Throughout his assignments to South East Asia and those stateside he and Sandra, mostly Sandra, raised a son, Bill and daughter, Becky.

After about fifteen years he left that realm and pursued a third career in his collegiate field of study, as a Deputy Agricultural Commissioner for Stanislaus County and later Monterey County from which he retired to Brookings in 2003.
