Pineville, Louisiana's First Baptist Church is the site for the upcoming Association of Baptists for Scouting planning retreat set for February 21-23, 2025. All ABS members are invited to attend and join in the time of fellowship as we plan upcoming activities to encourage and support Duty to God in Scouting.

ABS members remain active at Scouting High Adventure bases, particularly the Philmont Scout Ranch and the 2026 National Jamboree at the Summit Bechtel Reserve. Both sites will see tens of thousands of

Scouting youth and adults experiencing the unique opportunities that these sites provide.

ABS not only supplies manpower for the Duty to God program areas at Jambo and chaplaincy support at both high adventure bases, but also works to provide scholarships that allow more Baptist Scouts and Scouters to participate. This is only possible with significant planning and the financial support of many faithful Baptists among us. There is a saying that "we need prayers of intervention and

support, plus money to operate, but your time is perhaps equally valuable and just as necessary."

In Memoriam of President James Earl (Jimmy) Carter, Jr.

On December 29, 2024, the American people lost a great Humanitarian and Southern Gentlemen, James Earl (Jimmy) Carter, Jr., 39th President of the United States. What might not be known is that Jimmy Carter was very much involved in the Boy Scout of American.

Mr. Carter served variously as a Troop Committee Member, Committee Chair, Scoutmaster and Explorer Advisor. He joined Scouting in 1951 in The Chehaw Council, and was involved all during the years each of his three sons were involved in Scouting. In his youth he was a Scout achieving the rank of Star Scout.

During his years as Scoutmaster, the troop was very active with hikes and camping and particularly enjoyed camping at Providence Canyon. On one camping trip the troop created a horse or mule (much discussion on what it was) out of PVC pipes with the assistance of a plumber. His real claim to fame during his years as a Scoutmaster, according to son Chip, was storytelling around the campfire and his ghost stories were the BEST.

Mr. Carter was recognized for his Scouting service with the Silver Buffalo in 1975, and the Alumnus Award during the 100th Anniversary of Scouting. During his Presidency, he was the Honorary President of Boy Scout of American and in 1977 he wrote the attached letter (below).

Chapel Refurbishment Projects Now Part of the Philmont Annual Calendar

Thanks to the hard work of a number of volunteers over the past few years, the Chapel Refurbishment Week has become part of the annual calendar at Philmont Scout Ranch. The largest representation each year has come from the Association of Baptists for Scouting team led by Donna Copeland. In 2024, work was done at every backcountry and headquarters chapel with the exception of Black Mountain and Sawmill which were unreachable because of accumulated snow from the winter. In addition, a new chapel site was established adjacent to the Baldy Town Cemetery.

May 7-11 are the dates for the 2025 event and the assignment is even more aggressive than last year. Work is scheduled for every current chapel with two additional locations in the planning. Those interested in knowing more or ready to volunteer for 2025 are encouraged to contact Donna Copeland DonnalCopeland@protonmail.com who will again coordinate the ABS team. The size of the entire group is limited by accommodation and logistical considerations, so act now if you are interested.

Philmont Chaplaincy Plans Announced for 2025

The chaplaincy team for the 2024 summer camping season at Philmont Scout Ranch was one of the best in recent memory, according to R. Chip Turner, the Chaplain Coordinator. In addition to conducting daily worship services in the various chapels located in camping headquarters, the chaplains rotated responsibility for the eight ongoing assignments throughout the ranch. Final selection of the 2025 team is expected soon.


Two exciting new developments will be included in the 2025 season for chaplains:

- Dale Copeland will serve as Associate Chaplain Coordinator. Dale has held several Philmont staff positions in past years, including being a chaplain on the 2023 team. At the conclusion of the 2025 season, Dale will become the new Philmont Chaplain Coordinator. Chip Turner said of Dale: "I am so pleased that Dale is willing to accept this role for upcoming seasons. A prime concern of mine in choosing to "retire" as coordinator in August, 2025, was finding the right person to take Philmont chaplaincy to a new level. Dale's vast experience in Scouting at every level from local unit to national, linked with a vision for Philmont chaplaincy ideally qualifies him for this role. He will have no greater supporter than I."
- Thanks to the visionary leadership of the ABS board, the organization will fund a Baptist Chaplain Intern for the 2025 season. This will not only give a seminary student extremely valuable experience in further preparation for vocational ministry but will also help expand the possibilities for additional ministries during the summer camping season. More details on the role and the person to be selected will be available in coming weeks.



New Testaments

All High Adventure bases (Philmont, Summit, Sea Base and Northern Tier) are supplied New Testaments w/Psalms for all their program participants attending chapel services. These are made possible by generous donations from religious groups, local churches and individuals who desire that each Scout and Scouter have their own copy of a New Testament. This project continued in 2024 with several Baptists groups and churches participating through funding gifts. Thousands of these backpack sized books are handed out during chapel services each summer. We encourage more church's participation and financial support to spread the Gospel.
