good drama on television and in the movies but imagine facing the reality of it!

Sunny minimizes gifting a kidney to her brother, Steven when his young life depended upon it. He was only 20 and Sunny four years older.

Steven went on to marry, fathering two children of his own, and raising two more. He lived another twenty years.

Sunny minimizes her gift to her brother but most of us would find it quite remarkable! This altruistic woman was born in California, the eldest of six children, four brothers and one sister, birthed over an eight year period, in either of two states. The family would move back and forth between her Dad's home state of Missouri and California, the state where they met.

Sunny lived all over Missouri until the age of 14 when her family moved to the Rogue Valley. She recalls how fortunate she was to be able to ride horses from one end of the valley to the other. She graduated in 1972 from the only high school in Medford at that time. (There are now 3).

She married quite young, right out of High School. It didn't last. Although her second marriage also ended in divorce after seven years, that husband, Doug, was the love of her life and she returned to him after her third marriage ended. She and Doug had only a year and a half additional time together before he died unexpectedly of heart failure.

Sunny was a maverick and a bit of an anomaly being the only woman working an open chain at the mills in the day. The suits would show up to take a look. She worked in almost all the mills in the Rogue Valley. Fun in those days was square dancing and being a member of a Van Club. She drove a full size van for several years

Sunny lived in the Rogue Valley for 44 years. It was her home base although she traveled, living in at least 50 different houses and countless cities in the Northwest.

She worked a tough job at a nursery where she developed into a floral designer which led to her managing the floral shop. Although she did not get the contract, she is proud of the fact that her bid for landscape design for the Rogue Valley Country Club actually came in second.
