non-profit organization, "Love the Harrisonville Square" that would enable seating at community events on the Square.


Ayden has been active in Scouting for 10 years, beginning as a Tiger Cub. As a scouter, he has been the patrol leader twice and a chaplain aide.

Rockefeller in Damascus, Arkansas in the Aquatics Department. She has attended Swamp Base in Atchafalaya Swamp, Louisiana, where she paddled 62 miles with Venturing Crew 1.

Ben's Scouting experiences include 2023 Philmont Summer Trek, Arrow of Light, 50-Miler award earned at Philmont, National Outdoor Award for Hiking (1 gold device), and Camping (2 gold devices), Recruiter badge, Paul Bunyan Award, Order of the Arrow Brotherhood, camping over 80 nights, hiking over 150 miles, service time of over 80 hours, and earning 47 merit badges.

He has held many jobs while in Scouting, including Librarian, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Chaplain Aide, Outdoor Ethics Guide, and Boxwell Summer Camp Staff. Ben is an Army National Scholarship winner. After graduating from college, he hopes to attend seminary to prepare to serve Jesus and his country as a military chaplain.

The handicapped person that inspired the project passed away before he was able to use the table, a plaque has been placed on one of the tables in his memory. The area has been a blessing for the church.

Stetson's favorite part of Scouting has been camping. One that stands out is in 2019 at the district's fall camporee, Appalachian Heritage Days, when the scouters camped in teepees and held various competitions including log cutting and first aid relays.

Stetson is currently in the eleventh grade and works part time with a general contractor. He wants to expand his knowledge in the field of construction after high school.
