2025 Concert Season Announced! More blockbuster acts coming to Jefferson Park

The schedule for this summer includes Coldplay, Post Malone, Jelly Roll and Metallica. In past years, the stadium has hosted superstars like Taylor Swift, Rolling Stones, Ed Sheeran, The Weeknd, Zach Bryan, Kenny Chesney, U2, Garth Brooks, George Strait, Ed Sheeran, Morgan Wallen, Foo Fighters, Chris Stapleton, Widespread Panic, Nathaniel Rateliff and the Night Sweats, Guns and Roses, Red Hot Chili Peppers, Jason Aldean, Kacey Musgraves, Bruce Springsteen & E Street Band and the Eagles.

After several great summer line-ups, Empower Field at Mile High is back with another amazing slate for the summer of 2025. Jefferson Park loves live music! Neighbors especially appreciate the convenience of walking down to the stadium and back. In 2024, there were 7 nights of shows. So far this year, only 4 nights have been announced. Hopefully more will be added!

The stadium has hosted the biggest names in music since it opened on August 11, 2001 with the Eagles. But there have been many highlights over the years. U2 brought the largest stage ever constructed ("The Claw") for their record-breaking 360° Tour in 2011. Kenny Chesney holds the record for most times played with a whopping 6 appearances. But Ed Sheeran holds the record for the stadium's largest crowd of 85,233.

Garth Brooks has played 3 times. The Stones made appearances in 2019 and 2024. Taylor Swift became the first ever female artist to have a concert there in 2018. She returned for 2 sellouts in 2023 on her global Eras Tour.




Sidewalk Fees Coming in 2025

Starting in 2025, the City and County of Denver will begin charging property owners a fee to fund a citywide sidewalk repair and construction program. This citizen-initiated ordinance (*"Denver Deserves Sidewalks"*) was approved by voters in November 2022 with 56% support. The responsibility for sidewalk construction and maintenance was transferred to the city. All sidewalks must be fixed, brought to code, and new sidewalks added.

The annual fee is based on linear footage of property sidewalk. The vast majority of owners will pay a \$150 flat fee annually. The fee will be added to stormwater bills, with half of the fee charged the first half of the year and half of the fee charged the second half of the year.

Denver's Department of Transportation and Infrastructure (*DOTI*) is helping people prepare for the fee. You can visit <u>www.denvergov.org/sidewalks</u> for FAQ's and to access the new tools and resources. The City does not currently have a timeline for when specific segments of sidewalk will be repaired or installed as part of the new sidewalk program.





Rezoning in Jefferson Park

The Near Northwest Area Plan worked with community members to create a long-term vision to guide



growth and city decision-making for the Chaffee Park, Sunnyside, Highland and Jefferson Park neighborhoods. On January 22, 2024, Denver City Council voted unanimously to adopt the Near Northwest Area Plan. The plan is

currently in the implementation phase. The first step is a city-sponsored legislative rezoning. If approved, the new zoning would lead to development that is consistent with what the community's priorities, as reflected in the plan's vision and goals.

According to City Planning and Development staff, there are 151 properties in Jefferson Park that will be rezoned. Some notable locations on the application include:

The Urology Center of Colorado at 2777 Mile High Circle (which closed suddenly last summer)

Denver Police Protective Association Event Center at 2105 N. Decatur

Safeway at 2660 N. Federal Boulevard

Bites & Brews in the Neighborhood Featuring Kent Dawson from Briar Common




When did you open? October 2016 *Tell us a bit about your place!* The idea of Briar Common started more than 20 years ago when we began to enjoy a new style of
