


## Spinning Fans



84 pieces  
Each piece =>  
5.5" x 10.5"  
2 per block

15 spinners =>  
60 filler pieces  
15 strips @ 4  
pieces each OR  
10 FQ @ 6 pieces  
each

11 pairs = 22  
pieces

2 single corner pieces

- Iron blocks toward dark fabric OR left & Down
- Iron connecting blocks toward vertical piece (to nest rows together)

This Spinning Fans pattern is a good scrap-and-stash buster as it only requires small amounts of each fabric: from 5 ½" X 10 ½" to about a fat quarter.

Every piece of the pattern is a 5.5" X 10.5" rectangle and you need four rectangles of the same fabric to make each spinner – cut enough sets of four to make 15 spinners (60 rectangles), then cut 11 pairs (22 rectangles) and 2 single corner rectangles to make up the rest of the pieces (84 total rectangles).

Before sewing any pieces together lay out the entire quilt to tessellate the spinners together and fill in the edges with pairs and singles. The spinners show up best if you alternate darks and lights or otherwise contrasting fabrics next to each other.

The size ends up being perfect for the Snuggled in Hope quilts which need to be twin sized, or between 55" – 65" wide by 65" – 75" long.
