CDOT agrees with neighborhood feedback



After strong pushback from residents, local businesses, neighborhood organizations and the City of Denver, CDOT has eliminated the most controversial of the 3 options to address the I-25 and 23rd Avenue bridge and interchange project. In an April 3 letter to the community CDOT staff said, "The Alternative 2, known as Close 23rd Avenue I-25 Ramps Alternative. will not be advanced for further analysis." CDOT spent the last year gathering input from stakeholders. They plan to have additional public meetings through Summer 2025 to discuss the remaining alternatives.

City to Address Parking Issues Near Stadium



Denver's Department of Transportation and Infrastructure is developing a new

Curbside Area Management Plan (CAMP) for Jefferson Park. This plan will focus on the streets and avenues impacted by stadium events. This is also known to some residents as the Residential Parking Permit program which provides "A" permits to some, but not all. residents.



CAMPs are developed to comprehensively address an area's changing parking challenges while acknowledging the needs of all user groups. In addition to the Stadium, the City is also working on plans for Highland, Cherry Creek North and the Botanic Gardens. The process engages a Stakeholder

Working Group (SWG) to identify parking challenges and solutions. The SWG for the Stadium plan consists of 15 individuals. The group had its second of three meetings on April 10. The public will be engaged more broadly once a draft plan is available.



When did you open? Father's Day 2009


