He began his journey as a Wolf in Pack 40 in Hudson, Florida and earned his Arrow of Light in 2016. By his dedication, determination and sacrifice, his journey to Eagle Scout was full of meaningful memories. Nathan spent seven months creating a written proposal for his project. This included planning a fund raiser, drawing plans for the project, making a material list and projecting the cost of the materials. He also planned the changes needed to the area



where the project was to be constructed, and gathered his work team. The team provided 312 hours of labor from planning to completion.

Besides Scouting, Nathan is involved in National Honor Society, his school's student government and a part of Hampstead Baptist Church's youth group and First Friday Bible Study Group.
