Eyebrow Aftercare Instructions

For the best results, it's essential to follow these aftercare instructions. Proper care post-treatment plays a crucial role in the final outcome of your eyebrows. Adhering to these guidelines ensures a more satisfying and lasting result and will greatly enhance the effectiveness of the treatment.:

****First 24 Hours:****

- For the initial 30 minutes, gently dab the brows every 5 minutes with a new Kleenex.
- Apply a thin layer of ointment with a new Q-tip. Use both with and against the hair direction to ensure thorough coverage at the base.
- Gently remove excess ointment, leaving only a light sheen.
- Reapply ointment if brows start feeling dry until bedtime. Avoid letting the area dry out to prevent scabbing and fading.
- If makeup was done later in the afternoon, reapply ointment once more after bedtime.
- Apply ointment up to 6 times maximum throughout the day.

****First 72 Hours:****

- Apply ointment midday, up to 6 times max per day.
- Wash and apply ointment both in the morning and at night.
- Be diligent about keeping the brows moist; avoid sweating.
- After this period, expect the brows to soften, pigment to fade, and the area to shrink slightly.

****For 7-10 Days:****

- Avoid swimming pools, hot tubs, saunas, and prolonged sun exposure. Wear a hat outdoors.
- Stay away from activities requiring face coverings like helmets or goggles that could rub the area.
- Showering is fine, but avoid keeping the brows wet for extended periods.
- Continue the wash and ointment process every morning and night.
- The brows will go through stages - starting out dark and bold, then lightening, and gradually normalizing. This is a normal part of the healing process.
- After 7 days, makeup can be worn if desired.

***Additional Care Products:**

If in need of extra ointment, Aquaphor or coconut oil are suitable alternatives.

For cleansers, opt for fragrance-free, gentle options such as baby shampoo, Cetaphil, or even bar soap.

Avoid cleansers formulated for anti-aging or acne-prone skin, as they may be too harsh for the treated area.
