainment for all ages.

Quinter Alumni Weekend

The Quinter, Kansas All-Class Reunion is a cherished annual tradition that brings together Quinter High School graduates from every generation to celebrate their shared roots and community pride. Held each summer, the event features a full weekend of activities — from class gatherings and a community meal to a parade and other hometown festivities. Alumni travel from near and far to reconnect with old friends, reminisce about school days, and see how their hometown continues to grow and thrive. Gove County Historical Museum

The Gove County Historical Museum, located at 505 Washington Street in Gove, Kansas, serves as a vibrant testament to the county's rich cultural and agricultural heritage. Housed in a former high school building purchased by the Gove County Historical Association in 1970, the museum offers visitors a comprehensive glimpse into the area's past.

Grinnell-Angelus Area Heritage Center

The Grinnell-Angelus Area Heritage Center is a community-driven museum dedicated to preserving and sharing the rich history of Grinnell and the surrounding areas of Angelus, Campus, Orange, and Orion in western Kansas. Established in 2007 by local volunteers, the center serves as a repository for artifacts, photographs, and documents that chronicle the lives and stories of the region's residents and communities.

Quinter Historical Society

The Quinter Historical Society is a community-driven organization dedicated to preserving and sharing the rich history of Quinter and the surrounding areas in Gove County, Kansas. 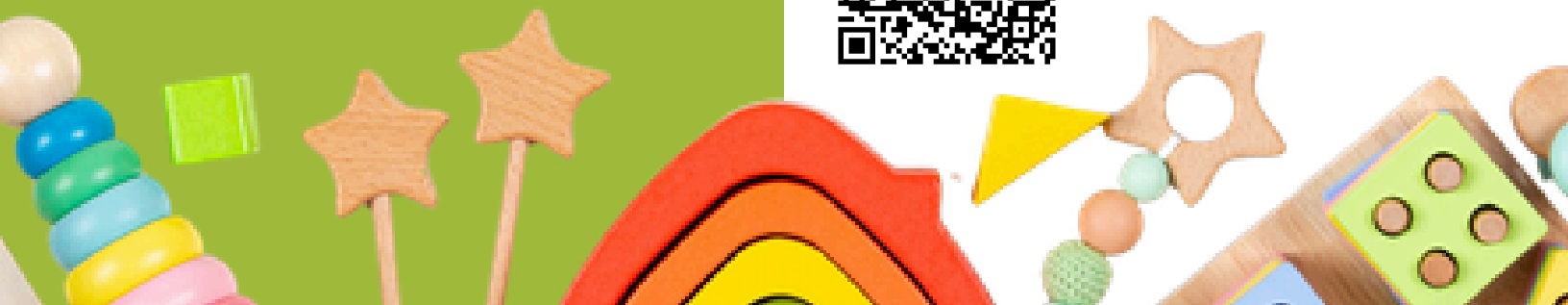

Development Opportunities

Workforce Relocation Incentive Program:

The Workforce Relocation Incentive Program is a community-driven effort focused on attracting talent, strengthening local businesses, and investing in the future of Gove County. In partnership with the Northwest Kansas Economic Innovation Center, this initiative provides financial incentives to help employers recruit and retain employees while encouraging new residents to put down roots in our communities.

Supported by a \$60,000 grant, the program offers up to \$5,000 per business each year to assist with relocation expenses, sign-on bonuses, and housing support. It targets key industries such as agriculture, education, healthcare, public service, skilled trades, administration, and small business — helping fill essential roles that keep our county moving forward. Entrepreneurs and remote workers looking to relocate are also welcomed and supported through this program.

Priority is given to full-time positions offering competitive wages, ensuring quality employment opportunities for individuals and families who choose to make Gove County home. More than a financial incentive, this program represents a long-term commitment to workforce growth, economic vitality, and community investment — building a stronger Gove County for generations to come.

Rural Opportunity Zone:

The Rural Opportunity Zone (ROZ) Program is Kansas's creative way of encouraging people to move to and invest in the state's rural communities — places filled with wide skies, friendly neighbors, and the kind of life that's hard to find anywhere else. Under this program, moving to one of the designated ROZ counties comes with significant financial perks for new full-time residents.

Two big incentives make ROZ stand out: student loan repayment assistance and a 100% state income tax credit. Eligible newcomers can receive up to \$15,000 in student loan help over five years to be put toward loans they took on before relocating. In addition, if you've lived outside Kansas for several years and meet a few criteria about income and residency, you can qualify for a full Kansas state income tax credit for up to five years after you settle into a ROZ county.

It's a program built not just to reward individuals, but to help rural towns grow their workforces, attract young professionals and families, and breathe new life into local economies — all while showcasing the unique benefits of rural Kansas living.

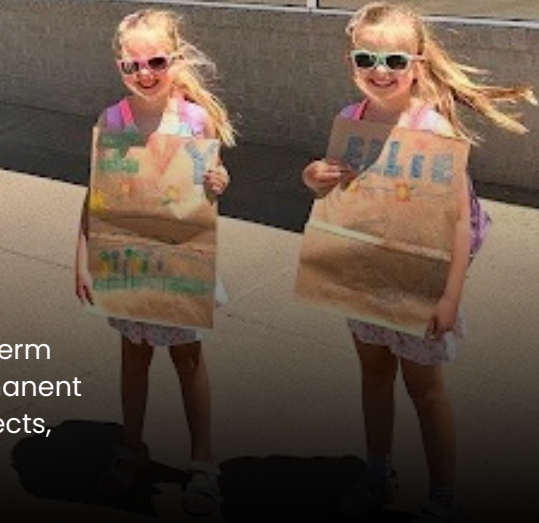
