General Rules

- 1. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury, or damage associated with any animal or article exhibited by him/her.
- 2. All boys and girls 19 & under in 0-12th grade are eligible to compete in this show. Show is open to the world.
- 3. Pre-entries allowed. Each exhibitor can submit a cash only entry on the day of show; it is not required to register through an Ag teacher or county agent. Information on entry forms must be legible or they will not be accepted. Please refer to the chart below for show times and when weights are due.
- 4. Show dates and times:

- 5. Showmanship entries are subject to a \$5.00 entry fee per species with 100% payback to the top two places in each division. Entries due at check-in. Exhibitors must have entries in that species and show their own animals in order to participate in showmanship (excluding Pee Wees). Exhibitors may only show in their actual age/grade division. Divisions are as follows:
 - Pee Wee*: 0-2nd grade Junior: 3rd-5th grade Intermediate: 6th-8th grade Senior: 9th- 12th grade
- 6. Bedding will be available for purchase- wood chips only. Hay may be used in extreme cold at the Show Coordinators' and Superintendents' discretion.
- 7. No power plants or heat lamps allowed in the barns. During extreme cold, heaters will be allowed at the discretion of the Show Coordinators & Superintendents.
- 8. Animals with fungus, sore mouth, respiratory diseases, contagious diseases, or parasites will not be allowed to show.
- 9. NO HEALTH PAPERS REQUIRED FOR TEXAS EXHIBITORS. Out of state exhibitors must have health papers for breeding and market animals that meet the requirements of Texas Animal Health Commission. (www.tahc.state.tx.us)
- 10. Any protests to rules will incur a \$100 fee. The protest will be heard and determined by the GCBC executive board and species superintendents. Protest must be made by the completion of the show.

2025 Top O' Texas Junior Livestock Show Division Rules

Lamb Show

Lamb Superintendents- Heather Scott (chair), Chandler Bowers, Tammy May, Tiffany Lashmet, RJ Becco

- 1. \$45 pre-entry fee per animal. \$55 entry day of show. No checks.
- 2. Lambs cannot weigh over 5 lbs. of weight turned in. Random weigh back at Show Coordinator's and Superintendent's discretion.
- 3. Wether and ewe lambs are eligible for market show.
- 4. Lambs must be slick shorn above knee and hock.
- 5. Classes: Finewool, Finewool Cross, Medium Wool, Southdown and Dorper. Any breed with less than three entries will be entered in listed breeds.
- 6. Blow and Show: no adhesives, paint, powdering or artificial coloring.
- 7. <u>Breeding Lambs: must have minimum of 15 entries</u>. Will show under same classes, broken by weight. Breeding lambs must be under one year of age. Payouts and/or prizes will be determined by number of entries.
- 8. Health papers are NOT required for Texas exhibitors. Health papers required for all out of state market and breeding animals.
- 9. Showmanship to follow Lamb Grand Drive.

Goat Show

Goat Superintendents- Heather Scott (chair), Chandler Bowers, Tammy May, Tiffany Lashmet, RJ Becco

- 1. \$45 pre-entry fee per animal. \$55 entry day of show. No checks.
- 2. Goats cannot weigh over 5 lbs. of weight turned in. Random weigh back at Show Coordinator's and Superintendent's discretion.
- 3. Wether and doe goats are eligible for market show.
- 4. Classes will be divided by weights.
- 5. No adhesives, paint, powdering or artificial coloring.
- 6. Goats are required to have horns tipped blunt no smaller than a dime.
- 7. <u>Breeding does: must have a minimum of 15 entries</u>. Will be broken by weight, must be under 1 year of age. Payouts and/or prizes will be determined by entries.

- 8. Health papers are NOT required for Texas exhibitors. Health papers required for all out of state market and breeding animals.
- 9. Showmanship will be after the market grand drive.

Cattle Show

Cattle Superintendents- Tyrel Lashmet (chair), Max Payne, Chance Bowers, Cason Troxell, Kellie Mae Davis, Katie Davis, Hudson Scribner, Colton Cambern

- 1. \$45 pre-entry fee per animal. \$55 entry fee day of show. No checks.
- 2. Blow and Show. No adhesives, paint, powdering or artificial coloring. No pumping or artificial fill to enhance animal's appearance while in the barn.

Heifers

- 1. Breed guidelines will follow: 1) American 2) British 3) European and 4) Commercial Breeding heifers. Classes will be determined by entries. Any breed with less than 3 entries will be put in the appropriate class of listed breeds.
- 2. No heifers born before September 1, 2023.
- 3. Heifers must be registered in their breed registry in the sole name of the exhibitor before November 1st, 2025. Does not apply to Commercial Breeding class.
- 4. Heifers are shown by birthdate and breed on Registration Papers based on entries.
- 5. Commercial Breeding heifers will be classed by weight.
- 6. Health papers are NOT required for Texas exhibitors. Health papers required for all out of state market and breeding animals.
- 7. Show order will be:
 - I. Americans: Beefmaster, Brahman, ARB, American Division Drive
 - II. British: Angus, Red Angus, Hereford, Polled Hereford, Shorthorn, AOB, British Division Drive
 - III. European: Charolais, Chianina, Maine, Simmental, ORB, European Division Drive
 - IV. Commercials, Commercial Champion Drive
 - V. Overall Champion Drive
 - VI. Cattle showmanship will follow the heifer show, not starting before 12:00 PM

Steers

- 1. Steers classes: 1) American 2) British 3) Light weight Exotic 4) Heavy Weight Exotic
- 2. Steers cannot weigh over 5% of weight turned in. Random weigh back at superintendent and show coordinators discretion. If an entry is disqualified, the next place will be weighed, and placings will roll up)
- 2. Cattle showmanship will follow the heifer show, not starting before 12:00 PM., followed by the steer show.
- 3. Health papers required for all entries.

Mini Herefords

- 1. A mini show will be held based on entries. Prizes/payouts will be determined by number of entries.
- 2. Mini heifers/steers will be shown first in show order. The overall mini heifer/steer may be shown in the perspective grand drive, but are not required to do so.
- 3. There is availability of a heifer class/overall and a steer class/overall.
- 4. No bulls.
- 5. Health papers are NOT required for Texas exhibitors. Health papers required for all out of state market and breeding animals.

Swine Show

Swine Superintendents- Zack Greer (chair), Garrett Scribner, Zach Cambern, Justin Thomas, Bubba Meadows, Randy Holmes, Brandon Campbell

- 1. \$45 pre-entry fee per animal. \$55 entry day of show. No checks.
- 2. Entries for Swine only. Swine cannot weigh over 10 lbs. of weight turned in. *Random weigh back at Show Coordinator's and Superintendent's discretion*.
- 3. Classes: Berkshire, Dark Other Pure Breeds, Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, White Other Pure Breeds, Light Crosses, and Dark Crosses. Herefords will show with Light Crosses. Any breed with less than three entries will be moved to the appropriate breed of listed classes.
- 4. Water only may be used to dress swine; no oil-based products. (Rule will be enforced)
- 5. No boars over 125 pounds allowed.
- 6. Showmanship will follow Grand Drive.
- 7. Open to all states.
- 8. Health papers are NOT required for Texas exhibitors. Health papers required for all out of state market and breeding animals.
