





And it is an amazing opportunity for Baptist youth staff to engage with others about faith issues while polishing their own leadership skills.

There will be planned days off for all staff to provide time for everyone to visit the myriad booths and program areas spread across the Summit Jamboree site. Staff are encouraged to engage and share their faith, all while experiencing what many consider a once in a lifetime event at a National Jamboree.

Jamboree dates for ABS staff are July 19-31, 2026, (plus travel time, both to and from) at the Summit Bechtel Reserve near Beckley, West Virginia. This area was created specifically for Scouting and has some amazing program areas, like the Big Zip, BMX track, and an amazing climbing wall. No one lacks for things to do at a Jamboree!

The ABS committee would like to have more youth serve in our booth in 2026. To enable that goal the ABS recently approved full youth scholarships to cover ABS youth staff's Jambo fee, so they would just need to outfit themselves and get to the Summit Bechtel Reserve. A partial scholarship of fees is also available for adult ABS staff. Chapel Refurbishment Projects Now Part of the Philmont Annual Calendar

Thanks to the hard work of a number of volunteers over the past few years, the Chapel Refurbishment Week has become part of the annual calendar at Philmont Scout Ranch. The largest representation each year has come from the Association of Baptists for Scouting team led by Donna Copeland. In 2024, work was done at every backcountry and headquarters chapel with the exception of Black Mountain and Sawmill which were unreachable because of accumulated snow from the winter. In addition, a new chapel site was established adjacent to the Baldy Town Cemetery.

May 7-11 are the dates for the 2025 event and the assignment is even more aggressive than last year. Work is scheduled for every current chapel with two additional locations in the planning. The size of the entire group is limited by accommodation and logistical considerations, so act now if you are interested.

BSA Brand Changes

As most Scouters are aware, the last several years have seen numerous changes for the Boy Scouts of America. These changes range from the residual impacts of the Covid pandemic, to an enhanced, positive focus on youth safety, to finances and staffing reductions resulting from the extended and difficult process of the National BSA bankruptcy.

As the movement proceeds to move into the future there is another change to be aware of in months to come. All BSA programs now offer all youth, both girls and boys, an opportunity to participate, learn and grow. The existing brand - Boy Scouts of America - does not fully describe this reality and some might not understand all that is available for their children. After much discussion the national board elected to move forward with an updated branding for the Scouting movement.

A new brand identity will roll out in coming months when Scouting America becomes the new brand identity of all Scouting programs. The Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouts and Exploring programs all remain, but now under the umbrella brand of Scouting America. The legal/business identity of the organization remains Boy Scouts of America. It is believed that this branding update improves awareness of all that Scouting offers today for all youth. It is felt that eliminating the word "Boy" and restating the remaining "Scouts of America" simply as "Scouting America" will better and more precisely communicate the full scope of Scouting today.


This change has already begun and becomes official in February 2025. You will see the new logo soon if you haven't already.
