- Centres of the spread of Christianity



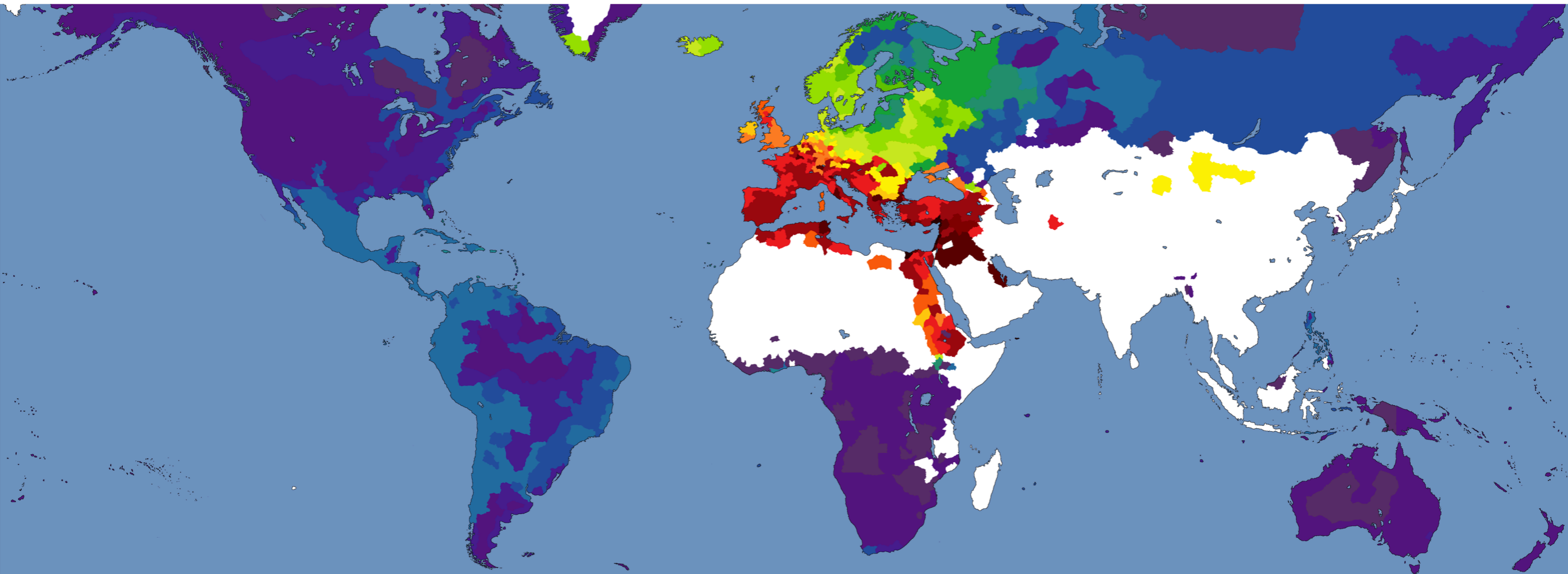
